Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to change the composition of the Family Violence Council and extend the sunset date for the Council to May 1, 2021.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Sections 5.190, 5.190-1, 5.190-2, 5.190-3, 5.190-4, 5.190-5, 5.190-6, and 5.190-7 of the Administrative Code (Chapter 5, Article XIX) are hereby renumbered as Sections 5.19-1, 5.19-2, 5.19-3, 5.19-4, 5.19-5, 5.19-6, 5.19-7, and 5.19-8, respectively.

Section 2. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising existing Sections 5.190-4 and 5.190-7 (newly-renumbered Sections 5.19-5 and 5.19-8, respectively), to read as follows:

SEC. 5.190-45.19-5. FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL - COMPOSITION - TERMS OF OFFICE.

- (a) **Composition.** The composition of the Council shall broadly represent the ethnic, racial, gender, age, and sexual orientation diversity of the City and County. The Council shall consist of the following individuals or their respective designees:
 - (1) Presiding Judge of the Superior Court;

2		(3) President of the Board of Supervisors;

6		(7) President of the Commission on the Status of Women;

10		(11) Executive Director of Human Services Agency;
11		(12) Executive Director of the Consortium for Elder Abuse Prevention;

13		(14) Director of the Department of Public Health;
14		(15) <u>Executive</u> Director of the Department of Adult and Aging Services;
15		(16) <u>Executive</u> Director of the Department of Children, Youth, <u>and & Their</u>
16	Families;	
17		(17) Chair of the Consortium of Batterer's Intervention Programs Medical Examiner;
18		(18) Director of the Department of Child Support Services;
19		(19) Chief of Juvenile Probation;
20		(20) Public Defender;
21		(21) Director of the Department of Animal Care and Control;
22		(22) Superintendent of San Francisco Unified School District;
23		(23) Human Resources Director; and
24		(24) Chief of the Fire Department; and
25		(25) Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.

If at any time an agency responsible for designating a member to Seat 1, 10, 12, 13, 17, or 22 declines to designate a member and leaves the seat vacant for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a member of the public to fill the seat until such time as the agency designates a member.

The Steering Committee shall have the authority to appoint up to three members to the Council. Each such member shall have an interest in family violence prevention and experience working in academia or the non-profit, medical, or business community. Each of these members shall serve for a term of one year at the pleasure of the Steering Committee.

(b) **Limitations on Service in Community-Based Organization Seats.** No individual may serve as a Council member in seat 10, 12, <u>or</u> 13, <u>or 17,</u> either as a named member or as a designee, for more than six years out of any nine-year period. For the purpose of calculating the number of years of service, any service prior to May 1, 2015, shall not count.

* * * *

SEC. 5.190-75.19-8. FAMILY VIOLENCE COUNCIL - SUNSET.

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Family Violence Council, this Article XIX shall expire by operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, on May 1, <u>2021</u>2018. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause this Article to be removed from the Administrative Code.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Notwithstanding the Effective Date of this ordinance, it is the intent of the Board that the Family Violence Council shall continue to operate without interruption in the event the Effective Date is after May 1, 2018, and that the changes pertaining to membership of the Council contained in this ordinance shall occur on the Effective Date.

Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. Except as stated in Section 1, in enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Composition and Sunset Date - Family Violence Council]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to change the composition of the Family Violence Council and extend the sunset date for the Council to May 1, 2021.

Existing Law

The Family Violence Council is an advisory body that makes recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the Superior Court, and City departments regarding prevention and treatment of child abuse, domestic violence, and elder/dependent adult abuse. Among other duties, the Council recommends strategies to serve survivors of family violence, recommends methods of educating the public about family violence, compiles relevant data, and facilitates communication and cooperation between public and private agencies.

The Council has 24 designated seats: 18 local government officials or their designees and the heads of four community-based organizations or their designees. Three of the members representing community-based organizations serve as the co-chairs of the Council and also serve as the members of the Steering Committee, a three-person committee that sets policy for the Council. The Steering Committee has discretion to appoint three additional members to the Council.

The Council is currently scheduled to terminate on May 1, 2018.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would add seats on the Council for the City's Medical Examiner and the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing. The ordinance would also reflect that the San Francisco Child Abuse Council, which has a seat on the Family Violence Council, is now known as Safe & Sound.

Under Board of Supervisors Rules of Order, Rule 2.21, the ordinance would also provide that the Council will automatically sunset on May 1, 2021 unless extended in a subsequent ordinance.

Board of Supervisors Rules of Order 2.21 establishes certain criteria that must be included in legislation creating and establishing, or reauthorizing, new bodies (boards/commissions/task forces/advisory bodies) and requires the Clerk of the Board to advise the Board on certain matters. In order to fulfill these requirements, the following is provided:



This Ordinance changes the composition of the existing Family Violence Council and establishes a sunset date.

- Does a current body address the same or similar subject matter?No, there are no other bodies that address the same or similar subject matter.
- Language requiring the body to meet at least once every four months

 Section 5.190-4(d) states that the Council shall meet at least once every quarter.
- Language indicating members serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority

The composition of the Council consists mostly of specific department heads, or his/her designee, who are not appointed. Section 5.190-4(a) allows the Steering Committee, which is



made up of three Council members, to appoint up to three additional members to the Council and these members shall serve at the pleasure of the Steering Committee.

Language establishing attendance requirements

Section 5.190-5(a) states that members appointed by the Steering Committee may be removed by the Steering Committee if they miss three meetings in any one year period. If members are designated by a department head in any of the other seats and miss three meetings in one year, the Council may request that department head designate another individual.

Number of seats and qualifications

The Council is currently comprised of 27 members. There are 24 designated seats consisting of 18 government officials, or their designees, and four community-based organizations' designees. Three of the members representing community-based organizations serve as the members of the Steering Committee, who has the discretion of appointing three additional members to the Council.

If passed, this Ordinance would add two seats on the Council for the City's Medical Examiner and the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing. It will also reflect the change that the "San Francisco Child Abuse Council," who has a seat on the Council, is now known as "Safe & Sound."

Term limits (i.e., commencement date? staggered terms?)

Section 5.190-4(b) states that Council members in seats 10, 12, 13, or 17 can only serve for six years out of a nine-year period. Section 5.190-4(a) states that members who are appointed by the Steering Committee serve for one year. The terms for the remaining members are not specified since the seats are specific to a department head, or his/her designee.

Administering department

The Department on the Status of Women provides administrative support to the Council.

Reporting requirements

Section 5.190-5(c) states that the Council shall submit an annual report of its recommendations to the Board of Supervisors. The Council may also submit recommendations to the courts and the Mayor.

Sunset date

Section 5.190-7 currently terminates the Council on May 1, 2018, unless the Board of Supervisors extends the term by Ordinance. If passed, this Ordinance will extend the Council until May 1, 2021, unless extended by a subsequent ordinance.
