3 **Ordinance adopting and implementing Amendment No. 1 to the 2014-2019**
4 **Memorandum of Understanding between the City and County of San Francisco and the**
5 **United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing and Pipe Fitting**
6 **Industry, Local No. 38, to implement a “Union Access to New Employees” program.**

14 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

15 Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby adopts and implements Amendment No. 1
16 to the 2014-2019 Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) between the City and County of
17 San Francisco and the United Association of Journeymen and Apprentices of the Plumbing
18 and Pipe Fitting Industry, Local No. 38, to implement a “Union Access to New Employees”
19 program.

20 Amendment No. 1 to the MOU so implemented is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
21 Supervisors in Board File No. 180048.

22 Section 2. The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Department of Human
23 Resources to make non-substantive ministerial or administrative corrections to the MOU.

24 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon enactment.
25 Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance

1 unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of
2 Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
