FILE NO. 180087

[Park, Health Codes - Transbay Rooftop Park]

Ordinance amending the Park Code to treat the rooftop park located above the Transbay Transit Center as a City park for certain purposes; amending the Health Code to prohibit smoking on the rooftop park; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Environmental Findings.

The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180087 and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this determination.

Section 2. The Park Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 2.01 and 4.10 to read as follows:

SEC. 2.01. "PARK" DEFINED.

(a) When used in this Code, the word "park" shall mean and include <u>(1)</u> all grounds, roadways, avenues, squares, recreation facilities, and other property placed under the control,

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management, and direction of the Recreation and Park Commission by the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco; - and (2) the open space on the blocks bounded by Market, Folsom, Third, and Fourth Streets, which is under the control, management, and direction of the Redevelopment Agency of the City and County of San Francisco, otherwise known as the "Yerba Buena Gardens;" and (3) the open space generally known as the "Transbay Rooftop Park" which is located on the roof of the facility located on the blocks bounded by Mission, Beale, Howard, and Second Streets, and which is under the ownership, control, management, and direction of the Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA), provided that the TJPA Board of Directors has not rescinded or revoked the TJPA resolution of consent to the enforcement of the Park Code for the Transbay Rooftop Park, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180087. The foregoing definitions of the word "park" shall not apply where such word is otherwise defined within the section in which it appears. In addition, the designation of Yerba Buena Gardens and the Transbay Rooftop Park as "parks" for purposes of this Code does not effect a jurisdictional transfer of either property, does not place either property under the jurisdiction and control of the Recreation and Park Commission, does not render either property "park land" or "park property" as those terms are used in any provision of the Charter, and does not entitle the City and County of San Francisco to receive revenues that may be generated by either property.

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SEC. 4.10. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES.

(a) Except as provided in Subsection 4.10(b), no person shall consume alcoholic beverages of any kind in any building, children's areas, swimming pool, restroom, or any of the following parks or portions of parks:

Sunnyside Conservatory;

Section 3. The Park Code is hereby amended by adding Article 11A, consisting of Sections 11A.01, 11A.02, 11A.03, and 11A.04 to read as follows:

ARTICLE 11A: TRANSBAY ROOFTOP PARK

SEC. 11A.01. AUTHORITY OF TRANSBAY JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code, the Board of Supervisors recognizes the Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA) Board of Directors as the governing body of the Transbay Rooftop Park. The TJPA Board of Directors shall have the exclusive authority to set rules for the Transbay Rooftop Park pursuant to Article 3 and Article 4 of this Code, to issue permits for the use of the park consistent with the general purposes described in Section 7.01 of this Code, to set and collect fees as authorized by state law, and to designate persons who shall perform all other functions for Transbay Rooftop Park that would be otherwise performed by the General Manager, Superintendent of Recreation, or Superintendent of Parks for any other park under this Code.

SEC. 11A.02. CERTAIN ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES PROHIBITED.

No person shall participate in any team athletic activity in the Transbay Rooftop Park, including but not limited to volleyball, baseball, soccer, football, or lacrosse, nor in the individual activities of roller skating, roller blading, bicycle riding, kite flying, or skateboarding, except when acting pursuant to a permit issued by the TJPA Board of Directors or its designee.

SEC. 11A.03. ANIMALS PROHIBITED.

No person, other than members of the Police Department when on duty, shall bring any animals, including but not limited to dogs, cats, and horses, into the Transbay Rooftop Park except when acting pursuant to a permit issued by the TJPA Board of Directors or its designee. Notwithstanding the preceding sentence, a person with a disability may enter the Transbay Rooftop Park with a guide or signal dog without a permit.

SEC. 11A.04. WHEELED EQUIPMENT PROHIBITED.

<u>No person, other than employees, agents, or contractors of the TJPA when on duty, shall bring</u> <u>any wheeled conveyances, including but not limited to trucks, cars, and skateboards, into the Transbay</u> <u>Rooftop Park except when acting pursuant to a permit issued by the TJPA Board of Directors or its</u> <u>designee. Notwithstanding the preceding sentence, wheelchairs and strollers for preschool children</u> <u>may be brought into the Transbay Rooftop Park without a permit.</u>

Section 4. The Health Code is hereby amended by revising Section 1009.81 to read as follows:

SEC. 1009.81. PROHIBITING SMOKING IN CITY PARK AND RECREATIONAL AREAS.

