## **LEGISLATIVE DIGEST**

[Administrative Code - Health Insurance For Successor Agency Commissioners]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to allow members of the Successor Agency Commission to be eligible to participate in the City's Health Service System.

## **Existing Law**

Members of the Successor Agency Commission are not currently eligible to participate in the City's Health Service System.

## Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance would allow members of the Successor Agency Commission to be eligible to participate in the City's Health Service System.

## **Background Information**

Administrative Code Section 16.700(f) provides that the governing body of the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency may deem its employees and officers to be eligible to participate in the City's Health Service System. The governing body of the Redevelopment Agency was the Redevelopment Agency Commission.

In 2012, the State of California dissolved the Redevelopment Agency and the Redevelopment Agency Commission. The Board of Supervisors responded to the dissolution by creating a Successor Agency to act in place of the former Redevelopment Agency, and a five-member Successor Agency Commission to act in place of the former Redevelopment Agency Commission. The Successor Agency is also known as the Office of Community Investment and Infrastructure ("OCII"). The Successor Agency Commission is also known as the Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure ("CCII"). The sole purpose of this ordinance is to provide the members of the Successor Agency Commission the same access to the City's Health Service System as was previously provided to the members of the Redevelopment Agency Commission.

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
