[Accept and Expend Grant - California Air Resources Board - Zero Emission from Farm to Table - \$4,562,862]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$4,562,862 from the California Air Resources Board Zero- and Near-Zero Emission Freight Facilities Program to coordinate demonstration of electric medium- and heavy-duty trucks for transport of produce along Northern California's trade corridors in the San Francisco Bay Area and the Central Valley for the period of October 1, 2018, through March 31, 2021.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is a long-standing leader in local and regional vehicle electrification program development and implementation; and

WHEREAS, In April 2018, the City and County of San Francisco committed to a climate goal of net-zero greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 2050; and

WHEREAS, Private sector road transportation is currently the single largest contributor to GHG emissions and air pollution in San Francisco, with cars and trucks contributing over 90% of these emissions; and

WHEREAS, Medium- and heavy-duty fleets represent a significant air pollution reduction opportunity, as the higher fuel use of these vehicles represent 32% of GHG emissions; and

WHEREAS, Existing deployment of medium- and heavy-duty fleets is concentrated in commercial corridors and industrial areas, which often overlap with and disproportionately burden the public health of low-income and underserved communities; and

WHEREAS, Produce movement and distribution in Northern California also represents a significant air pollution reduction opportunity, as the Central Valley region is the 17th largest agricultural area in the world and feeds one-third (1/3) of the world's population; and

WHEREAS, The City is committed to both increasing access to healthy food and reducing food waste, goals which require successful operation of distribution marketplaces and coordination of daily deliveries to connect produce growers to businesses that serve residents; and

WHEREAS, Through the Healthy Air and Clean Transportation Ordinance (HACTO), the Department of the Environment actively seeks to maximize the use of outside sources for programs that help achieve reduction of GHG and pollution levels by promoting the use of vehicles with zero or ultra-low emissions and expanding alternative fueling infrastructure in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, In July 2018, the Department of the Environment submitted a proposal to the California Air Resources Board (CARB) Zero- and Near Zero-Emission Freight Facilities (ZANZEFF) Program to implement and administer bold clean transportation strategies that can holistically reduce GHG emissions, toxic pollutants, and air contaminants, and that can be emulated throughout freight facilities statewide; and

WHEREAS, In September 2018, the CARB announced proposed awards under the ZANZEFF Program, which included an award of \$4,562,862 to the Department of the Environment to implement the Zero Emission from Farm to Table Project, a demonstration project of electric medium- and heavy-duty vehicles and charging infrastructure between the project cities of San Francisco, Fresno, and Sacramento; and

WHEREAS, The Zero Emission from Farm to Table Project will support a detailed demonstration, assessment, and evaluation of the real-world performance of electric medium- and heavy-duty vehicles involved in the movement and distribution of fresh produce in Northern California; and

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment can leverage existing staff to implement and administer this Zero Emission from Farm to Table Project; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an Annual Salary Ordinance (ASO) amendment and partially reimburses the Department of the Environment for several existing positions; and

WHEREAS, The term of this grant is from October 1, 2018, to March 31, 2021; and WHEREAS, A combination of cash investments and in-kind donations from outside partner agencies has been identified to provide the required \$4,711,937 in required non-state match monies; and

WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$63,178; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Director of the Department of the Environment is hereby authorized to accept and expend the Zero- and Near Zero-Emission Freight Facilities Program grant award of \$4,562,862 on behalf of the City, in accordance with the purposes and goals for the funding as generally set forth by the CARB; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of the Department of the Environment is hereby authorized to enter into and execute all agreements, and amendments thereto, between the City and various agencies consistent with the aforementioned proposal and necessary to carry out the purpose of the grant.



Thank you for your response to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18 Clean Transportation Incentives Program Grant Solicitation for the Zero- and Near Zero-Emission Freight Facilities Project (solicitation). The City of San Francisco's Department of the Environment and the project partners submitted a well-crafted proposal that meets the objectives and goals of the solicitation. In this project 30 zero-emission trucks will be deployed for use in the movement of produce from Sacramento and Fresno to the San Francisco Wholesale Produce Market and then to move produce to end users in the Bay Area. The project includes a solar array to be installed at the San Francisco's Wholesale Produce Market and vehicle chargers at the wholesale market and the fleet yards in Sacramento.

