12	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

14	Section 1. The Administrative and Health Codes are hereby amended by recodifying
15	Health Code Sections 470.1 and 470.2 as Administrative Code Sections 5.10-1 and
16	5.10-2, respectively, in Chapter 5, Article X, and revising those Sections, to read as follows:
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18	ARTICLE X:
19	FOOD SECURITY TASK FORCE
20	SEC. $470.1 - 5.10-1$. ESTABLISHMENT AND MEMBERSHIP OF FOOD SECURITY
21	TASK FORCE.
22	(a) Food Security Task Force. There is hereby established a Food Security Task
23	Force of the City and County of San Francisco. Food security, for purposes of this Article
24	$\underline{Xordinance}$, shall mean the state in which all persons obtain a nutritionally adequate, culturally
25	acceptable diet at all times through local non-emergency sources.

1	(b) Membership. The Task Force shall consist of <i>up to 15</i> 20 members appointed by the
2	Board of Supervisors, City department heads, or the San Francisco Unified School District, as
3	provided below. Members, other than department representatives and the School District
4	representative, shall serve at the pleasure of their respective appointing authorities the Board of
5	Supervisors.
6	(1) Departmental and School District Representatives. The Board of Supervisors shall
7	appoint one member from the
8	(1) Seat 1 shall be an employee of the Department of Human Services, appointed by
9	the Executive Director of the Human Services Agency. of the Human Service Agency,
10	(2) Seat 2 shall be an employee of the Department of Public Health- Nutrition
11	Services, appointed by the Director of Health.
12	(3) Seat 3 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Aging and Adult
13	Services of the Human Services Agency, appointed by the Executive Director of the Human Services
14	Agency.
15	(4) Seat 4 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Public Health - Food
16	Security, -Office of Food Systems, appointed by the Director of Health.
17	(5) Seat 5 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Children, Youth and
18	their Families, appointed by the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and their Families.
19	(6) Seat 6 shall be held by an employee of the Department of Homelessness and
20	Supportive Housing, appointed by the Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive
21	<u>Housing.</u>
22	(7) Seat 7 shall be held by an employee of the and the Department of Environment
23	<u>Recreation and Park Department's</u> Urban Agriculture <u>Program, appointed by the General Manager of</u>
24	the Recreation and Park Department.

1	(8) Seat 8 snatt be neta by an appointee of the the Cierk of the Boara of Supervisors
2	shall invite the San Francisco Unified School District if the District chooses to appoint a member to
3	submit a representative for appointment by the Board as a member of the Task Force.
4	(9) (2) In addition, the Board may appoint as members of the Task Force up to eight
5	Seats 9 through 19 shall be held by representatives of community-based organizations that
6	provide nutritional support and increase the food security of San Francisco residents.
7	nominated by the Task Force and appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Such community members
8	shall be nominated by the Task Force and These members may include but are not limited to
9	representatives from organizations serving food in the following program types: home-
10	delivered meals; congregate meals for seniors; food bank; free dining room; multi-service
11	agency serving families and youth; shelter meals; and faith-based organizations; food retail
12	(farmers markets; grocery stores); and hospital and health clinics and a member of the public. No
13	organization shall have more than one representative on the Task Force.
14	(10) Seat 20 shall be held by a member of the public, nominated by the Task Force
15	and appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

17	attend at least three meetings in a six-month period without the express approval of the Task
18	Force at or before each missed meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Task
19	Force ten days after the third unapproved absence. The Task Force shall promptly inform the
20	Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the resignation.
21	(c) Staffing. The Department of Public Health shall provide clerical assistance and
22	logistical support to the Task Force and its committees.
23	(d) Meetings. The Task Force shall meet at least once every four months.
24	(e) Purposes of Task Force; Strategic Plan. The Food Security Task Force shall
25	recommend to the Board of Supervisors legislative action and city-wide strategies that would

1	increase participation in federally funded programs such as Cal Fresh known nationally as
2	SNAP and formally as food stamps, Summer Food Service, the Child and Adult Care Food
3	Program, the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, the Special Supplemental Nutrition
4	Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), the School Lunch Program, and the National
5	School Breakfast Program. The Task Force shall also provide general advice and assistance
6	to the Board of Supervisors with regard to funding priorities, legislative action, and \underline{Ce} ity
7	policies on addressing hunger and enhancing the food security of San Francisco residents in
8	addition to any other issues within the Task Force's expertise.

To accomplish these goals, the Food Security Task Force shall prepare an annual assessment of the state of hunger and food insecurity in San Francisco. *The report may include with* recommendations for funding, programs, and policy. The Task Force shall submit the hunger and food insecurity assessment to the Board of Supervisors. The Board of Supervisors may adopt legislation to implement the recommendations.

Thereafter, the Task Force shall submit status reports on progress toward implementing the plan and meeting the plan's goals to the Board bi-annually.

SEC. 470.2 5.10-2. SUNSET.

Unless the Board of Supervisors by ordinance extends the term of the Task Force, *Sections 470.1 and 470.2 this Article X* shall expire by operation of law, and the Task Force shall terminate, on July 1, 20182021. After that date, the City Attorney shall cause *Sections 470.1 and* 470.2 this Article X to be removed from the *Health Administrative* Code.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
2	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
3	Notwithstanding the Effective Date of this ordinance, it is the intent of this Board that
4	the Task Force shall continue to operate without interruption and that the incumbent members
5	of the Task Force shall continue to hold their seats without reappointment unless removed by
6	the appointing authorities designated in this ordinance.
7	
8	Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
9	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
10	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
11	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
12	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
13	the official title of the ordinance. However, as stated at the beginning of Section 1, this
14	ordinance recodifies Health Code Sections 470.1 and 470.2 as Administrative Code Sections
15	5.10-1 and 5.10-2, which has the effect of deleting those sections from the Health Code.
