#### **Including Civic Activities:**

The Outer Mission Merchants and Residents was formed in early 1998. A group of neighbors in the Crocker Amazon, Excelsior, and Outer Mission District were concerned about a low income housing project slated or rumored to be under construction at 5199 Mission Street. After several meetings at the Italian-American Social Club, a group of us got together to talk and brainstorm this issue. Keep in mind that the Geneva Towers, a multiple story low income housing complex, riddled with crime, drug dealing, the hatred of police at the facility, was doomed to be torn down in 1999. Concerned neighbors thought that the Mission Street site would replace the Geneva Towers.

I was a co-founder and became President of the Outer Mission Residents Association. At one point, OMRA now the Outer Mission Merchants and Residents Association (OMMRA), boasted a membership of over 1,000 members dealing with blight, trash, neglect of our parks, including Crocker Amazon Park and smaller parks, such as Alice Chalmers Playground, in the district lack of City Hall services, lack of attention of the San Francisco Unified School District, BART, MUNI, and other City and County Agencies.

In the fourteen years+ of its existence, OMMRA has made a mark in City Government and City Agencies. Steven Currier, as its President, represented OMMRA at many, many meetings, hearings, Board of Supervisors meetings along with various committee meetings. Steven represented OMMRA on the District 11 Underground Utilities Task Force, San Francisco Police Department's Budget Process on three occasions, served as an Ambassador and liaison to the SFPD and the Citizens of San Francisco at officer's funerals, dedications, and memorial services such as the Annual Memorial Day Celebrations at the Presidio.

OMMRA and Steven Currier was the founder and first Chair of the Crocker Amazon Park Advisory Group (CAPAG) now the Crocker Amazon Park Advisory Committee. Our first task, at the direction of then Mayor Willie L. Brown and interim Rec and Park General Manager Elizabeth Goldstein, was to do an assessment of Crocker Amazon Park

from top to bottom. The assessment included the five baseball/softball fields, the basketball courts, tennis courts, the two playgrounds, the soccer fields, the bocce ball courts and club, the clubhouse, including its activities with tiny tots, and neighborhood meetings. One of the first items we pursued was to rehabilitate the baseball fields. We contacted the San Francisco Giants Foundation and they stepped up to the plate to rehab three of the fields and donated and installed a scoreboard through their foundation. Second, we contacted the 49ers Foundation and they donated the football field along with a new scoreboard paid for by that foundation. Unfortunately, that winter a storm came in and blew the scoreboard down and Rec and Park has failed to repair that item. That was circa 2005. CAPAG along with OMMRA lobbied Rec and Park at its committee and commission meetings for San Francisco's first skateboard facility. The Commission overwhelmingly approved this facility in circa 2004. After the Rec and Park bond was approved back in 2000, monies were set aside for park renovations and Crocker Amazon Park through CAPAG, OMMRA, and the community received the first new playground facility at the corner of Geneva Avenue and Moscow. It was a community driven project now affectionately called the "Purple Playground." There were also monies set aside to start renovating soccer fields across San Francisco. The Fisher Family along with City Fields were approached by CAPAG and OMMRA to renovate the Crocker Amazon soccer fields. After several presentations to City Fields, the Fisher Family, SF Arts Commission, and Rec and Park Commission, Crocker Amazon Park was awarded the third soccer field renovated in San Francisco. The soccer fields at Crocker Amazon Park is one of the busiest fields in San Francisco. Other projects included the dog park above the baseball fields, monthly work programs, cleaning and greening, and lobbying for the good of the park.

Recently, after a Rec and Park an official found the Assessment, on her desk, that CAPAG and OMMRA prepared and sent to Rec and Park in 1999, this person was very interested in this project. The Bocce Ball court and clubhouse was renovated and dedicated under then interim Mayor Edwin M. Lee in 2011.

Other parks that either Steven Currier, CAPAG, OMMRA, and the community have worked on and taken care of are Alice Chalmers Playground, Excelsior Playground, McLaren Park, Claire Shea Park (DPW) Naples and Curtis Streets, Naples Green (DPW) Naples Street and Geneva Avenue, the greening of Guadalupe Elementary School, the saving (not demolishing) the Geneva Car Barn and Powerhouse now under the tutelage of Rec and Park, greening the medians on Geneva Avenue and Alemany Boulevard, the Geneva Community Gardens and others.

Steven was tapped by then Assemblymember Leland Y. Yee as a Delegate to the Democratic State Convention and then by Assemblymember Fiona Ma. Steven was also honored as Assembly District 12's Veteran of the year in 2010 by Assemblymember Ma and honored by Speaker John Perez.

After 15 years, Steven Currier stepped down to give others the opportunity to serve and make a mark in this great District 11 Community.

## Business and/or professional experience:

Steven Currier is a graduate of Oklahoma City University with a Bachelor of Arts degree in voice 1981. He moved to San in 1983 and was a law office administrator managing five bay area law offices for one firm. He was also a litigator and retired in 1992. He continues to sing for various churches and choirs.

**Seat 22**, succeeding Theresa Factora, term expires February 1, 2018, must be nominated by the District 11 Supervisor and from District 11, for a two-year term ending February 1, 2020.

<u>Additional Membership Requirement</u>: At least four (4) of the members chosen from the list maintained by the Recreation and Park Commission (ratified by Resolution No. 391-13) must be individuals nominated by an environmental organization.

Reports: Annually provide input on: 1) the Strategic Plan, which establishes or reaffirms the mission, goals and objectives for the Recreation and Park Department ("Department"); 2) the Capital Plan, for the development, renovation, replacement, and maintenance of capital assets, and the acquisition of real property; and 3) the Operational Plan, which details proposed improvements to the Department's services and responsiveness to customer needs.

#### **Authority:**

Park Code, Article 13, and Charter, Section 16.107 (Ordinance No. 118-00; and Resolution Nos. 168-01, and 391-13)

#### **Board Qualifications:**

The Park, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee consists of a total of twenty-three (23) members. Twenty-two (22) members shall be appointed by the members of the Board of Supervisors and approved by the full Board, with one (1) member appointed by each Supervisor from his/her supervisorial district and one (1) member appointed by each Supervisor from the list maintained by the Recreation and Park Commission of individuals nominated by organizations having as a primary focus park, environmental, recreational, cultural, sports, youth or senior citizen issues (ratified by Resolution No. 391-13). Four (4) of the members chosen from the list maintained by the Commission shall be individuals nominated by an environmental organization. In addition, one (1) member shall be appointed by the Mayor.

If the system of district elections set forth in Charter, Section 13.110, is discontinued, each Supervisor shall appoint one (1) member of the Committee from the list maintained by the Commission and one (1) member without restriction.

The Committee members shall serve for two-year terms at the will of the appointing authority, except that at the first meeting of the Committee, the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department shall, by lot, designate twelve (12) members to serve terms of one (1) year. Thereafter, all members shall be appointed to two-year terms and no member shall serve more than four (4) consecutive terms.

## San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Advisory Committee shall assist the Planning Commission and Recreation and Park Commission in the implementation of Charter, Section 16.107. They shall assist the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department and the Director of the Planning Department in establishing priorities for renovation, acquisition, development and maintenance of properties in accordance with the Recreation and Open Space Programs to implement the recreation and open space element of the Master Plan.

Reports: Input into the Strategic Plan updated annually, the Capital Plan updated annually, and the Operational Plan updated annually.
