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Resolution authorizing the Office of Civic Engagement and Immigrant Affairs to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$100,000 from the California State Controller's Office to support San Francisco's Local Update of Census Addresses efforts and

outreach activities related to the 2020 Census for the project period of November 1,

[Accept and Expend Grant - State Controller's Office, California State 2020 Census Grant -

Local Update of Census Addresses Program - \$100,0001

2018, through June 30, 2019.

WHEREAS. The decennial census is mandated by the U.S. Constitution and requires that every person living in the United States be counted every ten years; and

WHEREAS, Census data and information are used to determine federal funding and representation each decade; and

WHEREAS, The 2020 Census will be the first all-digital census count, relying heavily on internet responses; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco has one of the highest Hard-to-Count populations in the State and nation, in addition to language and digital divide barriers; and

WHEREAS. One of the most important early programs to improve census response rates is the Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA) Program, which provides tribal, state and local governments the only opportunity to review and comment on the housing and group quarters mailing addresses used by the U.S. Census Bureau to conduct the 2020 Census; and

WHEREAS, Full participation by California cities and counties is essential to identifying efforts and omissions in the Census Bureau's address lists; and

WHEREAS, The State of California FY2017-2018 Governor's Budget established an incentive fund to encourage cities and counties to participate in the LUCA program and to help mitigate some of the cost of that participation; and

WHEREAS, The Office of Civic Engagement & Immigrant Affairs (OCEIA), a department of the General Services Agency, under the City Administrator, oversaw the 2010 Decennial Census and was reauthorized by Mayoral Executive Directive 18-01 signed on March 6, 2018, to oversee all aspects of the 2020 Census; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco registered with the U.S. Census Bureau to participate in the LUCA program before the December 15, 2017, deadline, and subsequently submitted required materials and responses to the Census Bureau in June 2018; and

WHEREAS, The California State Department of Finance determined on August 16, 2018, that the City and County of Can Francisco has met the applicable benchmarks to receive the LUCA Incentive Fund and requested that the State Controller's Office (SCO) issue the award in the amount of \$100,000; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Office of Civic Engagement & Immigrant Affairs to accept and expend \$100,000 in funds allocated by the State of California Controller's Office for the purpose of conducting 2020 Census related local address verification, public awareness, motivation, outreach and education activities, including those of the San Francisco Complete Count Committee; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Office of Civic Engagement & Immigrant Affairs will make every effort to include the participation of all San Francisco communities and residents in the 2020 Census to ensure an accurate, fair and inclusive count of San Francisco's population by the Census Bureau; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Executive Director of the Office of Civic Engagement & Immigrant Affairs to execute any documents

required to enter into this grant, including any applications, contracts, agreements amendments, augmentations or extensions thereto, and to adhere to the requirements of the State of California for the 2020 Census and all conditions specified in the grant agreement.

OPPORTUNITY TO RECEIVE STATE FUNDS FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WHO PARTICIPATE IN THE LUCA PROGRAM

The census is used to determine federal funding and representation each decade. The 2020 Census will rely heavily on internet responses for the first time. One of the most important programs to improve census response rates is called the Local Update of Census Addresses Program (LUCA). LUCA provides local governments an opportunity to review the housing and group quarters mailing addresses used by the Census Bureau to conduct the 2020 Census. Full participation by California cities and counties will identify errors in the Census Bureau's address lists and improve the count of California residents.

The 2017-18 Governor's Budget establishes an incentive fund to encourage cities and counties to participate in the LUCA program and to help mitigate some of the cost of that participation. The Department of Finance administers the LUCA incentive fund. The amount each jurisdiction receives is based on the housing activity (building, demolitions, and annexations) from April 1, 2010 to January 1, 2017 using estimates from the Demographic Research Unit. Jurisdictions that have experienced a disaster area declaration since 2010 will be eligible for additional funding.

Your jurisdiction is eligible to receive a minimum of \$ 100,000. This award amount may increase based on the overall level of LUCA participation.