(a) Smoking is prohibited on any unenclosed area of property in the City and County of San Francisco that is open to the public and under the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission or any other City department if the property is a park, square, garden, sport or playing field, pier, or other property used for recreational purposes, or a farmers' market. *For purposes of this Article 19I, the term "City department" shall include the Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA) with respect to the Transbay Rooftop Park, provided that the TJPA Board of Directors has not rescinded or revoked the TJPA resolution of consent to the enforcement of this*

Supervisor Kim BOARD OF SUPERVISORS Article 19I for the Transbay Rooftop Park, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180087.

Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 6. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Park, Health Codes - Transbay Rooftop Park]

Ordinance amending the Park Code to treat the rooftop park located above the Transbay Transit Center as a City park for certain purposes; amending the Health Code to prohibit smoking on the rooftop park; and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

The rooftop park located above the Transbay Transit Center, referred to as the Transbay Rooftop Park, belongs to the Transbay Joint Powers Authority ("TJPA"). The Park Code and the City's ban against smoking on City recreation areas do not apply in the Transbay Rooftop Park.

Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance would define the Transbay Rooftop Park as a "park" for purposes of the Park Code. This would allow City officials to enforce the rules and regulations set forth in Article 3 and Article 4 of the Park Code on the Transbay Rooftop Park as though that park belonged to the City. But the ordinance would not transfer the park to the jurisdiction of the Recreation and Park Commission. The Transbay Rooftop Park would continue to be managed and operated exclusively by the TJPA.

The ordinance would also amend the Health Code to cause the ban on smoking in City recreation areas to become applicable to the Transbay Rooftop Park.

Background Information

Under state law, the TJPA has primary jurisdiction with respect to all matters concerning the financing, design, development, construction, and operation of the new transit center, which includes the Transbay Rooftop Park. On September 14, 2017, the TJPA Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 17-035, authorizing the TJPA's executive director to proceed with requesting proposed amendments to the Park Code and Health Code to make the Transbay Rooftop Park subject to certain rules and regulations under those codes.

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Transbay Rooftop Park

- 5.4-acre public park on roof of new transit center
- Variety of activities and amenities, including amphitheater, gardens, open grass areas, children's play space, and dining





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Programmatic Goals

- Exceptional visitor experience
- Preserve the park's unique ecosystem
- Full park activation
- Safe & secure park





San Francisco Park Framework

- Most parks in San Francisco owned by City, managed by Recreation and Park Commission, and subject to Municipal Code
- Municipal Code well-developed body of rules and regulations applicable to City-owned parks
- Since the rooftop park is owned and managed by TJPA, Municipal Code regulations of City parks do not automatically apply



TJPA Park Rules Approach

- Adopt rules for the rooftop park generally consistent with Municipal Code
- Request that City adopt legislation amending Municipal Code to make the rooftop park a "park" subject to certain rules and regulations under the Municipal Code, while TJPA retains jurisdiction and control
- Similar approach used for former Redevelopment Agency's Yerba Buena Gardens



San Francisco Park Rules



- Generally applicable Park
 Code would apply to
 Transbay Rooftop Park
- For example:
 - No camping
 - No removing flowers and plants
 - No feeding animals



San Francisco Park Rules

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TRANSBAY JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Resolution No. 17-035

WHEREAS, The Transbay Joint Powers Authority (TJPA) is a joint powers agency organized and existing under the laws of the State of California to design, build and operate the Transbay Program ("Program"); and

WHEREAS, The Program includes, among other things, construction and operation of the new transit center (named "Salesforce Transit Center"), including its 5.4-acre rooftop park (named "Salesforce Park" and referred to herein as "TJPA's park"); and

WHEREAS, TJPA's park is expected to be a destination for visitors that will include area residents and workers, transit riders, and tourists, with programs and events (activation) designed to ensure that the open space is populated throughout the daytime and evening hours of operation; and

WHEREAS, TJPA's park, like all other San Francisco parks, requires rules and regulations to ensure the enjoyment and safety of all visitors and preservation of the public resource; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Code includes a well-developed body of rules and regulations generally applicable to parks in San Francisco that could generally be applied to TJPA's park, while retaining the TJPA's ownership, jurisdiction, and control over the park; and

WHEREAS, TJPA staff have prepared proposed rules and regulations for TJPA's park ("Park Rules") that are generally consistent with the San Francisco Park Code and Yerba Buena Gardens in particular; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the TJPA Board of Directors adopts the Park Rules in substantially the form attached hereto; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the TJPA Board of Directors authorizes the Executive Director to proceed with requesting proposed amendments to the San Francisco Municipal Code to make TJPA's park a "park" subject to certain rules and regulations under the Municipal Code that are consistent with the Park Rules; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the TJPA Board of Directors authorizes the Executive Director to take all actions and execute all documents as he deems reasonably necessary to implement and effectuate the above approvals.
