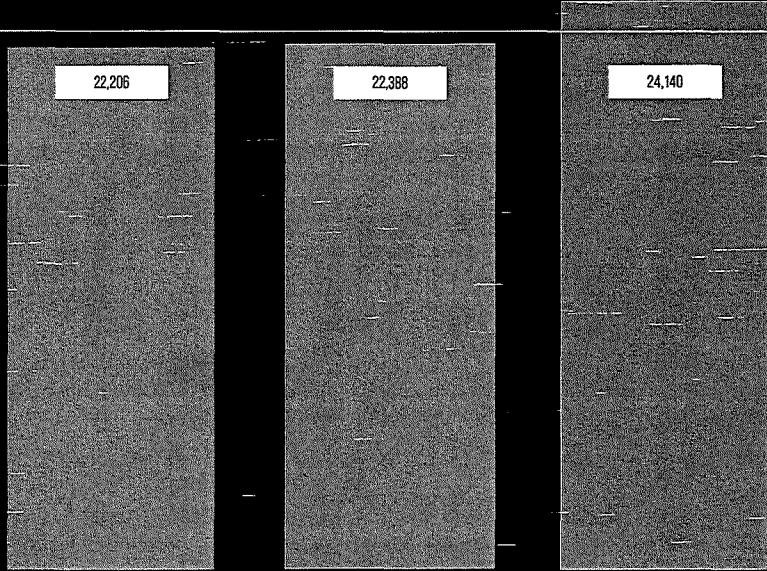

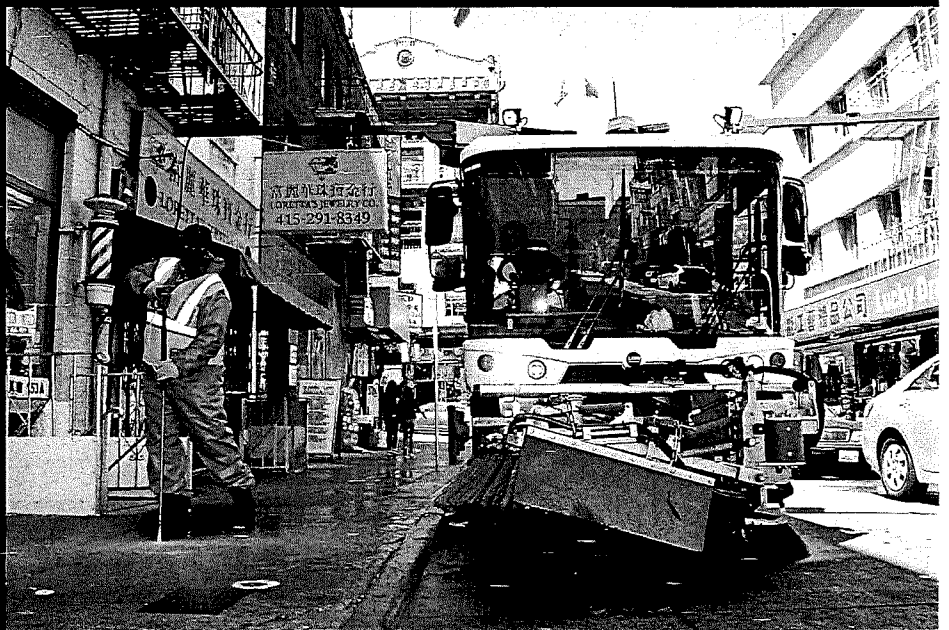

STREETS & SIDEWALKS MAINTENANCE STANDARDS

The City Services Auditor Charter Amendment requires that the Controller's Office and San Francisco Public Works develop and implement standards for street and sidewalk maintenance.

- **Measure:** Cleanliness and appearance of public streets, sidewalks, trash receptacles, and trees and landscaping
- **Evaluate:** 183 commercial and residential routes twice a year
- **Evaluate:** 24 commercial routes monthly starting this year

