
Working with Sexual Assault Survivors

National Trends Out of Every 1000 Rapes:

- 310 are reported to police
- 57 reports lead to arrests
- 11 cases referred to prosecutors
- Only 7 led to a a felony conviction

Sexual assault is a grossly under-reported crime for a variety of internal and external factors. The low incidence of prosecution is not a reflection of not believing a victim, it is often a the result of lack of evidence to prove a case beyond a reasonable doubt.

 - 2017
 - 347 Survivors (105 charged)
 - 47 Survivor Associates or Family
 - Victim Service Dogs

Opportunities

- 1. Supplemental report and protocol on sex assault cases
- 2. Enhance materials for survivors
- Formalize process for reporting dissatisfaction with cases at SFDA's office
- 4. Coordinated meetings with survivors, ADA, advocates and support people
- Additional mandated training for ADA's rotating into CASA unit
- 6. Develop training with local advocates, service providers and survivors
