9	MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does		
10	hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as a members of the Veterans		
11	Affairs Commission, pursuant to the provisions of Administrative Code, Sections 5.100, et		
12	seq., for the terms specified:		
13	George Ishikata, seat 2, succeeding Kelsey Campbell, resigned, must be an at-large		
14	appointment, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term January 31, 2021.		
15	Deborah Dacumos, seat 5, succeeding themself, term expired, must be an at-large		
16	appointment, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending January 31, 2022.		
17	Matthew Brauer, seat 10, succeeding Angela Jenkins, resigned, must be an at-large		
18	appointment, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending January 31, 2022.		
19	Margo Ellis (residency requirement waivered), seat 12, succeeding Dorothy Guy,		
20	resigned, must be an at-large appointment, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term		
21	ending January 31, 2021.		
22	FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:		
23	1. The membership of the Veterans Affairs Commission has a goal to be		
24	representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.

1	2.	Applicant Margo Ellis, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with	
2		experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Veterans Affairs	
3		Commission.	
4	3.	The Veterans Affairs Commission has attempted to fill the positions, for which	
5		Margo Ellis was nominated, with individuals who are City residents and who	
6		have the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to	
7		do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Margo Ellis is	
8		qualified to serve on the Veterans Affairs Commission.	
9	4.	After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is	
10		no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco, and who	
11		has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant,	
12		and who is willing to serve on the Veterans Affairs Commission at this time; and,

14	FURT	THER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement	
15	for Margo Ellis, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be		
16	found, pursuant to Charter, Section 4.101(a)(2), that requires person(s) appointed to boards,		
17	commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors		
18	to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
