SAN FRANCISCO EXCAVATION CODE


Establishes a 5-year moratorium on excavating streets that have been reconstructed, repaved and/or resurfaced in the preceding five years to protect the public infrastructure and maintain the integrity of the pavement and right of way.



of newly resurfaced streets are protected for five years due to paving moratorium




FY16-17 Moratorium Breakdown
