Dear Supervisor Safai:

As a current member of the Bay Area Regional Interoperable Communications System Joint Powers Authority (BayRICS), I recommend the appointment of San Francisco Police Department's (SFPD) Chief William Scott to BayRICS, and Lieutenant Michael Deely as his alternate. This appointment would replace an existing appointment from SFPD, who was reassigned and no longer can serve on BayRICS.
