WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) has partnered with the Market Street Association since 2008 to implement the Market Street snowflake lights program during the winter holiday season; and

WHEREAS, The Market Street snowflake lights program consists of 276 snowflake lights that are installed on Market Street from Main Street to Ninth Street; and

WHEREAS, The Market Street Association owns the snowflake lights, while the SFPUC installs them and supplies the energy needed for the lights to illuminate; and

WHEREAS, The Market Street Association has offered to donate the snowflake lights valued at \$134,757 to the SFPUC; and

WHEREAS, The SFPUC has the facilities needed to store the lights; and WHEREAS, The SFPUC has the resources needed to continue to implement the Market Street snowflake lights program; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the gift and authorizes the General Manager of the SFPUC to accept the snowflake lights donation from the Market Street Association, valued at \$134,757.




## **History of Snowflake Lights**
