

1 [Committee of the Whole - Joint Meeting with the San Francisco Ethics Commission -
2 Proposed Ordinance (File No. 180001) – Anti-Corruption and Accountability Ordinance -

4 **Motion scheduling the Board of Supervisors to sit as a Committee of the Whole on**
5 **April 3, 2018, at 5:00 p.m., in a joint meeting with the San Francisco Ethics**
6 **Commission, to hold a public hearing to consider the proposed Ordinance (File No.**
7 **180001) – the Anti-Corruption and Accountability Ordinance – amending the Campaign**
8 **and Governmental Conduct Code to institute various campaign finance and conflict of**
9 **interest reforms.**

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11 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors shall convene to sit as a Committee of the
12 Whole on April 3, 2018, at 5:00 p.m., in a joint meeting with the San Francisco Ethics
13 Commission, to hold a public hearing to consider the proposed Ordinance (File No. 180001) –
14 the Anti-Corruption and Accountability Ordinance – amending the Campaign and
15 Governmental Conduct Code to 1) prohibit earmarking of contributions and false identification
16 of contributors; 2) modify contributor card requirements; 3) require disclosure of contributions
17 solicited by City elective officers for ballot measure and independent expenditure committees;
18 4) require additional disclosures for campaign contributions from business entities to political
19 committees; 5) require disclosure of bundled campaign contributions; 6) extend the prohibition
20 on campaign contributions to candidates for City elective offices and City elective officers who
21 must approve certain City contracts; 7) require committees to file a third pre-election
22 statement prior to an election; 8) remove the prohibition against distribution of campaign
23 advertisements containing false endorsements; 9) allow members of the public to receive a
24 portion of penalties collected in certain enforcement actions; 10) permit the Ethics
25 Commission to recommend contract debarment as a penalty for campaign finance violations;

1 11) create new conflict of interest and political activity rules for elected officials and members
2 of boards and commissions; 12) specify recusal procedures for members of boards and
3 commissions; 13) establish local behested payment reporting requirements for donors and
4 City officers; 14) require disclosure by major donors of their financial interests; and 15) modify
5 disclaimer requirements in audio and video campaign advertisements.

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
