**SUBJECT: TERMINAL 1 - HARVEY MILK TERMINAL / ORDINANCE NO. 62-18
ACTION ITEM**

Dear Ms. Calvillo:

I am writing to update the San Francisco Board of Supervisors (the “Board”) and Mayor London N. Breed on steps taken by the San Francisco International Airport (SFO) to implement new Administrative Code Sec. 2A.174, “*NAMING TERMINAL 1 OF THE SAN FRANCISCO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT FOR HARVEY MILK*,” added by Ordinance No. 62-18.

On August 6, 2018, the San Francisco Arts Commission approved a plan that included two pieces of public art in the terminal – a three-story Atrium Art Opportunity on the departures level and a curbside Light Installation Opportunity on the arrivals level. These opportunities are described in the Arts Commission’s Call for Artists process as works inspired by Harvey Milk.

On October 9, 2018, the Airport held a press event to unveil design plans for the façade signage at Terminal 1/The Harvey B. Milk Terminal (T1/Milk), the threshold signage at the garage and AirTrain entrances, the terminal temporary construction wall photo crowdsourcing project, the pre- and post-security Milk Inglenook museum project, a building dedication plaque, and two pieces of terminal public art concepts as described above. I have included the renderings as an attachment for your information.

The content crowdsourcing campaign is currently in process. Material