21	<u>SEC. 5.10</u>	-1. CREATION OF COMMITTEE.
22	<u>The Board</u>	l of Supervisors ("Board") hereby establishes the Cannabis Oversight Committee
23	<u>("Committee").</u>	
24		
25	SEC. 5.10	-2. DEFINITIONS.

1	Terms not defined in this Article X shall have the meaning attributed to them in Police Code	
2	<u>Section 1602.</u>	
3		
4	SEC. 5.10-3. PURPOSE.	
5	In 2018, the City enacted Police Code Article 16 to comprehensively regulate Commercial	
6	Cannabis activities, including the implementation of an Equity Program to promote equitable	
7	ownership and employment opportunities in the Cannabis industry by lowering barriers for those hit	
8	hardest by the War on Drugs. The purpose of the Committee is to 1) convene representatives of	
9	Cannabis Business operators, workers, patients, and other key stakeholders in the Cannabis industry to	
10	oversee the Office of Cannabis' implementation of Police Code Article 16 by evaluating data on the	
11	industry's growth; and 2) provide guidance and recommendations to the Board on amendments to local	
12	laws and regulations, including those governing the Equity Program, to facilitate socially responsible	
13	growth of this new industry by creating living wage jobs and economic opportunities consistent with the	
14	Board's intent in adopting Police Code Article 16.	
15		
16	SEC. 5.10-4. MEMBERSHIP.	
17	The Committee shall consist of nine voting members and five non-voting members, as follows	
18	(seats 1 through 5 being non-voting members):	
19	(a) Seat 1 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Public Health or the Director's	
20	<u>designee.</u>	
21	(b) Seat 2 shall be held by the Chief of the Police Department or the Chief's designee.	
22	(c) Seat 3 shall be held by the Director of the Department of Building Inspection or the	
23	Director's designee.	
24	(d) Seat 4 shall be held by the Director of the Planning Department or the Director's designee.	
25		

1	(e) Seat 5 shall be held by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District or
2	the Superintendent's designee, which may include a Member of the Board of Education. The
3	Superintendent is not required to hold this seat or appoint a designee, but shall be invited to do so.
4	(f) Seat 6 shall be held by an Owner of a Cannabis Business permitted through the Equity
5	Program, appointed by the Board.
6	(g) Seat 7 shall be held by the operator of a Cannabis Cultivation, Manufacturing, or
7	distribution business with fewer than 20 employees at the time of appointment, appointed by the Board.
8	(h) Seat 8 shall be held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis
9	business labor force, appointed by the Board.
10	(i) Seat 9 shall held by a representative of organized labor who works with the Cannabis
11	delivery service labor force, appointed by the Board.
12	(j) Seat 10 shall be held by an Owner of a Storefront Cannabis Retailer, appointed by the
13	<u>Board.</u>
14	(k) Seat 11 shall be held by a person who lived for at least five years (between 1971-2009) in
15	San Francisco census tracts where at least 17% of the households had incomes at or below the poverty
16	level, appointed by the Board.
17	(1) Seat 12 shall be held by a person with demonstrated subject matter expertise on the State of
18	California's Cannabis laws and regulations, appointed by the Board.
19	(m) Seat 13 shall be held by a person with significant experience in workforce and economic
20	development, appointed by the Board.
21	(n) Seat 14 shall be held by a person who has been a Medicinal Cannabis patient or Medicinal
22	Cannabis consumer for at least five years, with an extensive history advocating for Medicinal Cannabis
23	patients or involvement in implementing and running a Cannabis compassionate use program in
24	compliance with the Compassionate Use Act of 1996, appointed by the Board.

1	SEC. 5.10-5. ORGANIZATION AND TERMS OF OFFICE.	
2	(a) Voting members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the Board.	
3	Any vacancy in Seats 6 through 14 on the Committee shall be filled by the Board. Voting members may	
4	serve multiple terms.	
5	(b) Service on the Committee is voluntary and members shall receive no compensation from the	
6	City, except that the members in Seats 1 through 4 may, if City employees, receive their regular City	
7	salaries for time spent on the Committee.	
8	(c) Any member in Seats 6 through 14 who misses three regular meetings of the Committee	
9	within a six-month period without the express approval of the Committee at or before each missed	
10	meeting shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee 10 days after the third unapproved	
11	absence. The Committee shall inform the Clerk of the Board of any such resignation.	
12	(d) All City departments, commissions, boards, and agencies shall cooperate with the	
13	Committee in the performance of its functions. City departments shall respond within 30 days to	
14	reasonable requests for information submitted by the Committee relevant to its ability to discharge its	
15	powers and duties, provided that the disclosure of such information shall not be required where it	
16	would violate Federal or State law.	
17	(e) The Office of Cannabis shall prepare and submit to the Committee a report as set forth in	
18	Administrative Code Section 2A.240.	
19	(f) The Office of Cannabis shall provide administrative and policy support for the Committee.	
20		
21	SEC. 5.10-6. POWERS AND DUTIES.	
22	The Committee shall have the power and duty to:	
23	(a) Oversee the Office of Cannabis' implementation and enforcement of City laws and	
24	regulations relating to Cannabis, by convening stakeholders, gathering data, and advising the Board	
25	and the Mayor.	

