8 WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), under the U.S.
9 Department of Homeland Security (DHS), appropriates annual funding for the Port Security
10 Grant Program (PSGP); and

11 WHEREAS, The purpose of the Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) is to promote
12 sustainable, risk-based efforts to protect critical port infrastructure from terrorism; and

13 WHEREAS, The Police Department (SFPD) applied for PSGP funding and was
14 awarded \$165,000 from the FY2017 PSGP appropriation for the Safe Boat Refurbishment
15 and Service Life Extension Program (SF/SLEP); and

16 WHEREAS, The award period is September 1, 2017, through August 31, 2020; and

17 WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provision for indirect costs; and

18 WHEREAS, This grant does not create any new positions, and will not require an
19 amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance; and

20 WHEREAS, This grant requires the City to provide matching funds worth 25% of the
21 total project budget, or \$55,000; and

22 WHEREAS, SFPD will provide matching funds worth 25% of the total project budget, or
23 \$55,000; now, therefore, be it

1 RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) is authorized to
2 retroactively accept and expend a grant from the Department of Homeland Security Federal
3 Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) in the amount of \$165,000; and, be it

4 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of
5 indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief of Police, or his designee, is authorized to
7 enter into the agreement on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco.


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





Article I - Summary Description of Project

Project 1: Safeboat Refurbishment Project is fully funded for \$165,000.

Article II - Disposition of Equipment Acquired Under the Federal Award

When original or replacement equipment acquired under this award by the recipient or its sub-recipients is no longer needed for the original project or program or for other activities currently or previously supported by DHS/FEMA, you must request instructions from DHS/FEMA to make proper disposition of the equipment pursuant to 2 C.F.R. Section 200.313.

Article III - Prior Approval for Modification of Approved Budget

Before making any change to the DHS/FEMA approved budget for this award, you must request prior written approval from DHS/FEMA where required by 2 C.F.R. Section 200.308. 6. In the event courts or administrative agencies make a finding of discrimination on grounds of race, color, national origin (including LEP), sex, age, disability, religion, or familial status against the recipient, or recipients settle a case or matter alleging such discrimination, recipients must forward a copy of the complaint and findings to the DHS FAO and the CRCL office by e-mail or mail at the addresses listed above.

The United States has the right to seek judicial enforcement of these obligations.

Article XXV - Assurances, Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements
