

1 [Park Code - Tennis Center Fees]

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3 **Ordinance amending the Park Code to establish rates for reserving courts at the**
 4 **Golden Gate Park Tennis Center upon completion of its renovation, authorize the**
 5 **General Manager to set rates for other tennis-related services and items based on**
 6 **certain factors, and to repeal rates for tennis lessons offered by third-party**
 7 **professional instructors on park property; and affirming the Planning Department's**
 8 **determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.**

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14 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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16 Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in
 17 this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
 18 Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
 19 Board of Supervisors in File No. 180581, and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board
 20 affirms this determination.

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22 Section 2. The Park Code is hereby amended by repealing Section 12.41:

23 ~~**SEC. 12.41. PROFESSIONAL TENNIS LESSON RATES.**~~

24 ~~*(a) Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to this section.*~~

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1 —*"Director of Tennis"* means a Professional Tennis Instructor who demonstrates to the
2 satisfaction of the Recreation and Park Department that he or she has experience in all of the following
3 areas: (1) pro shop management, (2) training competitive tennis players at a sectional or national
4 level, (3) supervising employees, (4) managing a variety of tennis programs, and (5) other business
5 management activities including human relations, hiring, budgets, communications and professional
6 management team skills.

7 —*"Head Tennis Professional"* means a Professional Tennis Instructor who demonstrates to
8 the satisfaction of the Recreation and Park Department that he or she has experience in all of the
9 following areas: (1) instructing all tennis students at all levels, (2) conducting group and private tennis
10 lessons for all students at all levels, (3) assisting and developing competitive tennis players, (4)
11 designing and implementing tennis lesson plans, (5) organizing and implementing tennis programs, and
12 (6) assisting with and/or directing pro shop management and facility maintenance.

13 —*"Professional Tennis Instructor"* means a person who is certified by the United States
14 Professional Tennis Association ("USPTA").

15 —*"Tier One Instructor"* means a Professional Tennis Instructor who is either (1) USPTA
16 Certified Level 1, or (2) USPTA Certified Level 2 and a Director of Tennis or a Head Tennis
17 Professional.

18 —*"Tier Two Instructor"* means a Professional Tennis Instructor who is either (1) USPTA
19 Certified Level 2, or (2) USPTA Certified Level 3.

20 (b) **Rates.** The following rates shall be charged for tennis lessons that are provided on
21 Recreation and Park Department property by third party Professional Tennis Instructors who have
22 obtained authorization from the Department to conduct such lessons. After August 31, 2014, these rates
23 may be adjusted each year in accordance with Section 12.20 of this Article 12.

1 Section 3. The Park Code is hereby amended by adding a new Section 12.41, to read
2 as follows:

3 **12.41. TENNIS FEES.**

4 The following hourly fees shall be charged for court reservations at the Golden Gate Park
5 Tennis Center upon completion of the renovations described in Board of Supervisors File No. 180464,
6 subject to annual adjustment beginning with fiscal year 2018-2019 in accordance with Section 12.20:

<u>Weekdays (until 6:00 p.m.)</u>	<u>\$8</u>	<u>\$12</u>
<u>Weekday Evenings (after</u> <u>6:00 p.m.) and Weekends</u>	<u>\$9</u>	<u>\$15</u>
<u>Seniors (65 years and older)</u>	<u>\$4</u>	<u>\$6</u>
<u>Youth (17 years and under)</u>	<u>No fee.</u>	<u>Same as adults.</u>
<u>Leagues/Tournaments</u>	<u>\$18</u>	<u>\$18</u>

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18 League/Tournament rates shall apply to persons playing in organized group events such as
19 events through the United States Tennis Association. The Department General Manager or his or her
20 designee may also approve fees and charges for tennis-related services and items at the Golden Gate
21 Park Tennis Center other than those specifically listed in this Section 12.41, based on prevailing rates
22 for those services and items at comparable facilities in the Bay Area.

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24 Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
25 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
2 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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4 Section 5. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
5 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
6 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
7 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment
8 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under
9 the official title of the ordinance.
