My background in public policy and my active community involvement make me a strong asset to serve on the Eastern Neighborhoods Citizens Advisory Committee. I possess the skills necessary to succeed in representing the community in District 9. I have engaged in the planning of Mission Action Plan 2020. As a Policy Intern at Mission Economic Development Agency in 2015, I had the opportunity to meet with community advocates, artists, and stakeholders. As the Policy Intern at the Mission Economic Agency, I conducted extensive research to assess housing policy data and perspectives on policy outcomes in San Francisco. I facilitated meetings among stakeholders and local legislators to identify the most effective strategies to fight against evictions and to retain the Latino population in the Bay Area. I participated in the process of identifying opportunities for community-serving businesses and in preserving socioeconomic diversity. As a Latina and Community Organizer, I represent the community interests, ethnicity, and diversity. Overall, my background in conducting policy advocacy, research, and engaging with Latino leaders has prepared me to become a more effective advocate and leader.

Business and/or professional experience:

My professional background has prepared me to be a strong community advocate and a policy strategist. My master's degree was tailored towards learning about policymaking, strategic campaign planning, urban law, advocacy, and communications. I also hold a BA in Political Science and a Certificate in Non-Profit Management. I currently work at California Reinvestment Coalition as a Community Organizer, the core of our work is the Community Reinvestment Act, a law that was passed in 1977 to combat redlining. As part of my overall work, I am leading a Here to Stay campaign focused on reforming state and local policies along with corporate practices to ensure immigrant families have access to financial resources and economic opportunities. My current work has given me the ability to advocate for more community investment in the Mission District to ensure small-business owners have access to capital to sustain their businesses and remain in the neighborhood. In addition to state and local advocacy. I have also been engaged at the federal level to push for more equitable policies around immigration, public education, housing, and economic equity. I ask for your consideration in accepting my nomination to serve on Eastern Neighborhoods Citizens Advisory Committee. I am grateful and honored for the opportunity to apply.

Civic Activities:

I have been politically engaged since I was in College while attaining a BA in Political Science. I learned early the value of engaging in policy and the importance of representing the community in political settings. Working closing with community members and advocates has prepared me to be a strong advocate. My political involvement and professional qualifications have given me the ability to develop an understanding on how the state and local government interact with advocates, community members, and stakeholders. In fact, I am currently serving as the Parliamentarian of the San Francisco Latino Democratic Club; I have been active member for more than five years. In November, I am running for the position of President of the San Francisco Democratic Club. As an immigrant and community leader, I have been active in engaging District 9 community members in advocacy to ensure they have a platform to advocate for equitable policies. Further, I am a member of multiple national organizations focused on Latino empowerment and affordable housing such as League of United Latin American Citizens and National Housing Conference. I am committed to advancing the accessible housing to low- and moderate-income individuals and families through sound community revitalization policies. Overall, I have been involved in multiple civic activities to ensure low to moderate income communities in San Francisco and across California have access to financial resources, economic opportunity, affordable housing, and other resources they need to live with dignity.

The Eastern Neighborhoods Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) was established to be the advisory body charged with providing input to City agencies and decision makers on all activities related to the implementation of the Eastern Neighborhoods Area Plans: 1) East SoMa, 2) Western SoMa, 3) Mission, 4) Showplace Square/Potrero Hill, and 5) Central Waterfront (Plan Areas). The CAC shall provide input on the prioritization of public benefits, updating the public benefits program, relaying information to community members in each of the four neighborhoods regarding the status of development proposals in the Eastern Neighborhoods, and providing input to Plan Area monitoring efforts.

The CAC shall consist of nineteen (19) members that represent the diversity of the Eastern Neighborhoods (key stakeholders), including resident renters, resident homeowners, lowincome residents, local merchants, established neighborhoods groups within the Plan Area, and other groups identified through refinement of the CAC process:
