

1 [Housing Code - All-Gender Bathrooms in Hotels]

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3 **Ordinance amending the Housing Code to require that single-stall bathroom facilities in**  
4 **hotels be made available for the use of all residents, regardless of gender or gender**  
5 **identity, and to require that signage be posted to indicate the same; and directing the**  
6 **Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to forward this Ordinance to the California Building**  
7 **Standards Commission upon final passage.**

13 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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15 Section 1. Pursuant to Charter Section D3.750-5, the Building Inspection Commission  
16 considered this ordinance at a duly noticed public hearing held on January 17, 2018.

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18 Section 2. California Health and Safety Code section 17958.7.

19 No finding is required under California Health and Safety Code Section 17958.7  
20 because the ordinance does not amend a “building standard” as defined in Section 18909 of  
21 that Code.

23 Section 3. The Housing Code is hereby amended by revising Section 505, to read as  
24 follows:

25 \* \* \* \*

1 (b) **Hotels.** Hotel guestrooms shall be provided with a water-closet, a lavatory, and  
2 a bathtub or shower, within the guest room or said facilities may be situated off the exit  
3 corridor on the same floor pursuant to the table indicated below.

4 Single-user water-closets, lavatories, bathtubs, and showers that are situated off the exit  
5 corridors shall be made available for the use of all residents, regardless of gender or gender identity,  
6 and shall be identified as all-gender facilities by signage that complies with Title 24 of the California  
7 Code of Regulations.

8 The following table will be used in determining the minimum number of public  
9 sanitary facilities required per floor when guest rooms do not contain the requisite sanitary  
10 facilities:

11 Total Number of Public Sanitary Facilities Required for Guest Rooms (per Floor)

12 *Existing Number of Guest Rooms per Floor	Public Sanitary Facilities Required
13 2 - 20	2
14 21 - 30	3
15 31 - 40	4
16 41 - 50	5
17 51 - 60	6
18 61 - 70	7

22 \*NOTE: Existing guest rooms with private sanitation facilities are not part of the  
23 guest room floor total for purposes of this requirement.

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1           Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after  
2 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the  
3 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board  
4 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor’s veto of the ordinance.

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6           Section 5. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors  
7 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,  
8 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal  
9 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment  
10 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the “Note” that appears under  
11 the official title of the ordinance.

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13           Section 6. Directions to Clerk. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed  
14 to forward a copy of this ordinance to the California Building Standards Commission upon final  
15 passage.
