Ordinance amending the Park Code to permit the Recreation and Park Department General Manager to set all golf course fees and charges other than resident rates and certain tournament rates by flexible pricing based on certain factors; increase the allowable flexible pricing discount that is available to residents; establish a resident rate for the Gleneagles Golf Course equal to the current rate plus \$2 per nine holes; authorize automatic annual cost of living increases for all resident rates and tournament rates; create a \$2 per nine hole fee for each golf course except Gleneagles Golf Course to fund special maintenance repairs or course improvements; expand the Harding Park advance booking fee to all other golf courses; and, further, affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 180582 and is incorporated herein by reference. The Board affirms this determination.

Section 2. The Park Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 12.12, 12.12.1, 12.12.2, 12.12.3, 12.12.4, 12.12.5, 12.12.6, and 12.20 to read as follows:

SEC. 12.12. GOLF FEES – GENERAL.

(a) **Authorization.** The Recreation and Park Department (the "Department") is hereby authorized to charge fees at the San Francisco municipal golf courses at Harding Park, Fleming, Lincoln Park, Sharp Park, Golden Gate Park, and McLaren Park (collectively, the "Golf Courses") in the manner and in conformance with the standards set forth herein. The Department and the Controller shall adjust golf fees in accordance with Section 12.20 of this Article *12*.

(b) Discount Fee Categories.

- (1) Bay Area Rates shall apply to residents of the following Bay Area counties who provide proof of residency: San Francisco (for residents without a valid Resident Golf Card), Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano and Sonoma.
- (1)(2) <u>Resident</u> Junior Rates shall apply to persons 17 years of age and under holding Resident Golf Cards.
- (2)(3) Resident Rates shall apply to persons holding Resident Golf Cards-per subsection (c) below.
- (3)(4) Resident Senior Rates shall apply to persons 65 years of age and above holding Resident Golf Cards per subsection (c) below.

(4)(5) Tournament Rates. Tournament Rates.

(A) Tournament Rates shall apply to persons playing in the Family Tournament held at Golden Gate Park, the City Championship held at Lincoln Park and Harding Park, and any other City-sponsored tournament approved by the Department General Manager or his or her designee. Residents shall pay Tournament Rates, not Resident Rates, for tournament play.

(B) A-Junior Tournament Rate are equal to, applicable to a group of 16 or more players aged 17 years and under, shall be 50% percent of the regular Tournament Rate, and for the applicable course. The Junior Tournament Rate shall apply to all players aged 17 years and under who are juniors participating in the Family Tournament held at Golden Gate Park, and or the City Championship held at Lincoln Park and Harding Park, and to all groups of 16 or more players aged 17 years and under with respect to any other City-sponsored tournaments that the Department may approve pursuant to subsection (b)(4)(A).

(5)(6) <u>Resident</u> Twilight Rates shall apply to rounds <u>by persons holding Resident</u>

<u>Golf Cards that</u> commenc<u>eing</u> no earlier than four hours before sunset, as determined by the Department.

(c) Resident Golf Cards.

- (1) The Department shall charge a fee of \$90.00 for a San Francisco Resident Golf Card, entitling the holder to discounts (Resident Rates) on the Golf Courses for two years from the date of issuance. Cards shall be available to San Francisco residents and/or San Francisco property owners only upon presentation of valid proof of residency or ownership.
- (2) The Department shall charge a fee of \$60.00 for a Pacifica Resident Golf Card entitling the holder to discounts (Resident Rates) at the Sharp Park Golf Course only, for two years from the date of issuance. Cards shall be available to Pacifica residents only upon presentation of valid proof of residency.
- (3) The Department shall charge a fee of \$25.00 for replacement of San Francisco Resident Golf Cards and Pacifica Resident Golf Cards.
- (4) If a San Francisco or Pacifica resident golf card application is returned to the applicant because the information on the application is incorrect or incomplete, there shall be an additional administrative fee of \$5.00.