FY 2015-16 RESULTS

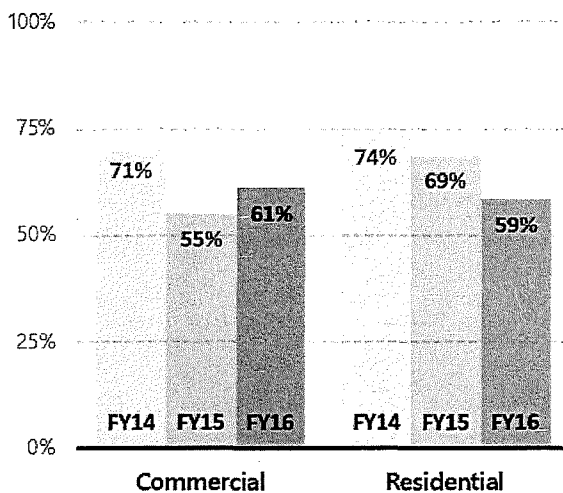
The City's streets were cleaner in Fiscal Year 2015-16, but challenges remain despite additional services. The evaluation found:

- Less litter and grime
- More illegal dumping, needles, feces and condoms
- More graffiti
- Tree wells and landscaping conditions improved or remained the same

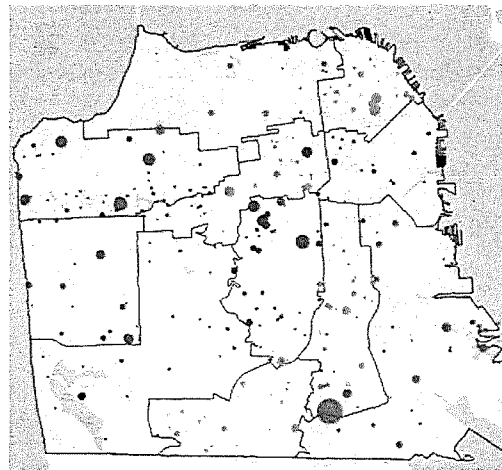
Routes free of Illegal Dumping

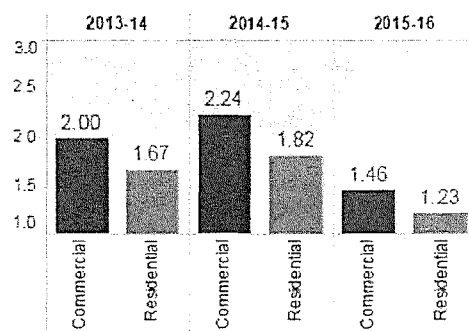

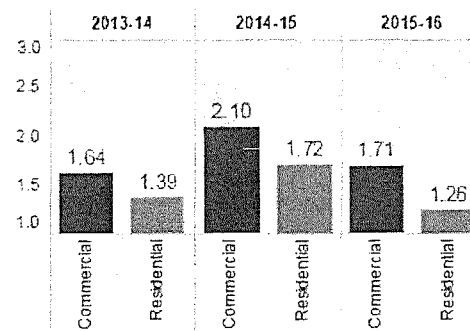

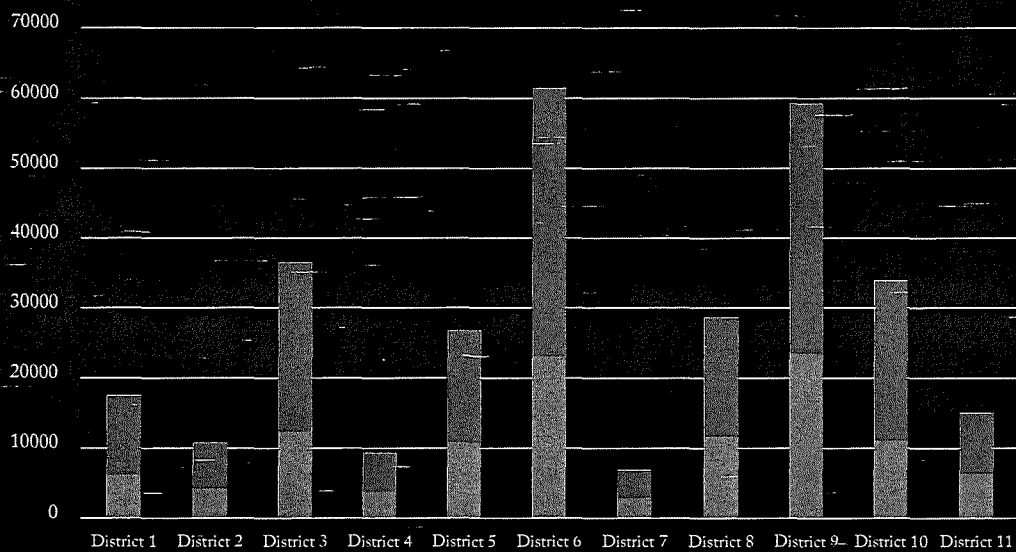
Sidewalk Litter Score
