11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13	Section 1. The Police Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 1602 and 1609,
14	to read as follows:
15	SEC. 1602. DEFINITIONS.
16	* * * *
17	"Bona Fide Labor Organization" means any organization or any agency or employee
18	representation committee or any local unit thereof in which employees participate, and exists for the
19	purpose, in whole or in part, of dealing with employers concerning grievances, labor disputes, wages,
20	hours of employment or conditions of work, which labor organization is not found to be or to have been
21	financed in whole or in part, interfered with, dominated or controlled by the employer or any employer
22	association.
23	* * * *
24	"Labor Peace Agreement" has the meaning set forth in Section 26001 of the California
25	Business and Professions Code, as may be amended from time to time.means an agreement between an

1	Applicant and any Bona Fide Labor Organization that, at a minimum, prohibits such Bona Fide Labor
2	Organization and members from engaging in picketing, work stoppages, boycotts, and any other
3	economic interference with the applicants' business. As part of this Agreement, an Applicant also
4	agrees not to disrupt efforts by such Bona Fide Labor Organization to communicate with, and attempt
5	to organize and represent, the Applicant's employees. The agreement shall provide such Bona Fide
6	Labor Organization access at reasonable times to areas in which the Applicants' employees work, for
7	the purpose of meeting with employees to discuss their right to representation, employment rights unde
8	state law, and terms and conditions of employment. A Labor Peace Agreement shall not mandate a
9	particular method of election or certification of a Bona Fide Labor Organization as an Applicant's
10	employees' representative.
11	* * * *SEC. 1609. PERMIT APPLICATIONS.
12	* * * *
13	(b) Information Required of All Applicants for Cannabis Business Permits. The
14	application form for all Cannabis Business Permit Applicants shall require the Applicant to
15	provide the following information and documentation:
16	* * * *
17	(12) For Applicants with 10 or more employees, a statement that the Applicant will enter
18	into, or demonstrate that it has already entered into, and abide by the terms of a Labor Peace
19	Agreement; each Applicant must demonstrate either of the following:
20	(A) That the Applicant has entered into, and will abide by, the terms of a Labor
21	Peace Agreement; or,
22	(B) That the Applicant has entered into a collective bargaining agreement with a
23	Bona Fide Labor Organization.

1	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
2	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
3	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
4	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
5	
6	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
7	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
8	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
9	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
10	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
11	the official title of the ordinance.