1	(b) Gather and evaluate data, and report to the Board and Mayor, regarding the effectiveness
2	of City laws and regulations relating to the Police Code Section 1604 Equity Program in fostering
3	equitable access to participation in the Cannabis industry and providing assistance to communities
4	unfairly burdened by the War on Drugs.
5	(c) Gather and evaluate data, and report to the Board and Mayor, on the overall health and
6	stability of the Cannabis industry in San Francisco and make recommendations on possible ways the
7	City can help the industry grow and prosper.
8	(d) Recommend to the Board modifications to City laws and regulations relating to Cannabis,
9	including recommendations to maximize the creation of living wage jobs and economic opportunities
10	for communities hit hardest by the War on Drugs. Where appropriate, the Committee's
11	recommendations shall include draft legislation or regulations.
12	
13	SEC. 5.10-7. MEETINGS AND PROCEDURES.
14	(a) The Committee shall hold its inaugural meeting not more than 30 days after the Board has
15	appointed at least eight members to the Committee. There shall be at least ten days' notice of the
16	inaugural meeting. Following the inaugural meeting, the Committee shall hold a regular meeting not
17	less than five times per year until the sunset date set forth in Section 5.10-8.
18	(b) The Committee shall elect a Chair and officers for such other positions, if any, it chooses to
19	create. The Committee may establish bylaws and rules for its organization and procedures.
20	
21	SEC. 5.10-8. SUNSET DATE.
22	Unless the Board by ordinance extends the term of the Committee, this Article X shall expire by
23	operation of law, and the Committee shall terminate, three years after the effective date of the
24	ordinance in Board File No. 180800 enacting this Article. In that event, after the sunset date, the City
25	Attorney shall cause this Article X to be removed from the Administrative Code.

1 2 Section 2. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by revising Section 2A.240 to 3 read as follows: 4 SEC. 2A.240. OFFICE OF CANNABIS. 5 (a) Establishment. The Mayor shall establish an Office of Cannabis under the direction 6 7 of the City Administrator to oversee the implementation of laws and regulations governing 8 cannabis in San Francisco. The City Administrator shall appoint a Director of the Office of 9 Cannabis. The Office of Cannabis shall include such officers and employees as are authorized pursuant to the budgetary and fiscal provisions of the Charter. 10 (b) Duties and functions. 11 12 13 (7) By no later than six months after the inaugural meeting of the Cannabis Oversight 14 Committee ("Committee") established in Chapter 5, Article X of the Administrative Code, and 15 biannually thereafter, the Director shall produce and submit to the Committee a report evaluating the growth of the City's cannabis industry. This report shall include, but need not be limited to, the 16 17 following information, provided that the gathering or the disclosure of such information is not required where it would violate Federal or State law, and further provided that any reports derived from the 18 19 data do not identify specific individuals: 20 (A) The total number of permits the Office of Cannabis granted in the prior 12 21 months in each permit category listed in Police Code Section 1607. 22 (B) The total revenue, including tax revenue, permitted Cannabis Businesses 23 generated in the prior 12 months. (C) The total costs the City incurred in processing Cannabis Business Permit 24 25 applications in the prior 12 months.

1	(D) The total costs Cannabis Business Permit applicants incurred in the prior
2	12 months, associated with preparation, submission, and processing of Cannabis Business Permit
3	applications.
4	(E) The average time for Cannabis Business Permit processing in the prior 12
5	months, measured from the date the Office of Cannabis receives an application for a Cannabis
6	Business Permit through the date the Office of Cannabis grants or denies a permit.
7	(F) The total number and length of time in operation of permitted Cannabis
8	Businesses that operated for 30 days or more in the prior 12 months, categorized by each permit
9	category listed in Police Code Section 1607.
10	(G) The total number of employees directly employed by permitted Cannabis
11	Businesses that operated for 30 days or more in the prior 12 months, categorized by job type or
12	<u>classification.</u>
13	(H) The rate of pay and benefits of employees directly employed by permitted
14	Cannabis Businesses that operated for 30 days or more in the prior 12 months, categorized by job type
15	or classification.
16	(I) The total number of individuals in the City whose Cannabis convictions have
17	been expunged in the prior 12 months.
18	(J) If available, the total number of permitted Cannabis Business owners,
19	operators, and employees categorized by race and sex. The Director may request but not require
20	Cannabis Business owners and operators to disclose such information. The Director may not consider
21	such information in making any permit determination.
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23	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
24	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Boa	
2	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.	
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4	Section 4. Scope of the Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of	
5	Supervisors intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections,	
6	articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the	
7	Municipal Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board	
8	amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that	
9	appears under the official title of the ordinance.
