Resolution retroactively authorizing the Office of the District Attorney to accept and expend an in-kind gift estimated at \$50,000 from the Urban Institute for data analytics and research support, from January 1, 2017, through June 15, 2018.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Sentencing Commission, an initiative of the District Attorney's Office, was created to analyze sentencing patterns, solutions and outcomes; and to provide recommendations to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors that lead to a reduction in incarceration, lower recidivism rates, safer communities, and ensure that victims are made whole; and the San Francisco Sentencing Commission is committed to data driven decision making and seeks technical assistance in creating a data dashboard that lends itself to undertaking reliable analyses of subsequent criminal justice contact in San Francisco, as well as assistance in performing those analyses; and

WHEREAS, The mission of the Urban Institute, and the MacArthur Foundation Safety and Justice Challenge is providing support to local leaders from across the country who are determined to tackle one of the greatest drivers of jail utilization; and

WHEREAS, The Urban Institute has proposed to provide in-kind data analytics assistance and research as it pertains to the development of a justice data dashboard valued at \$50,000.; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors approves the in-kind gift estimated at \$50,000 and authorizes the Office of the District Attorney on behalf of the San Francisco Sentencing Commission to accept the technical assistance from the Urban Institute.
