The funds may be used for capital projects and other one-time expenditures related to narcotics enforcement. The Board of Supervisors previously appropriated \$766,837 in Asset Forfeiture funds from 2009 through 2013 that were never spent. The proposed ordinance would re-appropriate \$766,837 and appropriate \$333,163 in Asset Forfeiture funds, totaling \$1,100,000 to partially fund the new Police Training Support Facility.								
 The new Police Training Support Facility will replace the existing Shooting Range, which is in dilapidated condition. The Airport's Five-Year and Ten-Year Capital Improvement Plans include approximately \$7,200,000 in funding for the new Police Training Support Facility. The Police Department's Airport Bureau has requested the Airport to provide \$1,600,000 in additional improvements to the facility, of which \$1,100,000 would be Asset Forfeiture funds and the balance of \$500,000 would be previously appropriated Airport Revenue Bonds. These additional improvements include high ground training facilities, a simulator room, an observation tower, a 25-yard shooting range extension, and an improved range lighting system. The Airport Commission and U.S. Department of Justice Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section (DOJ-AFMLS) have already approved of the use of funds.

MANDATE STATEMENT

City Administrative Code Section 10.100-310 requires approval of the Board of Supervisors for Asset Forfeiture Fund expenditures in excess of \$10,000.

BACKGROUND

When the San Francisco Police Department-Airport Bureau (SFPD-AB) assists in the seizure of assets related to narcotics trafficking enforcement, it receives Asset Forfeiture Funds from the United States Department of Justice (DOJ) and deposits these funds into the San Francisco Narcotics Forfeiture and Asset Seizure Fund for the account of the Airport. These funds may be used for capital projects and one-time expenses to enhance SFPD-AB's narcotics enforcement, but may not be spent on ongoing operations.

DETAILS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

The proposed ordinance appropriates \$1,100,000 in Asset Forfeiture Funds, including \$333,163 in fund balance and \$766,837 in prior appropriations, to partially fund construction of a new Police Training Support Facility at the Airport. According to Mr. Ian Hart, Airport Capital Planning Manager, the Asset Forfeiture Funds are used infrequently and include a balance of \$766,837 that was appropriated from 2009 through 2013 but never spent.

The SFPD-AB Police Training Support Facility will be a single story, 7,500 square foot building, including classroom spaces, offices, firearm cleaning, armory, vault, break room, and work spaces. It will replace three portable trailers in poor condition, which do not have permanent restrooms, are not accessible, and have rot issues. The Airport's FY 2017-18 Five-Year and Ten-Year Capital Plans include \$7,200,000 for a new SFPD-AB Police Training Support Facility.

SFPD-AB has requested approximately \$1,600,000 in additional improvements beyond the original scope and budget of \$7,200,000, of which \$1,100,000 would be paid with Asset Forfeiture Funds, and \$500,000 would be paid with Airport Capital Funds previously appropriated by the Board of Supervisors¹. The Airport Commission and United States Department of Justice Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section (DOJ-AFMLS) have both approved of this proposed use of Asset Forfeiture Funds. The additional \$1,600,000 (including the \$1,100,000 appropriated in the proposed ordinance) would fund high ground training facilities, a simulator room, an observation tower for range command and control, a 25-yard shooting range extension, and an improved range lighting system for night training. With the additional improvements, the total project budget would be approximately \$8,800,000.

FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed ordinance would (1) de-appropriate \$766,837 from the Asset Forfeiture Fund's Programmatic Projects Budget and re-appropriate the funds to the Buildings, Structures, and

Improvements Projects Budget, and (2) appropriate \$333,163 from the Asset Forfeiture Fund's balance to the Buildings, Structures, and Improvements Projects Budget. The total appropriation of \$1,100,000 is shown in Table 1 below.

The total project budget is approximately \$8,800,000. This includes approximately \$7,200,000 budgeted in the Airport's Five-Year and Ten-Year Capital Improvement Plans, \$1,100,000 from the Asset Forfeiture Fund that would be appropriated under this proposed ordinance, and approximately \$500,000 in further improvements to be paid by the Airport's Capital Fund. The project budget is shown in Table 2 below.

WHEREAS, the Airport's FY 2017/18 Five-Year and Ten-Year Capital Plans include \$7,200,000 of funding for a Police Training Support Facility Project (Project), which will provide a replacement facility for the Shooting Range at the Airport; and

- WHEREAS, the San Francisco Planning Department, Environmental Review Division, has determined that the Police Training Range Improvements Project is categorically exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act as a Class 1 and Class 2 exemption; and
- WHEREAS, the San Francisco Police Department-Airport Bureau (SFPD-AB) has requested additional specialized equipment and facilities for the Project, to provide advanced training of law enforcement officers that is beyond the current Project scope and budget; and
- WHEREAS, when SFPD narcotics officers, along with various federal law enforcement agencies, seize assets related to narcotics trafficking at the Airport, SFPD-AB may apply for and receive funding (Asset Forfeiture Funds) representing its equitable share of forfeited assets based upon SFPD's level of participation in the seizure; and
- WHEREAS, there is at least \$1,100,000 in Asset Forfeiture Funds available to be spent on the additional Project enhancements; and
- WHEREAS, the Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section of the United States Department of Justice (DOJ-AFMLS) has issued a "Guide to Equitable Sharing for State and Local Law Enforcement Agencies" (Guide) that outlines the directives that state and local law enforcement agencies must follow to obtain and use equitably shared Asset Forfeiture Funds; and
- WHEREAS, the Guide requires local agencies to seek DOJ-AFMLS approval to use Asset Forfeiture Funds on capital projects; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 10.100-310, approval of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors is required for Asset Forfeiture Fund expenditures in excess of \$10,000; now, therefore, be it



DIRECTOR'S RECOMMENDATION: DETERMINE TO PROCEED WITH POLICE TRAINING RANGE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND AUTHORIZE USE OF ASSET FORFEITURE FUNDS TO INCREASE THE BUDGET FOR THE POLICE TRAINING SUPPORT FACILITY PROJECT CONTINGENT UPON ADDITIONAL REQUIRED APPROVALS.

