[Urging the Arbitration Board to Incorporate City Proposal #22 into the Memorandum of Understanding Between the City and County of San Francisco and the San Francisco Police Officers' Association]

Resolution urging the Arbitration Board to adopt and incorporate City Proposal #22, requiring the San Francisco Police Officers Association to request to meet within 14 days of any changes involving United States Department of Justice recommendations, and to waive factfinding and impasse procedures if no agreement is reached, into any new Memorandum of Understanding between the City and County of San Francisco and the San Francisco Police Officers Association.

WHEREAS, San Francisco city officials and community members invited the United States Department of Justice to conduct an in-depth review into the policies and practices of the San Francisco Police Department in 2015; and

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Justice Office of Community Oriented Policing Services launched an independent and comprehensive review of the San Francisco Police Department on February 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors unanimously passed a Resolution (File No. 161315) supporting the Use of Force policy unanimously agreed upon by the San Francisco Police Commission and urging the San Francisco Police Officers Association (SFPOA) to implement said Use of Force policy; and

WHEREAS, On December 21, 2016, the San Francisco Police Commission passed a new use-of-force policy incorporating feedback and recommendations from the Department of Justice, updating an outdated policy that had been in effect for over 20 years; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Officers Association filed a lawsuit against the City and County of San Francisco, attempting to block implementation of San Francisco's new use-of-force policy; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Police Officers Association appealed the court's decision when it lost its lawsuit and has not withdrawn its appeal to date; and

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Justice (USDOJ) issued a comprehensive report in October 2016, with 94 findings and 272 recommendations for the San Francisco Police Department to improve its practices; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco city and law enforcement officials have unanimously endorsed the Department of Justice report and called for immediate implementation of its 272 recommendations; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco Police Chief William Scott has committed to the full implementation of the Department of Justice recommendations; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is currently negotiating a new Memorandum of Understanding with the San Francisco Police Officers Association; and

WHEREAS, This Memorandum of Understanding will represent one of the largest expenditures in the budget for the City and County of San Francisco, requiring a baseline of half billion dollars in annual costs; and

WHEREAS, On March 21, 2018, Supervisor Malia Cohen called a hearing to provide consultation and input to the Mayor and Department of Human Resources on the successor Memorandum of Understanding negotiations between the City and County of San Francisco and the San Francisco Police Officers Association; and

WHEREAS, During the aforementioned hearing, community members and members of the Board of Supervisors' Government Audit and Oversight committee emphasized their

priorities for the successor MOU, including uninhibited implementation of the Department of Justice recommendations; and

WHEREAS, Public safety services secured with these considerable expenditures must be performed in as professional, effective, and high quality manner as possible; and

WHEREAS, The successful implementation of the Department of Justice recommendations is critical to the quality and value of the services covered by the Memorandum of Understanding; and

WHEREAS, Successful and efficient implementation of the Department of Justice recommendations requires as much cooperation as possible from the SFPOA; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco, through the Department of Human Resources, introduced City Proposal #22 into the negotiations, requiring the San Francisco Police Officers Association to request to meet within 14 days of any changes involving Department of Justice recommendations within the scope of representation, and to waive factfinding and impasse procedures if no agreement is reached; and

WHEREAS, Negotiations over this Memorandum of Understanding went to arbitration on April 16, 2018; and

WHEREAS, On April 17, 2018, San Francisco Police Chief William Scott testified in front of the Arbitration Board that City Proposal #22 would help expedite implementation of the Department of Justice recommendations; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors supports the Department of Human Resources presentation of City Proposal #22 as language to be incorporated into the Memorandum of Understanding; and, be it

RESOLVED, That if the San Francisco Police Officers Association does not agree to City Proposal #22, the Board of Supervisors urges the Arbitration Board to factor this into consideration regarding other issues under negotiation, including compensation; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That if no agreement is reached regarding City Proposal #22, the Board of Supervisors urges the Arbitration Board to incorporate City Proposal #22—to the extent possible—into the new Memorandum of Understanding between the City and County of San Francisco and the San Francisco Police Officers Association.
