
Performance Program


Per 100,000 San Francisco Residents


Crime Compared to Peer Cities

Per 100,000 Daytime Population (2016)




Auto Break-Ins Compared to Peers

Per 100,000 Residents




Auto Break-Ins in San Francisco

January 2016 – February 2018 Monthly Totals








Percentage Rated "Safe" or "Very Safe" During the Day and at Night









Per 100,000 daytime population




% Who Feel Safe Day and Night




Residents in the southeast part of the city, Latinos, lower income, and women report feeling less safe during the day and night compared to most San Franciscans.