There are three requirements to receive an award:

- 1. Local governments must register to participate in the LUCA program with the U.S. Census Bureau. **The deadline to register is December 15, 2017**. If you cannot locate your forms, e-mail the Census Bureau immediately at geo.2020.luca@census.gov.
- 2. To receive the incentive, local governments must participate in the LUCA Program and submit required materials to the Census Bureau. Materials will be sent out in the first quarter of 2018.
- 3. Local governments must request incentive funds from the Department of Finance (see attachment). Jurisdictions that have registered for LUCA with the Census Bureau will receive instructions on how to request incentive funds in early 2018.

The Department of Finance's Demographic Research Unit will be able to provide some technical assistance to local governments. The Demographic Research Unit will also verify Census Bureau addresses for selected statewide lists, such as mobile home parks, certain group quarters, and employer-provided housing.

Staff in your Geographic Information System or Planning Department may have already received materials and training regarding LUCA. However, registration for LUCA can only come from the highest-elected official for your jurisdiction. Further information on LUCA is available at https://www.census.gov/geo/partnerships/luca.html.

California LUCA Incentive - Frequently Asked Questions

In recognition of the importance of the 2020 Census Local Update of Census Addresses (LUCA) program, California has established an incentive fund to encourage cities and counties to participate in the program and to help mitigate some of the cost of that participation.

The questions and answers below deal only with the California LUCA Incentive and will periodically be updated. A general FAQ on the LUCA program is online at www2.census.gov/geo/pdfs/partnerships/luca/2020LUCA FAQ.pdf

Why is California providing this incentive?

The population counts from each decennial census are used to reapportion seats in the House of Representatives. Representation means power and California is in danger of losing a seat in Congress. California has more "hard-to-count" populations than any other state and will likely be undercounted in the 2020 Census. If that happens, California's fair representation in the U.S. Congress will be in danger.

Equally as important, many federal programs distribute funds to the state and local governments based upon the results of the decennial census and the surveys that follow it. Current estimates of federal funding to California show a potential loss of \$18,000 over the next ten years for each resident missed. An impact that could add up to millions of dollars lost.

LUCA is the only opportunity local governments will have to review the Census mailing list for completeness.

Who will be administering the Incentive fund?

The California Department of Finance, Demographic Research Unit will administer the LUCA Incentive fund. They can be reached via e-mail at ficalpop@dof.ca.gov

Who is eligible to receive the LUCA Incentive?

Local city or county governments must complete three steps to receive an award:

- Register to participate in the LUCA program with the U.S. Census Bureau. The

- 2. Participate in the LUCA Program and return required materials to the Census Bureau.
- 3. Send your request for incentive funds to the Department of Finance within 30 days of your response to the Census Bureau. The Department of Finance will confirm your participation with the Census Bureau.

California LUCA Incentive - Frequently Asked Questions

How much money will each city/county get?

A minimum of \$7,500 will be available for each jurisdiction that applies for the incentive and participates in the program. The award amounts may be more subject to the overall level of LUCA participation. Additional funds may be available for jurisdictions which experienced a disaster area declaration in 2017. Our county had a wildfire in 2016. Can we get additional funding?

No, the housing unit change from disasters prior to January 1, 2017 has already been reported to the Department of Finance and are, therefore, already accounted for in the award calculation. The additional funding mentioned above is to account for the large housing unit changes that jurisdictions have due to the wildfires and mudslides in 2017. These changes represent a significant change in housing that was not included in the award calculation.

How are the award amounts determined?

The amount of the incentive each jurisdiction receives is based on the housing activity (building, demolitions and annexations) from April 1, 2010 to January 1, 2017 using estimates from the Demographic Research Unit.

How does a city or county request the incentive award?

The LUCA liaison designated during registration with the Census Bureau for each city and county must complete the online LUCA Incentive Fund Request Form. Only the official LUCA liaison may request the award on behalf of the jurisdiction. Instructions on how to request incentive funds will be sent in spring 2018. The request form is online at https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/LUCA2020.

