Motion appointing Bryant Duong (residency requirement waived) and Stephen Tennis, terms ending November 2, 2019, and Sam Dennison and Jonathan Bonato, terms ending January 31, 2021, to the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee.

MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee, pursuant to the provisions in the Business and Tax Regulations Code, Article 12-A, for the terms specified:

Bradford Paul (residency requirement waived), seat 5, succeeding himself, term expired, must have expertise in affordable housing or tenant protection and anti-displacement policies and strategies, and have familiarity with the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending August 2, 2019;

Sam Dennison, seat 1, new appointment, must be held either by a person with expertise in job creation or workforce development, or by a person who is a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending January 31, 2021;

Bryant Duong (residency requirement waived), seat 2, new appointment, must be held either by a person who represents a community-based organization or provides direct services to the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area, or by a person who is a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending November 2, 2019;

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Jonathan Bonato seat 3, new appointment must shall be held either by a person with expertise on homelessness, transitional age youth, or supportive housing, and familiarity with the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area, or by a person who is a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending January 31, 2021;

Stephen Tennis, seat 4, new appointment, must be held by a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area with expertise or life experience involving homelessness or affordable housing, for the unexpired portion of a four-year term ending November 2, 2019; and, be it

FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- The membership of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 2. Applicant Bryant Duong, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely qualifies him to serve on the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee.
- 3. The Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee has attempted to fill the position, for which Bradford Paul was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Bradford Paul is qualified to serve on the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco, and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is

I was an educator for 25 years before moving back to the TL to live and work at Faithful Fools which is dedicated to building community among people who might not otherwise meet if it were not for having a place and activities that invite dissimilar people to gather and work together.

I am involved locally, from working with the homeless at the Sanctuary Shelter on weekends to having served on the HOA of Soma Grand and am heavily involved in the large, local community that attends the Ralph Gracie gym. I am motivated to run for this commission seat because I believe I can represent the homeless community, and because I am a homeowner in this area. Since starting an education and resume program at Sanctuary Shelter, I have had many in-depth conversations with the homeless residents on their needs and challenges in the evolving neighborhood. I do not think they are currently fairly represented in the ongoing developments. I currently mentor a young female entrepreneur who was previously the victim of human trafficking and was recently in danger of becoming homeless (I loaned her funds to prevent this).

I am a female entrepreneur in scientific equipment (co-founded a small business called Sigray, Inc) and currently serve as the company's Vice President of Operations. I am experienced in developing tools and strategies to improve communication pathways.

Civic Activities:

Started a weekend tutoring and resume workshop program at Sanctuary Shelter on 8th street, with backing and support of the Adult Education Center and Episcopal Church. Program runs every other weekend and turnout is typically 10 residents and 10 tutors. Board member of the San Francisco Young Democrats. Volunteered as Social Chair for the SOMA Grand HOA for 2 years. Currently a volunteer as a mentee for low-income entrepreneurs of color at Sky's the Limit. Previously volunteered as a tutor at the Potrero House (when living in that area) and for the SF Food Bank.

I am a formerly homeless, HIV positive gay male residing in San Francisco. Ten years ago, I was a Care Not Cash recipient and recovering from long term addiction to crystal meth. While homeless, I stayed at various SRO hotels including the Bristol, Drake, Civic Center and Jefferson Hotels. In 2008, with the help of organizations like Tenderloin Health, AIDS Housing Alliance, Catholic Charities, Positive Resource Center, and Department of Rehabilition, I was able to overcome homelessness and secure work at various supportive housing properties serving low income, disabled and formerly homeless people. Today, I own a limited equity housing cooperative apartment in Chinatown/North Beach and enjoy working in the Tenderloin.

I am the John Stewart Company Property Manager for the Coronado Hotel in the Tenderloin, a challenging master lease SRO hotel serving formerly homeless tenants, operated by Community Awareness and Treatment Services. Prior to that, I worked in various roles as either a Desk Clerk or Occupancy and Compliance Specialist at many locations in the Tenderloin, including Vincent Hotel (Property Manager), Cadillac Hotel, Elm Hotel, Crosby Hotel, Lyric Hotel, Mentone Hotel, Railton Place, 321 Turk, 555 Ellis Family Housing, Hillsdale Hotel, Bayanihan House, Isabel Hotel, Knox SRO, Plaza Apartments, Canon Barcus, Canon Kip and Bishop Swing. In 2015, I wrote a Project Based Voucher HUD VASH proposal for the Cadillac in response to an RFP from the SF Housing Authority, winning a 15 year contract for the property. In 2016, I helped write a winning response to a MOHCD RFQ for the Balboa Park Upper Yard project as the lead for Caritas Management, in partnership with Mission Housing Development Corporation, Related California, Instituto Familiar De La Raza, YMCA and others. I also assisted with the BMR lease up of Trinity Phase II in Mid Market a few years ago.

As an appointee of the Local Homeless Coordinating Board, I served on the Shelter Monitoring Committee as a general committee member, Vice Chair and Chair. I volunteered with Eviction Free San Francisco, helping to organize tenants and protest evictions at 1049 Market a few years ago. I am a friend of San Francisco Housing Action Coalition and a member of YIMBY ACTION. In the past, I also volunteered with Project Homeless Connect, National Night Out, Quesada Gardens Initiative, AIDS Housing Alliance, and San Francisco Community Land Trust.

Board Qualifications:

The Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Citizen's Advisory Committee (CAC) shall be an advisory body whose purpose is to make recommendations to the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, City Administrator, and Office of Economic and Workforce Development on policies and programs that mitigate the effects of development, bolster economic development, local employment, and community sustainability and seek to stabilize and protect existing tenants, community based organizations and small businesses in and around the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area.

The CAC shall be composed of five (5) members, appointed by the Board of Supervisors:

Seat 1 - shall be held either by a person with expertise in job creation or workforce development or by a person who is a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area.

Seat 2 - shall be held either by a person who represents a community-based organization or provides direct services to the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area, or by a person who is a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area.

Seat 3 - shall be held either by a person with expertise on homelessness, transitional age youth, or supportive housing, and familiarity with the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or

adjacent area, or by a person who is a resident of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area.

Seats 4 and 5 - shall be held by residents of the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area or adjacent area with expertise or life experience involving homelessness or affordable housing.

"Adjacent Area" shall mean the area in District 6, bounded on the southern side by 13th Street and Townsend Street.

(Ordinance No. 199-17 reduced the number of members from 11 to 5.)

The Rules Committee of the Board of Supervisors shall nominate each CAC member and the appointment of each nominee shall be confirmed by the full Board of Supervisors.

The terms of the members in office on the effective date of Ordinance No. 199-17 and whose seats were not eliminated, shall continue; provided that the terms in effect for Seats 1 and 3 shall end at noon on November 2, 2017; and the terms in effect for Seats 2, 4, and 5 shall end at noon on November 2, 2019. The Board shall appoint members to new terms, which shall commence on the expiration of the previous terms. All of the new terms shall end on January 31, 2021.

Report: Provide a report in March and October of each year to the Board of Supervisors regarding the implementation and execution of the Community Benefit Agreements called for under the Central Market Street and Tenderloin Area Payroll Expense Tax Exclusion. The report shall include, at minimum, a summary of the CAC's recommendations and votes regarding proposed Community Benefit Agreements, a summary of actions taken by the City Administrator in response to the CAC's recommendations, and a list of vacant seats on the CAC.
