[Accept and Expend Grant - Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency - Port Security Grant Program - \$165,000]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Police Department to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$165,000 from the Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency for the Safe Boat Refurbishment and Service Life Extension Program, for the period of September 1, 2017, through August 31, 2020.

WHEREAS, The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), under the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS), appropriates annual funding for the Port Security Grant Program (PSGP); and

WHEREAS, The purpose of the Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) is to promote sustainable, risk-based efforts to protect critical port infrastructure from terrorism; and

WHEREAS, The Police Department (SFPD) applied for PSGP funding and was awarded \$165,000 from the FY2017 PSGP appropriation for the Safe Boat Refurbishment and Service Life Extension Program (SF/SLEP); and

WHEREAS, The award period is September 1, 2017, through August 31, 2020; and WHEREAS, The grant does not include any provision for indirect costs; and WHEREAS, This grant does not create any new positions, and will not require an amendment to the Annual Salary Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, This grant requires the City to provide matching funds worth 25% of the total project budget, or \$55,000; and

WHEREAS, SFPD will provide matching funds worth 25% of the total project budget, or \$55,000; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) is authorized to retroactively accept and expend a grant from the Department of Homeland Security Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) in the amount of \$165,000; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief of Police, or his designee, is authorized to enter into the agreement on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco.

Project 1: Safeboat Refurbishment Project is fully funded for \$165,000.

Part 200, Subpart E</u> may not be charged to other federal financial assistance awards to overcome fund deficiencies, to avoid restrictions imposed by federal statutes, regulations, or federal financial assistance award terms and conditions, or for other reasons. However, these prohibitions would not preclude recipients from shifting costs that are allowable under two or more awards in accordance with existing federal statutes, regulations, or the federal financial assistance award terms and conditions.

Article XLI - Drug-Free Workplace Regulations