pertaining to the life and legacy of Supervisor Milk is being accepted and considered for exhibition scheduled to open in Summer 2019. Phase I (nine gates) of the T1/Milk project will open in July 2019 and will include the temporary wall installation showcasing the crowdsourced Milk material. Phase II (18 gates) will be completed in March 2020 and will include the Harvey Milk Inglenook, as well as the lighting art piece in the southern portion of the arrivals level. The Terminal 1 Redevelopment Project is scheduled to be fully completed by the end of 2022 with the installation of the atrium art sculpture in the lobby and the lighting art piece in the north portion of the arrivals level.

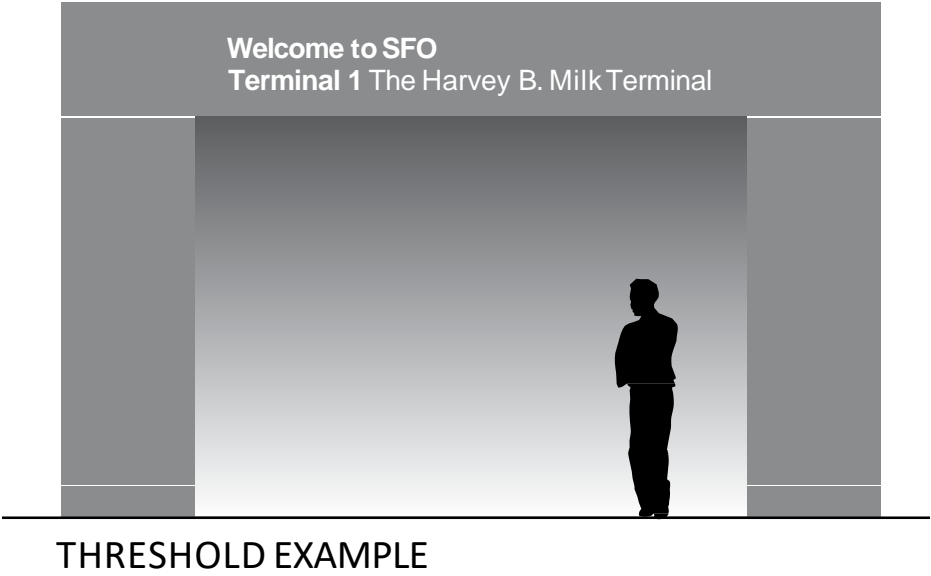
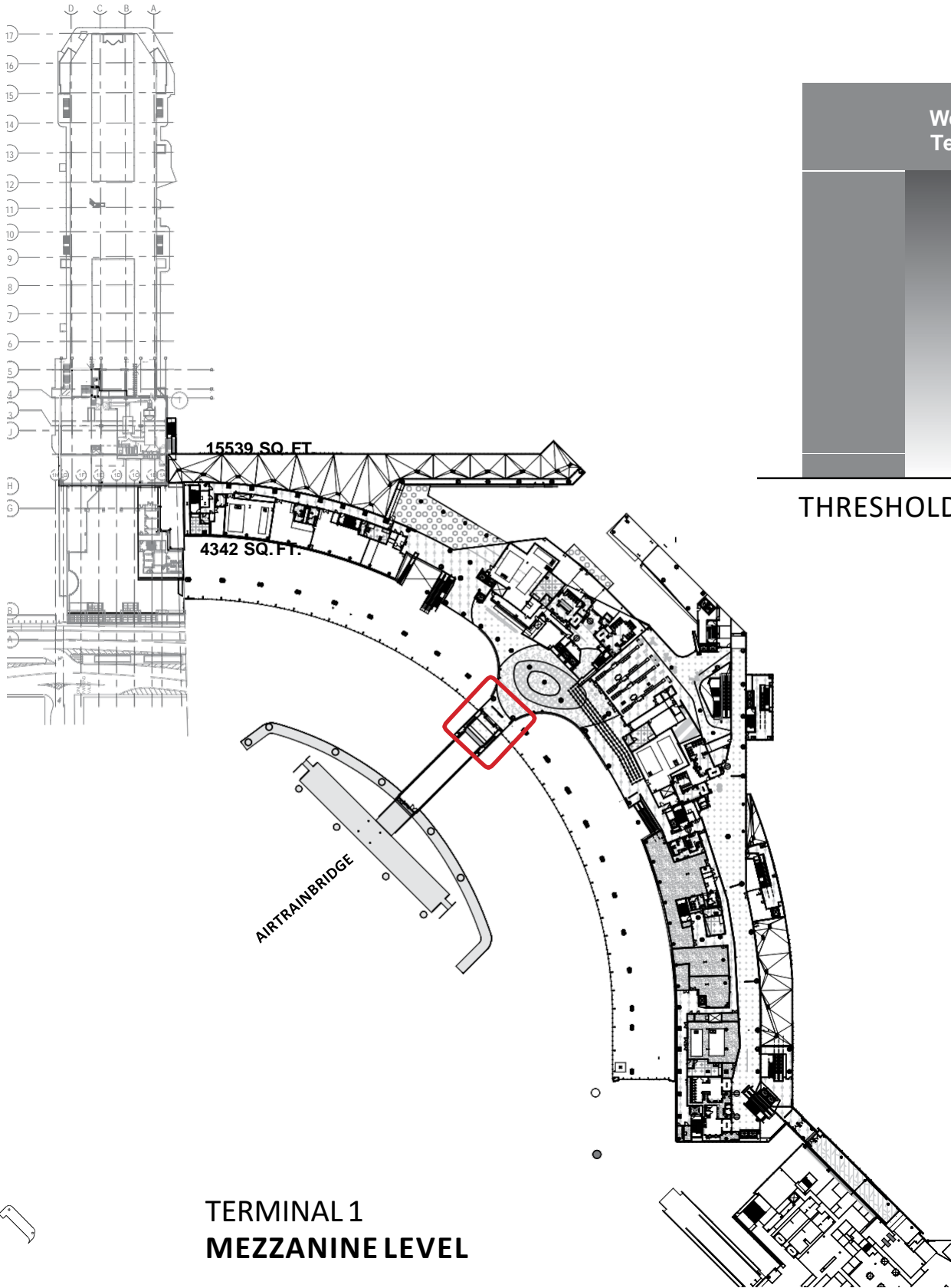
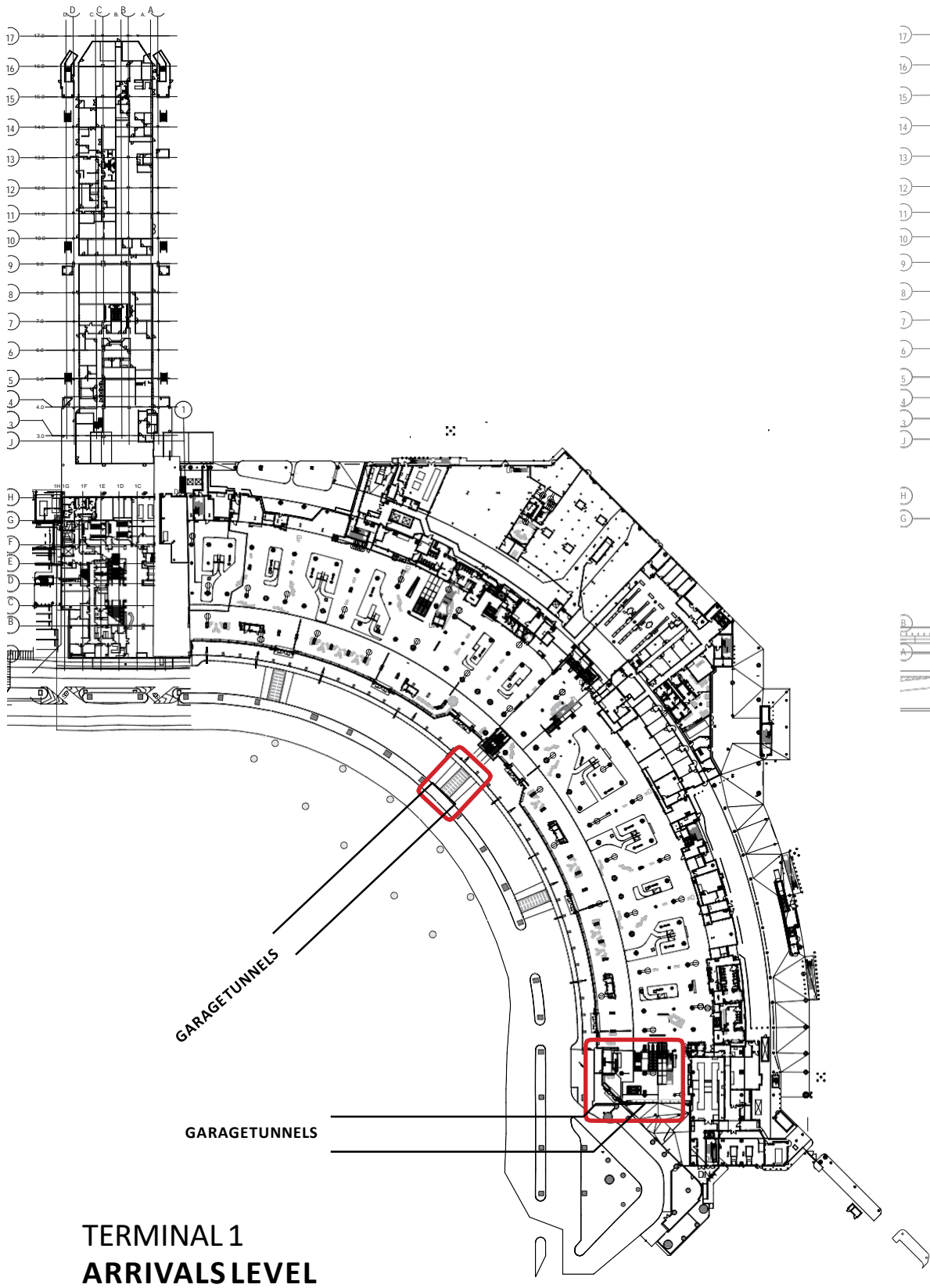

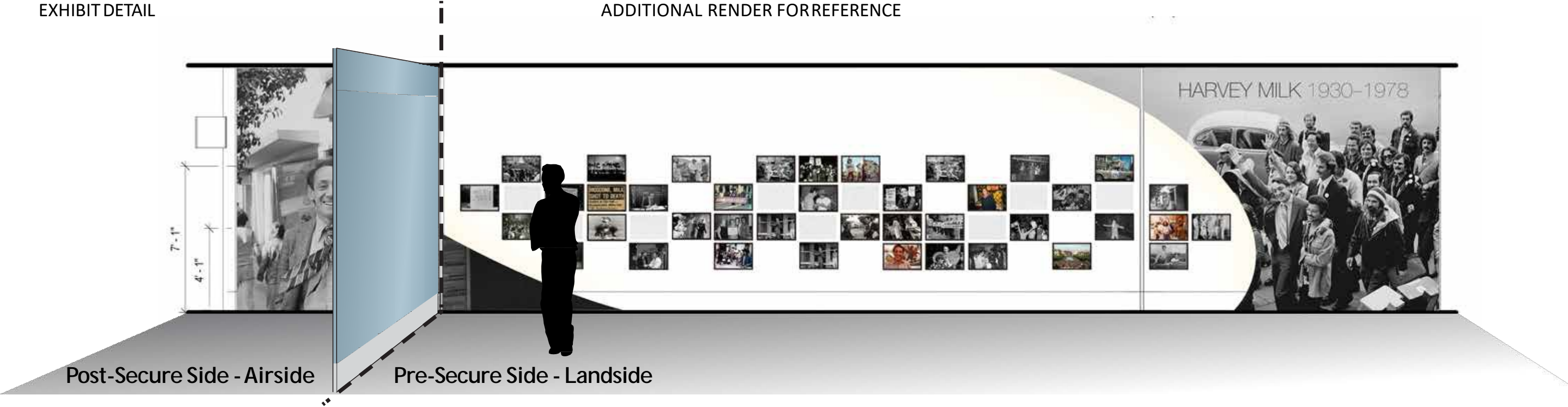

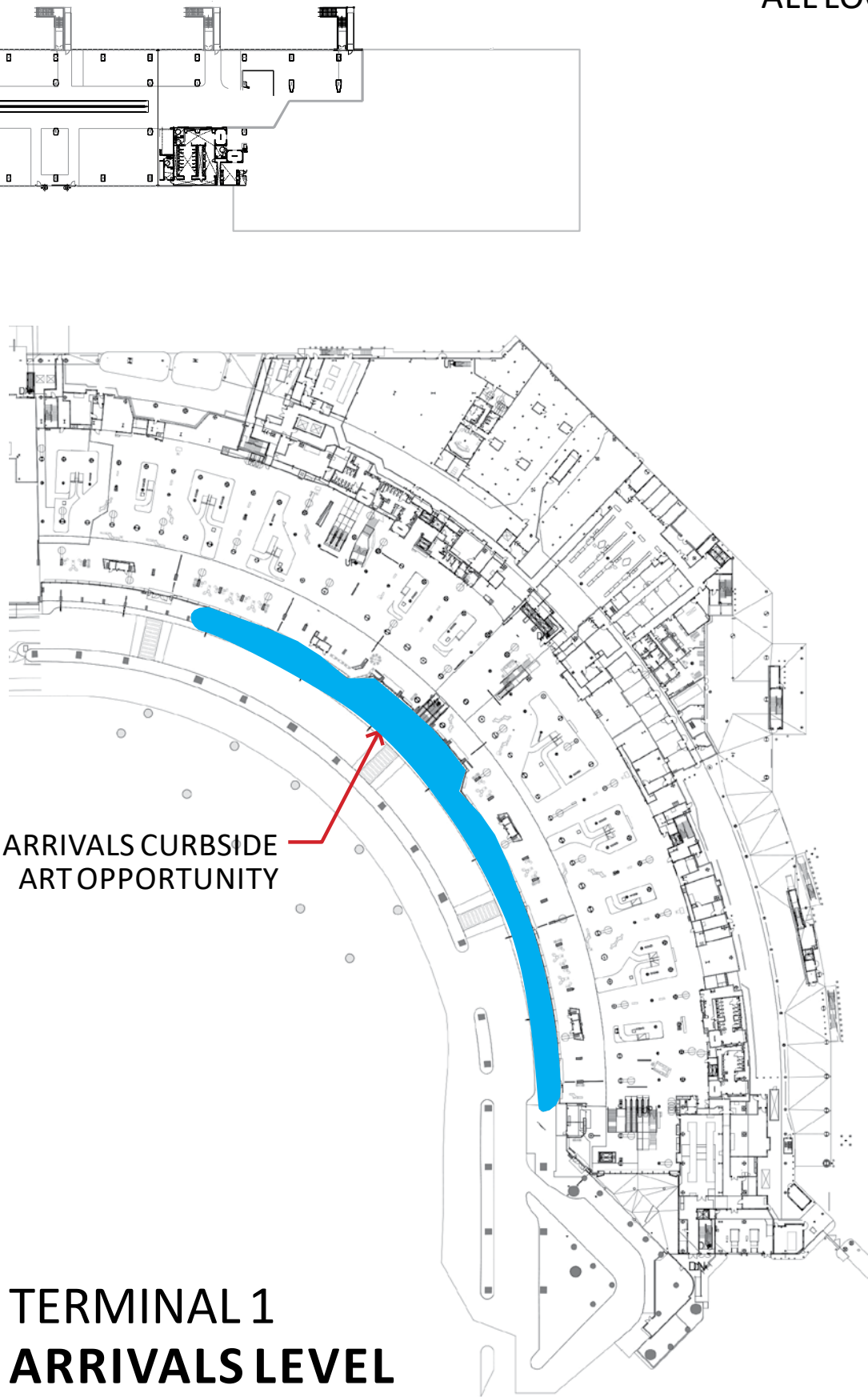
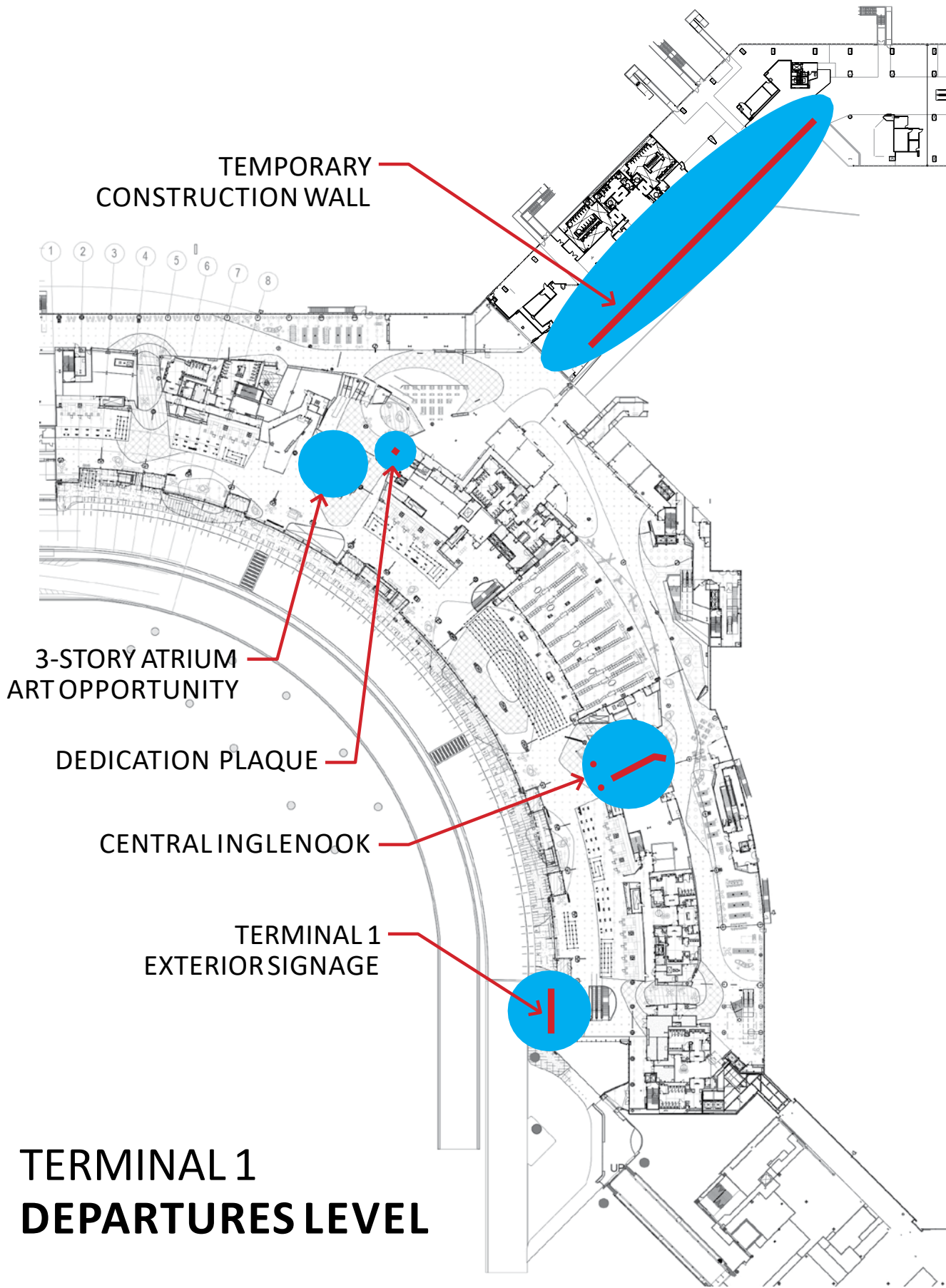
