SUBJECT: LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

The Board of Supervisors' Land Use and Transportation Committee has received the following proposed legislation, introduced by Supervisor Peskin on July 25, 2017:

Ordinance amending the Police Code to clarify factors that Public Works and the Department of Building Inspection must consider in evaluating special permits to exceed ambient noise levels during night time construction, and to prohibit Public Works from issuing such permits for projects in certain residential areas (outside the area bounded by Pine, Taylor, Market, 8th, Folsom, Fremont, and Front Streets) covered by the Municipal Transportation Agency's Holiday Moratorium on issuance of daytime special traffic permits; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

ORDINANCE NO.

[Police Code - Noise Permits for Construction at Night]

Ordinance amending the Police Code to clarify factors that Public Works and the Department of Building Inspection must consider in evaluating special permits to exceed ambient noise levels during night time construction, and to prohibit Public Works from issuing such permits for projects in certain residential areas (outside the area bounded by Pine, Taylor, Market, 8th, Folsom, Fremont, and Front Streets) covered by the Municipal Transportation Agency's Holiday Moratorium on issuance of daytime special traffic permits; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this determination.

Section 2. The Police Code is hereby amended by revising Section 2908, to read as follows:

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SEC. 2908. CONSTRUCTION WORK AT NIGHT.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, between the hours of 8:00 p.m. of any day and 7:00 a.m. of the following day to erect, construct, demolish, excavate for, alter, or repair any building or structure if the noise level created thereby is in excess of the ambient noise level by 5 dBA at the nearest property plane, unless a special permit therefor has been applied for and granted by the Director of Public Works or the Director of Building Inspection.

(b) In granting such special permit, the Director of Public Works or the Director of Building Inspection shall consider:

(1) if construction noise in the vicinity of the proposed work site would be less objectionable at night than during daytime because of different population levels or different neighboring activities:

(2) if obstruction and interference with traffic, particularly on streets of major importance, would be less objectionable at night than during daytime;

(3) if the kind of work to be performed emits noises at such a low level as to not cause significant disturbance in the vicinity of the work site:-

(4) _____if the neighborhood of the proposed work site is primarily residential in character wherein sleep could be disturbed, *the Director of Public Works or Director of Building* Inspection shall deny the permit unless the Director determines in written findings that at least one of the following factors applies:

(<u>A)</u> *if* great economic hardship would occur if the work were spread over a longer time<u>rs;</u>

(B) if the work will abate or prevent hazard to life or property; or, and
(C) if the proposed night work is in the general public interest.

(c) Notwithstanding subsection (b), the Director of Public Works shall not issue a special permit where:

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(1) the Municipal Transportation Agency has denied the applicant a special traffic permit to perform work between the hours of 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. because of that agency's Holiday Moratorium:

(2) the work is outside the area bounded by Pine Street, Taylor Street, Market Street, 8th Street, Folsom Street, Fremont Street, and Front Street; and,

(3) the work would be located on a block with any residential uses.

<u>(d)</u> The Director of Public Works or the Director of Building Inspection shall prescribe such conditions, working times, types of construction equipment to be used, and permissible noise emissions, as required in the public interest.

(e) The provisions of this Section 2908 shall not be applicable to emergency work.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Police Code - Noise Permits for Construction at Night]

Ordinance amending the Police Code to clarify factors that Public Works and the Department of Building Inspection must consider in evaluating special permits to exceed ambient noise levels during night time construction, and to prohibit Public Works from issuing such permits for projects in certain residential areas (outside the area bounded by Pine, Taylor, Market, 8th, Folsom, Fremont, and Front Streets) covered by the Municipal Transportation Agency's Holiday Moratorium on issuance of daytime special traffic permits; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

Section 2908 of the Police Code prohibits construction that would result exceedances of ambient noise levels during the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. the following day without a special permit from the Director of the Department of Public Works (for work in the public right of way) or the Director of the Department of Building Inspection (for work in buildings). The section provides a list of items the applicable Director should consider when granting or denying a permit, but does not organize the items or provide any guidance on how the Directors are to weigh the items.

The Municipal Transportation Agency ("MTA") has a Holiday Moratorium from Thanksgiving to January 1 that prohibits construction, excavation, or demolition in the public right of way between 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. within the area bounded by Pine, Taylor, Market, 8th, Folsom, Fremont, and Front Streets, and on any block where 50% or more of the frontage is devoted to businesses ("Business Block"). Projects that seek to construct, demolish, or excavate within these areas during the moratorium may seek night noise permits per section 2908.

Amendments to Current Law

The Proposed Legislation organizes the existing items in section 2908 into factors the Directors must apply when considering night noise permits. The Proposed Legislation also requires that the Directors make certain written findings before granting a night noise permit in residential areas.

The Proposed Legislation also prohibits the Director of Public Works from granting a night noise permit to any project located on Business Block and subject to MTA's Holiday Moratorium if the Business Block also contains any residential uses.

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
