13	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding

18	(a)	Establishm	ent of Committee. There is hereby established a San Francisco		
19	Museum an	d Historical S	ociety Advisory Committee ("Committee").		
20	(b)	Committee	Membership. The Committee shall consist of nine (9) voting		
21	members. The members shall consist of:				
22	(1)	Two (2) rep	resentatives from the San Francisco Museum and Historical Society		
23		(the "Soci	ety");		
24	(2)	Two (2) rep	resentatives from the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco		
25		("FAMSF");			

1	(3)	One (1) representative from the San Francisco Public Library currently working		
2		in the City Archives division or with expertise in historical materials;		
3	(4)	One (1) member of the public with significant expertise or experience		
4		researching and documenting the history of San Francisco ("the Historical		
5		Research Representative");		
6	(5)	Two (2) members of the public from historical organizations including, but not		
7		<u>limited to, organizations</u> focused on the history of ethnic or racial minorities,		
8		sexual orientation, gender or any of the various other cultural or on the history of		
9		the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender communities within San Francisco;

11	(6)	One (1) member of the public with a professional background in museums who		
12		is not affiliated with FAMSF or the Society (the "Museum Professional		
13		Representative").		
14	The S	Society representatives shall be appointed by the Mayor based on nominations		
15	from the Sar	r Francisco Museum and Historical Society. The public representatives,		
16	excluding the	e Museum Professional Representative and the Historical Research		
17	<u>Representat</u>	ive, shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors based on nominations from		
18	the Society a	the Society and from applications submitted by the general public. The Museum Professional		
19	Representative and the Historical Research Representative shall be appointed by the Mayor			
20	based on nominations from the Society and from applications submitted by the general public.			
21	The Society's nominations and the public representative applications for positions other than			
22	the Museum Professional Representative and the Historical Research Representative shall be			

submitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors within 30 days of the enactment of this

Ordinance. The Society's nominations and the public representative applications for the

Museum Professional Representative and the Historical Research Representative shall be

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submitted to the Mayor's Office within 30 days of the enactment of this Ordinance. The San

2 Francisco Public Library representative shall be appointed by the Director of the Fine Arts

Museums based upon the recommendation of the City Librarian. The FAMSF representatives

shall be appointed by the Director of the Fine Arts Museums. All appointments shall be made

within 60 days after enactment of this Ordinance and thereafter, as provided in subparagraph

(c). Each Committee member shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority.

In making appointments, members of the Board of Supervisors, Mayor, City Librarian and the Director of the Fine Arts Museums shall take into consideration City policy that the members of all boards, commissions and committees be broadly representative of the diversity in ethnicity, race, age and sexual orientation of the City and County and have representation of both sexes. In no event shall more than four members of the Committee consist of members of the Fine Arts Museums Board of Trustees ("Fine Arts Museums Board") or its Executive Committee. In no event shall more than four members of the Committee consist of board members of the Society.

(c) Term of Office. Members shall serve a term of one year. The first one-year term for all members shall begin upon the date the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors certifies that all members of the Committee have been appointed following the adoption of this Ordinance. Future terms of office shall begin on that date of each successive year. Members shall conduct the first meeting of the Committee within thirty days of the appointment of all members.

In the event a vacancy in Committee membership occurs, the successor to the vacant position shall be appointed to complete the unexpired term of the office vacated in the same manner used to select the previous occupant of that position, consistent with subparagraph (b).

1	(d)	Rem	oval of Members. Any member whom the Committee certifies to have
2	missed thre	e regul	arly scheduled meetings of the Committee in any six month period without
3	prior author	ization	of the Committee shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee
4	effective on	the da	te of the written certification from the Committee.
5	(e)	Com	pensation. Members of the Committee shall not be compensated, nor
6	shall they b	e reimb	oursed for expenses.
7	<b>(f)</b>	Purp	oses and Duties of Committee. The purposes and duties of the
8	Committee	are to p	oublicly discuss and make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors
9	and Fine Ar	ts Mus	eums Board regarding any or all of the following topics:
10		(1)	The management of the City history collections of the San Francisco
11			Museum and Historical Society, the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco
12			the San Francisco Public Library and other City departments, (the
13			"Collection") including, but not limited to, issues related to the inventory,
14			housing, storage, exhibition, conservation and development of such
15			Collection;
16		(2)	The type of relationship between the City and the Society that would best
17			serve to ensure the continuing existence, financial stability and success
18			of the San Francisco Museum and Historical Society;
19		(3)	The identification of permanent exhibition venue(s) for the Society's
20			Collection and funding for such venue(s);
21		(4)	Sources of potential financial support for the Society;
22		(5)	The potential creation of one or more full-time or part-time positions under
23			the Fine Arts Museums' budget for the purpose of conducting a complete

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1		(6) The potential merger of the City's historical collections with the Society's

3		(7) Strategies to promote citywide communication and partnership between

5	(g)	Reporting Requirements. The Committee shall submit to the Board of
6	Supervisors	and to the Fine Arts Museums Board a written report, by March 31 of 2003,
7	summarizin	g its findings and recommendations, and then submit an annual report by March 1
8	of each sub	sequent year the Committee is in operation.
9	(h)	Officers. At the initial meeting of the Committee, the Committee members shall
10	select such	officers as it deems necessary.
11	(i)	Staff Support. The Fine Arts Museums shall provide staff support and
12	resources fo	or the Committee.
13	<b>(j)</b>	Meetings. The Committee shall meet at least monthly. All meetings of the
14	Committee,	except as provided by applicable laws, shall be open to the public.
15	(k)	Establishment of Rules and Regulations. The Committee, which qualifies as
16		a Policy Body under San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 67 (the
17		"Sunshine Ordinance"), shall establish rules and regulations for its own
18		organization and procedure that are consistent with the Sunshine Ordinance and
19		other laws governing the conduct of public meetings.
