[Armenian Genocide Commemoration Day - April 24, 2018]

Resolution declaring April 24, 2018, as Armenian Genocide Commemoration Day in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, The Armenian people, living in their historic homeland of 4,000 years, were subjected to severe persecution by the Turkish government of the Ottoman Empire before and after the turn of the twentieth century, including widespread massacres, usurpation of land and property, and destruction of cultural institutions and monuments during the period from 1894 to 1896 and again in 1909; and

WHEREAS, The unspeakable horrors experienced by the Armenian people at the hands of the Ottoman Turkish government culminated in 1915 in what is known by historians as the first systematic genocide of the twentieth century; and

WHEREAS, The Ottoman Turkish authorities planned and implemented the atrocities committed against the Armenian people from 1915 through 1923, resulting in the deaths of 1.5 million Armenian women, men and children; and

WHEREAS, In response to the genocide and at the behest of President Woodrow Wilson and the U.S. State Department, the Near East Relief Organization, the first Congressionally-sanctioned American philanthropic effort created exclusively to aid the Armenian people and other Christian minorities, was founded and provided unprecedented relief, delivering more than \$117,000,000 of humanitarian assistance between 1915 and 1930, and saving approximately one million refugees, including 130,000 orphans of the genocide; and

WHEREAS, Raphael Lemkin, who coined the term "genocide" in 1944, and who was the earliest proponent of the United Nations Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of

the Genocide, invoked the Armenian case as a definitive example of genocide in the twentieth century; and

WHEREAS, Those citizens of Turkey who speak the truth about the Armenian Genocide – such as assassinated human rights activist and journalist Hrant Dink – continue to be silenced by violent means and/or imprisonment, in part due to Turkish law which criminalizes any expression which is considered to be critical of Turkish identity; and

WHEREAS, 2018 marks the 30th anniversary of the genocidal pogroms against Armenians in the cities of Sumgait and Baku, Azerbaijan, following a peaceful demand by the Armenian autonomous republic of Nagorno Karabagh to reunite with the Republic of Armenia; and

WHEREAS, By honoring the survivors and consistently remembering and condemning the repeated atrocities committed against the Armenian people, as well as the persecution of the Assyrian and Greek populations of the Ottoman Empire, we guard against the repetition of genocide; and

WHEREAS, California has become home to the largest and most active population of Armenians in the United States, and those citizens have enriched our state through leadership in the fields of academia, medicine, business, agriculture, government and the arts and are proud and patriotic practitioners of American citizenship; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco Armenian-Americans are predominantly descendants of the few remaining survivors of the Genocide; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco is proud to join the Armenian-American community in its commemoration of the anniversary of the Armenian Genocide in an effort to educate others about the tragic loss of life, land, and human rights of the Armenian people and the crime of genocide committed against them; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby declares April 24, 2018, as Armenian Genocide Commemoration Day in the City and County of San Francisco.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges San Francisco's elected representatives in the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate to accord recognition of the Armenian Genocide through passage of House Resolution 220; and

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco Board of Education to reaffirm its commitment to teaching about the Armenian Genocide in San Francisco Schools as indicated in the California State Board of Education's History Social Sciences framework and standards, by communicating this intention to its high school Social Studies and English Language Arts educators, and by offering appropriate professional development training and instructional resources on the subject to social studies and English language arts educators.

Mr. Trott (for himself, Mr. Schiff, Mr. Valadao, Ms. Speier, Mr. Pallone, Ms. Judy Chu of California, Ms. Jackson Lee, Mr. Bilirakis, Mr. Sarbanes, Mr. Royce of California, Mr. Engel, Ms. Clark of Massachusetts, Mr. McGovern, Mr. Carbajal, Ms. Eshoo, and Mr. Costa) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding past genocides, and for other purposes.

Whereas the lessons of past genocides should be applied to help prevent future war crimes, crimes against humanity, and genocide;

Whereas, on March 17, 2016, the Department of State declared that "Da'esh is responsible for genocide against groups in areas under its control, including Yezidis, Christians, and Shia Muslims", and is "also responsible for crimes against humanity and ethnic cleansing directed at these same groups and in some cases against Sunni Muslims and Kurds and other minorities";

- Whereas the House of Representatives, on March 14, 2016, passed H. Con. Res. 75, which concluded that "the atrocities perpetrated by ISIL against Christians, Yezidis, and other religious and ethnic minorities in Iraq and Syria constitute war crimes, crimes against humanity, and genocide";
- Whereas the Senate, on July 7, 2016, passed S. Res. 340, which concluded that "the atrocities perpetrated by the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) against Christians, Yezidis, Shi'a, and other religious and ethnic minorities in Iraq and Syria constitute war crimes, crimes against humanity, and genocide";
- Whereas the United States has a proud record of protesting and providing relief to Armenian and other Christian survivors of the Ottoman Empire's genocidal campaign;
- Whereas President Woodrow Wilson encouraged the formation of the Near East Relief, chartered by an Act of Congress, which raised \$116,000,000 (over \$2,500,000,000 in 2017 dollars) between 1915 and 1930, the Senate adopted resolutions condemning these massacres, and United States diplomats organized and led protests of these crimes;
- Whereas the United States is on record as having officially recognized the Armenian Genocide, in the United States Government's May 28, 1951, written statement to the International Court of Justice regarding the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide, through President Ronald Reagan's April 22, 1981, Proclamation No. 4838, and by House Joint Resolution 148, adopted on April 8, 1975, and House Joint Resolution 247, adopted on September 10, 1984; and

Whereas the proper commemoration and consistent condemnation of the Armenian Genocide will strengthen our international standing in preventing modern day genocides: Now, therefore, be it