Please note that the letter sent to highest elected officials on November 13, 2017 had a **SAMPLE** of the information that will be needed when you file your request. This is NOT the final form. Do NOT use this form to request your incentive award.

When should a city or county request the Incentive?

The LUCA liaison for the jurisdiction needs to request the incentive funds within 30 days of submitting their LUCA response to the U.S. Census Bureau.

California LUCA Incentive - Frequently Asked Questions

What information will be needed to request the incentive?

The request form may include: LUCA liaison contact information; format chosen for the LUCA materials; when LUCA materials were received; when the jurisdiction's response was returned; estimate of the number of hours spent on participation; estimate of the costs; how many LUCA addressed were changed; what local sources were used in the comparison; how the availability of the incentive affected your decision to participate in LUCA; and incentive payment information.

When will we receive our funds?

The Department of Finance will issue the incentive award within 90 days of receiving the completed online LUCA Incentive Fund Request Form and confirmation from the Census Bureau that the local jurisdiction fully participated in the LUCA program.

Please note that the letter sent to highest elected officials on November 13, 2017 had a **SAMPLE** of the information that will be needed when you file your request. This is NOT the final form. Although you may have sent in the form, this does not constitute a request for the award. This form will not be used to request an incentive award.

Do the incentive funds have to be used to pay for LUCA activities?

No, it is anticipated that the funds will be distributed after the LUCA activities have been completed. There are no limits or requirements on how the jurisdiction can use the funds.

If a county has been designated as the LUCA liaison on behalf of one of its cities, can they request the incentive for that city?

Yes, if the city designated the county as their LUCA liaison or if the city selected "deferred to a higher government" when they registered, the county may request the funds designated for that city.

Our city designated the county as our liaison. However, the county has asked us to do an in-the-field review of selected anomalies found in their LUCA process. Since we are doing some of the work, will the city be able to request a portion of the incentive award?

The Department of Finance will not split the award between the city and the county. As the designated LUCA liaison, the county will receive the award. However, there is no criteria that says the county and the city cannot work together to share those funds once the county has received them.

State of California LUCA Incentive Program - Jurisdiction Minimum Awards

In recognition of the importance of the Local Update of Census Addresses or LUCA Program, the State of California has established an incentive fund to encourage cities and counties to participate in the program and to help mitigate some of the cost of that participation.

The amount of the incentive each jurisdiction receives is based on the housing activity (building, demolitions and annexations) from April 1, 2010 to January 1, 2017 using estimates from the Demographic Research Unit. Jurisdictions which experienced a disaster area declaration since 2010 will be eligible for additional funding. A minimum of \$7,500 will be available for each jurisdiction that applies for the incentive and participates in the program. The award amounts may be more subject to the overall level of LUCA participation.

The California Department of Finance will administer the LUCA incentive fund. To be eligible to receive the incentive, a local government must:

- 1. Register to participate in the LUCA program with the U.S. Census Bureau by December 15, 2017.
- 2. Participate in the LUCA Program and submit required materials provided to the Census Bureau (materials will be sent out in the first quarter of 2018).
- 3. Request incentive funds from the Department of Finance after they have sent their LUCA response to the Census Bureau. (Instructions will be sent to all jurisdictions who register as a LUCA participant.)

What Is LUCA?

The Local Update of Census Addresses Operation (LUCA) is a voluntary decennial census operation. LUCA is the only opportunity prior to the 2020 Census for tribal, state, and local governments (including the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico) to review and update the U.S. Census Bureau's residential address list for their jurisdiction. The Census Bureau relies on a complete and accurate address list to reach every living quarters and associated population for inclusion in the census. The Census Address List Improvement Act of 1994 (Public Law 103-430) authorizes LUCA.

Active, functioning, legal governments are eligible to participate in LUCA, including:

- Federally recognized tribes with a reservation and/or off reservation trust lands.
- States.
- Counties.
- · Cities (incorporated places).
- Townships (minor civil divisions).

If your government lacks the resources to participate in LUCA, you can arrange for a higher level of government, such as a county; or an organization, such as a regional planning agency or council of governments, to conduct your address review.