(1) At Harding Park, McLaren Park, Sharp Park and Lincoln Park golf courses only,
Except where a particular fee or charge is specifically listed in Sections 12.12.1 through 12.12.6, the
Department's General Manager or his or her designee may impose a fee or charge for all other
golf-related services or items, and may approve temporary increases and/or decreases in those
fees and charges from time to time, based on one or more of the following factors: the type of use,
fluctuations in customer demand at particular times or on particular days or dates or as among
different Golf Courses, rates at comparable courses, and course conditions, at those three courses as
follows:

- (2) The Department General Manager or his or her designee may also apply the factors identified in subsection (d)(1) to approve the following temporary increases and/or decreases to any category of Resident Rates and any category of Tournament Rates:
 - (1) discounts of up to 50% not more than 25 percent for Resident Rates-greens fees;
- (2) increases of up to 50% percent for all non-resident fees and tTournament Ratesfees; and
 - (3) increases of up to 25% percent for Resident Rates resident Cardholder fees. (e) Motorized Golf Carts.
- (1) Subject to subsection (2) below, the rental fees for motorized golf carts shall be \$26.00 for earts at Lincoln Park, McLaren Park (Gleneagles) and Sharp Park, and \$40.00 for earts at Harding Park.
 - (2) There shall be no fee for a motorized golf cart for (A) persons paying Tournament Rates at any of the Golf Courses, and
 - (B) persons paying either Standard or Tournament Rates at Harding Park.
- (e)(f) Reservations._A \$1.00 per person fee shall be charged for reservations made by phone or online seven days or less in advance of the reserved tee time for any of the Golf Courses. The

Department may charge persons holding any category of Resident Golf Cards an additional reservation fee of \$15 per reservation for any advance reservation made between 8 and 30 days before the reserved tee time, and may charge persons who do not hold a Resident Golf Card an appropriate reservation fee based on the flexible pricing standards set forth in subsection (d)(1).

(f) Special Projects Maintenance Fee. The Department shall require each player at Harding Park, Fleming, Lincoln Park, Sharp Park, and Golden Gate Park who is above the age of 17 to pay an additional fee for that Golf Course of \$2 per nine holes, which the Department shall set aside in a separate fund for that Golf Course to pay for special maintenance repairs or course improvements.

SEC. 12.20. ADJUSTMENT OF FEES.

(a) Beginning with fiscal year 2003-2004, fees set forth in this Article 12, unless otherwise specified, may be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the relevant Consumer Price Index (CPI), as determined by the Controller.

No later than April 15th of each year, the Recreation and Parks Department shall submit its current fee schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new fee schedule for the following year.

No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the Board of Supervisors (i) reporting the new fee schedule, and (ii) identifying any fees that produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs of providing the services for which each fee is assessed and describing how such revenue is used by the Department or the City.

(b) <u>Through and until fiscal year 2017-18, all All</u> golf fees for San Francisco residents, juniors, seniors may be increased annually by the CPI, or up to \$1.00, upon approval of the Recreation and Park Commission. <u>and all All</u> golf fees for non-S.F. residents and tournaments may be increased by two times (2X) the CPI, or up to \$1.00, whichever is greater, upon approval of the Recreation and Park Commission. <u>Beginning with fiscal year 2018-19, all fees or charges specifically listed in Sections 12.12 through 12.12.6 will may be adjusted pursuant to subsection (a) based on the rates most recently approved by the Board of Supervisors or most recently adjusted under this Section 12.20, as applicable.</u>

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Ordinance amending the Park Code to permit the Recreation and Park Department General Manager to set all golf course fees and charges other than resident rates and certain tournament rates by flexible pricing based on certain factors; increase the allowable flexible pricing discount that is available to residents; establish a resident rate for the Gleneagles Golf Course equal to the current rate plus \$2 per nine holes; authorize automatic annual cost of living increases for all resident rates and tournament rates; create a \$2 per nine hole fee for each golf course except Gleneagles Golf Course to fund special maintenance repairs or course improvements; 6) expand the Harding Park advance booking fee to all other golf courses; and, further, affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

