# [Rules of Order - Adding Board Rule 1.3.2 - Political Activities Prohibited During Board of Supervisors' Meetings] 

## Motion amending the Rules of Order of the Board of Supervisors by adding Rule 1.3.2 regarding political activities that are prohibited during Board of Supervisors' meetings, including during public comment and the authority to enforce such Rule.

MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby amends its Rules of Order to create a new Rule 1.3.2, as follows:
1.3.2. Political Activities Prohibited During Board of Supervisors' Meetings. Public comment that expressly advocates for or against a pending candidate or ballot measure shall be prohibited. For the purpose of this rule, "expressly advocate" shall mean speaking or using words and phrases that clearly urge support or opposition to a candidate or ballot measure. "Express advocacy" shall include, but not be limited to, words and phrases such as "vote for," "elect," "support," "cast your ballot for," "Smith for Mavor," "vote against," "defeat," or "reject." This rule shall apply to spoken public comment, as well as materials the speaker makes visible during public comment, including, but not limited to, signs, buttons, placards, and clothing.

The President and/or the Clerk shall provide any person making such public comment a reasonable opportunity to redirect their public comment to matters within the Board's jurisdiction and/or to take down any materials visible to the public. If the speaker continues to expressly advocate for or against a pending candidate or ballot measure, the President and/or Clerk shall end the speaker's opportunity for public comment. This Rule shall also apply to matters being considered in Committee (Rule 3.8) and at Board (Rule 4.22).