Why Participate in LUCA?

The accuracy and completeness of the address list is critical to the accuracy and completeness of the decennial census. Participating in LUCA can help ensure an accurate census for your community.

Although the primary purpose of the decennial census is to apportion seats in the U.S. House of Representatives, census data are used to:

- Distribute federal funds for over 1,000 programs administered by 26 federal agencies to tribal, state, and local governments.
- Provide statistical support for grant applications that fund community and regional development, education, agriculture, energy, and environmental programs, as well as other needed community improvements and enhancements.
- Help your community plan for future needs.

What Is New for LUCA?

- Pre-LUCA activities, such as the on-going Geographic Support System (GSS) Partnership Program, provide more opportunities to submit address information and receive non-Title 13 feedback.
- New streamlined participation through the full address list review.
- Online viewing availability for the Census Bureau housing unit counts by census block for your jurisdiction starting in January 2017.
- Ease of use with standard data formats for viewing the Census Bureau's digital address list (Excel [.xlsx] and Comma Delimited Text [.csv]).
- Availability of the Census Bureau Geographic Update Partnership Software, a self-contained Geographic Information System (GIS) tool.
- Access to comprehensive data that include residential structure latitude/longitude coordinates and ungeocoded census residential addresses.
- Digital participants may submit residential structure coordinates as part of their address updates.

Because LUCA participants receive only addresses inside their jurisdictional boundaries for review and update, you may not be able to view your entire address list if your boundaries are incorrect. In January 2017, the HEO, TC, Governor, and other contacts that the Census Bureau has associated with each government will receive a LUCA notification package. The package includes information about LUCA and a *Contact Information*



Update your Address List with information needed for LUCA.

Unit Designation: LUCA **requires** that each record include unit identifiers (e.g., Apt 1, Apt 2, Unit A, Unit B). Basic street address and the individual unit designation should be provided for multiunit buildings.

Residential Status: LUCA accepts only **residential** address updates.

ZIP Code: A ZIP Code in a mailing address is useful to the Census Bureau.



The Census Bureau defines geocoding as assigning a state, county, census tract, and census block number to an address. Used in conjunction with the Address Count List, the Census Geocoder allows you to compare your digital address list to the Census Bureau's count of addresses by census block. You can focus your address review on the census blocks with the greatest address count differences between your address list and the Census Bureau's. Develop your address review strategy.

To conduct your address review, consider your time, staff, and available local address information. If a complete review is not possible, focus your review on these areas:

- Group quarters (e.g., college dorms, nursing homes, correctional facilities, etc.).
- Areas of new construction.
- E-911 address conversion areas.
- Single-family homes converted to multifamily homes, and vice versa.

- Warehouses converted to residential units.
- New mobile homes.
- Apartment buildings with irregular or missing numbering schemes for the individual units.
- Annexed land.
- Areas along governmental boundaries.
- Blocks with the greatest count differences between the Census Bureau's address block count and your address block count.

Highest Elected Official (HEO), Tribal Chair (TC), or Governor registers for LUCA.

In July 2017, the Census Bureau will mail the invitation letter and registration form to your HEO, TC, or Governor. This invitation package will include information about LUCA and a registration form for the HEO, TC, Governor, and the LUCA liaison (designated by the HEO, TC, or Governor) to complete and return to the Census Bureau for participation in LUCA.

Attend a LUCA training workshop or Webinar.

Training workshops will offer "hands-on" experience using the LUCA materials. Self-training aids and Webinars will be available online at the LUCA Web site. In addition, the 2020 Census Local Update of Census Addresses Operation (LUCA) Respondent Guide contains detailed instructions and examples for conducting your address and map review.

Review and update LUCA materials.

You have 120 calendar days from the receipt of your materials to conduct your address review and return your updates to the Census Bureau. We estimate that it will take between 16 to 672 hours to complete your address review and submit your updates, depending on your jurisdiction's size and number of changes.

Receive address feedback.

After validating LUCA submissions, the Census Bureau will provide address feedback on your LUCA updates.


