Service Areas

Public Safety

• This program utilizes Community Guides to monitor street conditions, provide crime deterrence and evaluate qualify of life issues

Cleaning and Maintenance

 This service area includes a dispatch service available to CBD residents and property owners to address specific cleaning and safety issues

Parks and Greenspace

• This service area will maintain all greenspaces, parks, rain gardens, sidewalk landscaping, parklets, and street trees within the District's boundaries.

Communication and Development

• This program promotes ECCBD's properties and businesses through specially targeted programs and initiatives; additionally, it supports the creation and production of special events.

Management

• This service area includes at least three full-time staff to provide oversight of service contract, implement major projects, will staff the Board of Directors and Committees, and execute general day to day operations

Operations

• This service area will account for annual operational costs such as rent, utilities, insurance accounting, audit, and legal fees



BENCHMARKS

OEWD's staff reviewed the following budget related benchmarks for GRHCBD:

Benchmark 1 – Whether the variance between the budget amounts for each service category was within 10 percentage points from the management plan.


Benchmark 2 – Whether one percent (1.40%) of GRHCBD's actuals for Public Safety, one and forty hundredths percent (1.40%) for Cleaning and Maintenance, six and seventy-nine hundredths percent (6.79%) of actuals for Parks and Greenspace came from sources other than assessment revenue.

Benchmark 3 - Whether the variance between the budget amounts for each service category was within 10 percentage points from the actuals.

Benchmark 4 - Whether CBD is indicating the amount of funds carried over from the current fiscal year and designating projects to be spent in the upcoming fiscal year.





Management Plan vs. Annual Budgets






Assessment Revenue & Other Income

Conclusion

East Cut CBD has met 4 of 4 benchmarks placed on it through State code and the CBD's Management Agreement with the City:

- This particular CBD's management plan allocates general benefit in relation to special
 assessment dollars being used on a given service area. As a result, each service category
 has a different general benefit. This is because the CBD will maintain and service various
 parks within the District, including the new City Park. As parks and public realm have a
 large impact on general benefit, this was determined to be the most equitable way to
 accurately portray general benefit
- ECCBD has identified sources of general benefit such as grants, in-kind donations and even volunteer hours to meet the general benefit requirements
- On April 10, 2017, ECCBD's Owners' Association voted to rename the CBD from Greater Rincon Hill CBD to The East Cut CBD
- Maintained an active board of directors and several sub committees



The East Cut CBD will maintain 5 parks and open spaces (current and upcoming)










Vacant Retail Activations











POPOS Activations










TRANSBAY REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT AREA
