

1 [Resolution Urging the Mayor to Fund Specific City-Wide Street Cleaning Priorities in the
2 FY2018-2019 Budget]

3 **Resolution urging the Mayor to fund specific city-wide street cleaning priorities in the**
4 **FY2018-2019 budget, including Pit Stop expansion program, non-profit partner funding**
5 **expansion, and equipment purchases.**

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7 WHEREAS, The Mayor of San Francisco will release the proposed two-year budget for
8 the City and County of San Francisco for FYs 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 on June 1, 2018;
9 and

10 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors has discretionary authority to
11 amend and supplement the Mayor’s proposed Budget through the legislative process; and

12 WHEREAS, The Budget Legislative Analyst identified clean streets to be a key budget
13 priority for the Board of Supervisors, as reflected in their presentation to the Budget and
14 Finance Committee on March 22, 2018, and which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
15 Supervisors in File No. 180250, which is declared to be a part of this Resolution as if set forth
16 fully herein; and

17 WHEREAS, The Budget and Finance Committee held a “Budget Priority Hearing” on
18 April 12, 2018, to determine gaps and opportunities in our City’s street cleaning programs for
19 the FY2018-2019 budget, featuring presentations by the Department of Public Works, the
20 Department of Public Health, the City Services Auditor, the Budget Legislative Analyst, and
21 key community stakeholders, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File
22 No. 180338, and which is hereby declared to be a part of this Resolution as if set forth fully
23 herein; and

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1 WHEREAS, Community Benefit Districts currently allocate over \$4 million additional
2 dollars for local street cleaning from self-assessed properties across the City, intended to
3 supplement the City’s baseline street cleaning program in those communities; and

4 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works is currently engaged in a “public trash
5 can redesign” program to design and build tamper-proof street litter bins, in an effort to reduce
6 litter on the street; and

7 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works identified a staff retention challenge for
8 entry level street cleaning workers; therefore, be it

9 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors herein urges the Mayor to prioritize clean
10 streets investment in the FY2018-2019 budget; and, be it

11 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Street Environmental Services funding levels reflect
12 an expansion (a) in the “Pit Stop program;” (b) a one-time increase in city grant funding to
13 non-profit partners providing localized manual cleaning in neighborhoods and commercial
14 corridors; and (c) an investment in steam cleaners to assist in localized cleanup of fecal,
15 needle, or condom or other potentially hazardous materials; and, be it

16 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the speedy finalization
17 and implementation of the updated “public trash can redesign” program, for inclusion in the
18 FY2019-2020 budget; and, be it

19 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor’s Office of
20 Workforce Development, Human Services Agency, and Department of Public Works to
21 identify opportunities for staff retention in street cleaning programs; and, be it

22 FURTHER RESOLVED, That geographical equity and city-wide cleanliness demands
23 be considered a central tenet of any street cleaning program expansion.

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
