Hi, my name is Phillip Kobernick. I'm a renter in district 5 and passionate about sustainable streets and using civic participation to make our city a more sustainable and equitable place to live. I sold my car several years ago to be better for the environment and enjoy living a car-free life, but often San Francisco makes it difficult. Inadequate clean transportation infrastructure, especially for pedestrians, contributes to people using personal vehicles. Too much of our urban space is devoted to vehicles and not enough is being done to make pedestrian travel safer and more enjoyable. A catalyst for my participation on PSAC was two recent tragic deaths on Oak and Fell near where I live, both pedestrians crossing unsafe streets. We can do better and I hope to be an advocate for calmer, greener, more pedestrian-scaled and complete streets across the city through this committee. I am not a member of a protected class as described in the question description.

Business and/or professional experience:

I've worked in sustainable transportation for 6 years for Alameda County, mainly for green vehicle and clean commute projects. As the employee transportation coordinator, I help employees transition from drive-alone commuting to various clean commute modes to help meet County Climate Action Plan goals. My main office is in Oakland and I usually bike on Page street to get to BART as part of my own commute.



Board Qualifications:

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee, composed of concerned and informed residents, will provide a source of expertise on issues concerning pedestrian safety, convenience, ambiance, and planning. The Advisory Committee shall consist of seventeen (17) voting members.

- Seat 1 shall be held by a representative from a pedestrian safety organization, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

- Seats 2 and 3 shall be held by representatives from senior or disability organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

- Seat 4 shall be held by a representative from a bicycle or other non-motorized wheeled personal transport organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

- Seat 5 shall be held by a representative from a transit or environmental organizations, appointed by the Board of Supervisors.

Seats 6 through 16 shall be appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors, with each member of the Board appointing one member of the Advisory Committee.

- Seat 17 shall be held by a parent of a student in the San Francisco Unified School District, appointed by the Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District. If at any time the Superintendent declines to appoint an individual to Seat 17 for 60 days or longer, the Board of Supervisors may appoint a new member with the same or different qualifications to fill the seat for the remainder of the term.

The terms for odd-numbered seats shall expire on March 31, 2018, and every two years thereafter. The terms for even-numbered seats shall expire on March 31, 2019, and every two years thereafter.

The Superintendent of the San Francisco Unified School District may appoint a member of the San Francisco Unified School District's Student Advisory Council to serve as a non-voting member of the Advisory Committee. The individual appointed to this seat may participate in Advisory Committee discussions to the same extent as other members of the Advisory Committee but may not vote on any matter and shall not be counted toward a quorum.

The following City departments shall select and send designate a non-voting representative to attend Advisory Committee meetings at the request of the Advisory Committee: the Department of Public Health, the Municipal Transportation Agency, the Department of Public Works, the Planning Department, the Police Department, the Recreation and Parks Department, District Attorney's Office, and the Mayor's Office on Disability, and any other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians shall also designate a non-voting representative to Advisory Committee meetings upon request of the Advisory Committee. Every year by July 1, each department required to designate a non-voting representative shall inform the Advisory Committee in writing of the name, work phone number, and work email address of its representative.

Report: The Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrians injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding and enforcement, and other pertinent issues.
