[Administrative Code - Dissolving Inactive Advisory Bodies - Reauthorizing and Extending Sunset Date of Workforce Community Advisory Committee and Committee on City Workforce Alignment]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to dissolve the Wage Theft Task Force and Surplus Property Citizens' Advisory Committee; and to reauthorize the Workforce Community Advisory Committee and the Committee on City Workforce Alignment, and extend their sunset dates to June 30, 2019.

## **Existing Law**

Ordinance No. 102-12 established the Wage Theft Task Force. By the terms of that ordinance, the Wage Theft Task Force sunset on December 31, 2013, but the ordinance establishing the Task Force has not been removed from the Administrative Code.

Ordinance No. 93-04 established the Surplus Property Citizens' Advisory Committee to make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors regarding the use of surplus City property. The Clerk of the Board has determined that the Surplus Property Citizens' Advisory Committee has not met since April 29, 2008.

Ordinance No. 84-14 established the Workforce Community Advisory Committee to advise the Workforce Investment San Francisco and the Committee on City Workforce Alignment. The Clerk of the Board has determined that the Workforce Community Advisory Committee has not met since February 21, 2017.

Ordinance No. 84-14 established the Committee on City Workforce Alignment and provided that the Committee would sunset on July 12, 2017.

## Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance would dissolve the Wage Theft Task Force and the Surplus Property Citizens' Advisory Committee.

This ordinance would also extend the sunset dates of the Workforce Community Advisory Committee and the Committee on City Workforce Alignment to June 30, 2019.

## **Background Information**

Rule 2.21 of the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order requires the Clerk of the Board to determine and identify each year every subordinate body that has not met at least once every