- California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requirements are satisfied;
- A resolution from the City of San Francisco's governing Board that states that the City of San Francisco will accept the grant award, comply with the terms of the solicitation and allocated any finds that the City of San Francisco has committed as part of the projects proposed match; and
- Responses addressing all outstanding clarifying questions to CARB's satisfaction.

It is expected that the above request can be satisfied no later than November 16, 2018. CARB will submit the Grant Agreement to the City of San Francisco's Department of the Environment for signature following Board approval of the FY 2018-19 Funding Plan.

No agreement is in effect until the Grant Agreement is signed by both parties and, therefore, no reimbursable work can begin until the Grant Agreement is fully executed. However, administrative tasks performed by the City of San Francisco's Department of the Environment that occur after the issuance of this preliminary award letter and before the execution of the grant agreement can be counted toward the projects in-kind match requirement. CARB will not reimburse the grantee or project participants for any costs incurred before the execution of the Grant Agreement. "Zero Emission Farm to Table: Reducing air pollution emissions and health risks from the movement of produce along two adjacent trade corridors in California"

Led by the City and County of San Francisco's Department of the Environment (SF Environment), in partnership with the cities of Sacramento and Fresno, this project will coordinate demonstration of electric medium- and heavy-duty vehicles engaged in the movement of goods along two adjacent California trade corridors: San Francisco Bay Area and Central Valley. The project's goal is to ensure electric medium- and heavy-duty trucks are feasible for the transport of produce in multiple geographic market areas. The project will identify the most effective technical solutions for advancing use of electric vehicles (EV), collect and analyze data throughout the performance period to create a business case for fleet managers, and quantify the benefit of EVs to residents along the trade corridors, and in communities where project demonstration fleets operate. It will increase awareness and accelerate market adoption of EVs.

Project objectives include to electrify 23 medium - and 9 heavy-duty trucks that deliver produce from and within the Central Valley, Sacramento Valley, and coastal urban hubs. The project will also deploy Level 2 and Direct Current Fast Chargers to support demonstration fleets in San Francisco and Sacramento. At one of the two participating produce distribution markets in SF's Demonstration District, a 240-kilowatt solar photovoltaic array will also be installed.

Like many nonprofit organizations, and small and medium size businesses, project partners that operate delivery fleets do not have the experience, capacity or capital to complete a project of this scope. Through CARB support, and leveraging private sector investment, this project will enable technology deployment, technical engineering, consulting services and data analysis that results in the successful demonstration of electric trucks on the streets of San Francisco, Sacramento and beyond.

The project will provide education and technical assistance (e.g., EV concierge) to fleet managers to make vehicle electrification simple and cost effective. It will share demonstration fleet data, summarize project findings and lessons learned, and testimonials from early adopters in a final report that will be shared broadly with other cities to encourage replication and advance market transformation for medium-and heavy-duty EVs.

Potential benefits and outcomes of the project include but are not limited to maximizing the emission reduction benefits of EVs used in the movement of produce and achieving health risk reductions in communities impacted by this sector. Key pollutants targeted by the project include diesel particulate matter and nitrogen oxides that contribute to the formation of both PM2.5 and ozone. The project will also provide co-benefits by reducing greenhouse gases and black carbon emissions that contribute to climate change; reducing fueling costs for fleet operators; reducing maintenance costs; increasing energy efficiency and renewable energy use.

Additional major project participants include CALSTART, Ryder Systems, Thor Trucks, eMotorWerks, the San Francisco Wholesale Produce Market, Earl's Organics, Veritable Vegetable, Ozark Trucking, Inc., Produce Express, Luminalt, Black & Veatch and DNV-GL.

The total project cost is \$9,114,799 and the project team is requesting CARB funding in the amount of \$4,562,862. The project team is providing a total match of \$4,551,937 which equals \$3,522/metric tons CO2e reduced and \$5,564,682/tons criteria pollutants reduced.
