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Concerning Adoption of the Central South of Market Area Plan]

[Urging the Planning Commission to Recommend Amendments to the General Plan

Resolution urging the Planning Commission to recommend amendments to the General Plan to add the Central South of Market Area Plan.

WHEREAS, In April 2001, the Planning Department began its public presentations for what is now the Central South of Market (SoMa) Area Plan at a meeting of the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Department participated in more than 14 public hearings before the Planning and Historic Preservation Commissions to discuss the Plan, two hearings at the Board of Supervisor's Land Use Committee, additional hearings at the Arts Commission, Youth Commission; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Department has conferred with more than 30 community groups and home owners' associations to gather input about the Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Department has convened a technical advisory committee, participated in an online discussion forum, participated in thousands of individual meetings, phone calls and emails with stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Department hosted no less than 10 public outreach hearings to engage the citizens of San Francisco to discuss the Plan; and

WHEREAS. The Planning Department took the community on several walking tours of the Plan Area, established a storefront charette, and conducted two community surveys to provide information and gather input on the Plan; and

WHEREAS, The community has been engaged in the development and refinement of the Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Plan was drafted and refined with the intent to enable growth while maintaining neighborhood character, both architectural and cultural; and

WHEREAS, The Plan was drafted and refined to promote best practices for environmentalism; and

WHEREAS, The Plan ensures public amenities and community improvements for residents and visitors to Central SoMa; and

WHEREAS, The Plan prioritizes walking, bicycling and use of public transit; and WHEREAS, the plan provides for more housing, and can be the first Plan in San Francisco history to achieve 33% of the units produced as affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, On February 27, 2018, legislation was introduced to amend the Planning Code and Zoning Maps in order to adopt the Central SoMa Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) for the Central SoMa Plan was published on December 14, 2016; the Planning Commission held a public hearing on the DEIR on January 26, 2017; and public comments on the DEIR were accepted from December 14, 2016, through February 13, 2017; and

WHEREAS, A number of conforming amendments to elements of the General Plan are required in order to include the Central SoMa Plan in the General Plan and to resolve inconsistencies between the General Plan and the Central SoMa Plan; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board urges the Planning Commission to recommend to the Board those proposed amendments to the General Plan that are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _____ and that will make the General Plan consistent with the Central SoMa Plan; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the Planning Commission to recommend to the Board those proposed amendments to the Planning Code and Zoning