Article 12 of the Park Code sets rates to play on each of the City's golf courses, as well as discounted rates for persons holding resident golf cards or playing in tournaments. The Recreation and Park Department ("RPD") General Manager may authorize flexible pricing to temporarily increase or decrease these rates with a certain range – up to a 25% discount for residents – based on fluctuations in customer demand. Article 12 also includes rates for golf ball and golf cart rentals at certain courses, and an advance reservation fee at Harding Park. Unlike all other rates in Article 12, the rates for golf cannot be adjusted to reflect cost of living increases except upon approval of the Recreation and Park Commission.

Amendments to Current Law

The ordinance would allow the RPD General Manager to set all golf course rates (other than the resident rates and certain tournament rates) through flexible pricing, based on fluctuations in customer demand and other factors such as rates at comparable courses. The resident rates and tournament rates would stay the same, except that the allowable flexible pricing discount for residents would increase from 25% to 50%. RPD has not had a resident rate at McLaren Park (Gleneagles), so the resident rate at that course would be set at the current standard rate, plus \$2 per nine holes. RPD will also impose a \$2 fee per nine holes at each of the other golf courses, on each player who is above the age of 17, to fund course improvements and special maintenance repairs at the course in question.

The ordinance will allow resident cardholders to obtain advance reservations at all courses upon payment of a \$15 advance reservation fee. The \$15 fee is equal to the amount that RPD may charge for advance reservations at Harding Park, based on the existing code and cost of living increases that could have been authorized in previous years.

All of golf rates that are specifically listed in Article 12 (*i.e.*, all golf rates other than those set through flexible pricing) will be subject to the same cost of living increase procedures as the rest of Article 12. Specifically, the rates will be adjusted annually by the Controller, without need for approval by the Recreation and Park Commission.

Dear Chairperson Cohen and Supervisors,

San Francisco Public Golf Alliance is a pro-bono, non-profit public benefit organization with 6,500-plus members – men, women, seniors and juniors, across the full spectrum of race, preference, and socio-economy, who use and care deeply about golf and San Francisco's city-owned public courses. Our members include residents of every neighborhood and players at every public course in the city. Since 2007 we have closely followed, and on numerous occasions we and our members have appeared in large numbers in person and in writing before Your Board and several other local, state, and federal governmental agencies, in support of public golf and the public courses.

We come now to Your Board in support of the Rec & Park Department's proposed 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 Budget, and specifically the fee increases reflected in the proposed amendments to Park Code Sections 12.12 and 12.20, including an extension of "flexible pricing," increase in tournament fees, super-twilight rates, and imposition of a \$2-per-9-hole "Special Projects Maintenance Fee," as spelled-out at Section 12.12(f) of the proposed revised Park Code. Taken together these will mean the golfers will pay more and the City will gain substantial increased revenues from the golf courses, as projected at pages 3-4 of the Department's May 17, 2018 Staff Memo to the Rec & Park Commission. ²

On behalf or our members, San Francisco Public Golf Alliance supports this fee increase proposal because of the Department's commitment to now create a "Special Projects Maintenance Fee" and set-aside fund to address long-deferred maintenance and deteriorating infrastructure, which have been particularly problematic at Sharp, Lincoln, and Golden Gate. Deferred maintenance and deteriorating infrastructure at the city's recreational facilities have for years been identified by city residents, RPD staff, and the city's outside consultants as a major chronic problem.³

Even after application of the Special Maintenance Fee, the proposed new resident rates are very reasonable – in fact, significantly lower at all courses, except Harding, than at the surrounding public courses. And the Special Projects Maintenance Fee and set-aside represents a beginning step by the Department to finally address the longstanding deferred maintenance and infrastructure deterioration problems at the golf courses. So the San Francisco Public Golf Alliance is pleased to support the Department's 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 Budget, including the golf fee increase proposals and revision of Park Code Sections 12.12 and 12.20.
