[Administrative Code - Mayor's Fund for the Homeless and Navigation Partnerships Fund]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to reclassify the Mayor's Fund for the Homeless as a category eight fund to permit the accumulation of interest; to authorize the same fund to receive grants, gifts, and bequests of money; and to transfer administration of the Navigation Partnerships Fund from the Mayor's Office to the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Chapter 10 of the Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 10.100-106 and 10.100-160, to read as follows:

SEC. 10.100-106. MAYOR'S FUND FOR THE HOMELESS.

(a) Establishment of Fund. The Mayor's Fund for the Homeless is established as a category <u>sixeight</u> fund to receive all <u>private</u> donations, <u>grants</u>, <u>gifts</u>, <u>and bequests of money</u>, which may from time to time be <u>received byoffered to</u> the City and County of San Francisco for providing shelter, food, and other assistance for the homeless.

(b) **Use of the Fund.** The fund is to be used exclusively for the purpose of providing food, shelter, *and* supportive services, *and other assistance for-to* the homeless and for costs

incurred for promotion of the fund. Funds which are donated for a specific project for the homeless shall be expended only for that project.

(c) Administration of Fund. The Director of the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, or *histhe Director's* designee, is authorized to administer the Mayor's Fund for the Homeless and to determine expenditures from the fund, in keeping with the *original*-intended uses of the fund. The *Director* or *histhe Director's* designee shall report regularly to the City's Local Homeless Coordinating Board on *giftsdeposits* to and expenditures from the fund.

### SEC. 10.100-160. THE NAVIGATION PARTNERSHIPS FUND.

(a) Establishment of Fund. The Navigation Partnerships Fund (the "Fund") is established to pay for navigation services provided by the City or contracted communitybased organizations. "Navigation services" provide low barrier-to-entry alternatives to shelter with the goal of moving homeless individuals off of the streets, providing case management and connection to social service benefits, with an ultimate goal of stabilizing these individuals in housing placements in San Francisco or *returning them to family and friends through the Homeward Bound program administered by the Human Services Agencyotherwise resolving their homelessness*. The Fund is a category eight fund, authorized to receive private donations, grants, gifts, and bequests of money which may be offered to the City to assist in the provision of navigation services.

\* \* \* \*

(c) Administration of Fund. The <u>Mayor's OfficeDepartment of Homelessness and</u> <u>Supportive Housing</u> shall administer the Fund-<u>in consultation with the Human Services Agency and</u> <u>the Department of Public Health</u>. (d) **Reporting Requirement.** The *Mayor's OfficeDepartment of Homelessness and Supportive Housing* shall report at least annually to the Board of Supervisors and the Local Homeless Coordinating Board on private donations, grants, gifts, and bequests of money to and expenditures from the Fund.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 3. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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#### LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Administrative Code - Mayor's Fund for the Homeless and Navigation Partnerships Fund]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to reclassify the Mayor's Fund for the Homeless as a category eight fund to permit the accumulation of interest; to authorize the same fund to receive grants, gifts, and bequests of money; and to transfer administration of the Navigation Partnerships Fund from the Mayor's Office to the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.

#### Existing Law

Section 10.100-106 of Chapter 10 of the Administrative Code establishes the Mayor's Fund for the Homeless as a category six fund to receive donations received by the City and County of San Francisco for providing shelter, food, and other assistance to the homeless. A category six fund does not allow for the accumulation of interest earned on the principal to be credited to the fund.

Section 10.100-160 of Chapter 10 of the Administrative Code establishes the Navigation Partnerships Fund to pay for navigation services provided by the City or contracted community based organizations. Navigation services provide low barrier-to-entry alternatives to shelter with the goal of stabilizing individuals in housing placements. Currently, the Navigation Partnerships Fund is administered by the Mayor's Office, in consultation with the Human Services Agency and the Department of Public Health.

#### Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would reclassify the Mayor's Fund for the Homeless as a category eight fund, permitting the fund to be credited with any interest earned on the principal. The proposed ordinance would also allow the fund to receive grants, gifts, and bequests of money.

The proposed ordinance would also transfer administration of the Navigation Partnerships Fund from the Mayor's Office to the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing.

#### Background Information

In 2016, the Board of Supervisors enacted legislation creating the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing. The Department is charged with managing and directing all programs and services for homeless persons in the City, including street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing, and permanent supportive housing.