Executive Summary

Transmitted herewith for your approval is a proposed Resolution determining to proceed with Police Training Range Improvements Project and authorizing the use of up to \$1,100,000 of Asset Forfeiture Funds to increase the budget for the Police Training Support Facility Project, contingent upon additional required approvals from the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and from the Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section of the United States Department of Justice (DOJ-AFMLS).

The Police Training Support Facility Project (Project) will replace the existing Shooting Range at the Airport. The new Police Training Support Facility will be a 7,500 square foot, single story building that includes spaces for classroom training, offices for the range master and two sergeants, firearm cleaning, armory, vault, break room, and work stations for supplemental range staff.

Background

The current facilities in use for the Police Training Range consist of three portable trailers that suffer from water intrusion and rot issues, are not accessible, do not have permanent, indoor restroom facilities, and after more than 10 years in service, they are in dilapidated condition.

This Project will replace the existing Shooting Range facility at the Airport. The current Project budget, as stated in the FY 2017/18 Five-Year and Ten-Year Capital Plans is \$7,200,000.

SFPD-AB has requested additional specialized equipment and facilities to provide advanced training of law enforcement officers that is beyond the original scope and Project budget of \$7,200,000. In order to provide these improvements, the Airport and SFPD-AB have identified a source of funding, Asset Forfeiture Funds, to cover the additional cost of long-range tactical training; interactive, less lethal and de-escalation firearms training; and enhanced safety elements proposed for the facility. SFPD-AB and the Airport intend to request permission to use up to \$1,100,000 of Asset Forfeiture Funds for this purpose.

When SFPD narcotics officers, along with various federal law enforcement agencies, seize assets related to narcotics trafficking at the San Francisco International Airport, SFPD-AB is entitled to apply for and receive funding representing its equitable share of forfeited assets based upon SFPD's level of participation in the seizure. DOJ-AFMLS has issued a "Guide to Equitable Sharing for State and Local Law Enforcement Agencies" (Guide) that outlines the directives that state and local law enforcement agencies must follow to obtain and use equitably shared Asset Forfeiture Funds. The Guide requires that local agencies, here the SFPD-AB and the Airport, to obtain the written approval of DOJ-AFMLS to use the Asset Forfeiture Funds for capital projects.

Staff will seek approval from the San Francisco Board of Supervisors as required under the San Francisco Administrative Code Section 10.101-310 and from the DOJ-AFMLS as required by the Guide. Staff will then return to the Commission for approval of the Project's scope, schedule and budget and authorization to issue the bid call.

Environmental Review

The San Francisco Planning Department, Environmental Review Division, has determined that the Police Training Range Improvements Project is categorically exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act as a Class 1 and Class 2 exemption (Planning Department File No. 2016.011526ENV).


Recommendation

Based on the above, I recommend that the Commission determine to proceed with the Police Training Range Improvements Project and authorize the use of Asset Forfeiture Funds to increase the budget for the Police Training Support Facility Project, contingent upon receipt of further required approvals from the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and the Department of Justice. I further recommend that the Commission authorize and direct the Commission Secretary and the Director to seek approval from the Board and Department of Justice for this use of Asset Forfeiture Funds for the Project.

SUBJECT:	Supplemental Appropriation for Asset Forfeiture Fund and Police Training Support Facility Project				

On September 5, 2017, the Airport Commission approved a resolution allowing the use of \$1.1 million in Asset Forfeiture funds to support the Police Training Support Facility capital project. Use of Asset Forfeiture funds requires approval of the Board of Supervisors (Board) and the Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section of the US Department of Justice (DOJ).

Attached is the Supplemental Appropriation Form 10 allocating \$1.1 million in Asset Forfeiture Funds to the Police Training Support Facility project, which requires Director's approval before it is submitted to the Controller, Mayor, and Board of Supervisors for final approval. The Airport is currently planning to introduce the item to the Board in October.

Background

The Police Training Support Facility project is part of the Ascent Program in the approved Capital Improvement Plan. The project's current budget is \$7.2 million, which includes developing a new public safety training and range facility on the eastern side of the airfield. The new facility will include indoor training classrooms, gun cleaning/storage, K-9 facilities, explosive disposal units, and modern restroom facilities with indoor plumbing. If the Board and DOJ approve the use of Asset Forfeiture funds, the project budget would increase to \$8.3 million.

The Airport has been working closely with the San Francisco Police Department (SFPD) on design of the Police Training Support Facility. During this process, SFPD proposed additional scope, including specialized equipment and facilities. The SFPD is proposing to pay for the additional scope items with the Asset Forfeiture Funds.

The City's Asset Forfeiture Fund (SF Administrative Code Section 10.100-310) receives money or tangible property resulting from the seizure or forfeiture of property. The fund may only be used for law enforcement purposes, consistent with federal and state guidelines and restrictions governing their use.
