12 13	Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by repealing Section 1159, to read as follows:			
14 15	Sec. 1159. UNION SQUARE AN	'D FISHERMAN'S WHARF SIGHTSEEING VEHICLE STANDS.		
16	(a) Union Square Stand.	The Department of Parking and Traffic shall issue to a single person		
17	or entity a permit for a sightseei	ng vehicle to stand on the east side of Powell Street, between Geary		
18	and Post Streets, for the purpose	e of selling tickets for sightseeing tours and for the other purposes as		
19	described in this Section. A vehicle owned by the permittee may pick up and discharge sightseeing			
20	passengers from the Powell Stre	et curb in front of the vehicle ticket stand an average of not more than		
21	two times each hour, provided th	nat such vehicle does not spend more than 10 minutes at the curb in		
22	each instance.			
23	(b) Permit Required. None of the	(b) Permit Required. None of the vehicles mentioned in this Section shall stand on the streets mentione		
24	herein unless the permit from the	herein unless the permit from the Department of Parking and Traffic has been first obtained. Not more		
25	than one permit shall be issued t	o any person, firm, corporation or association for more than one		

1	vehicle at any one time.
2	(c) Terms of Permit. The permit referred to in Subsections (a) and (b) above shall have a term of five
3	years, and shall be competitively rebid every five years by the Department of Parking and Traffic in
4	order to ensure that the fee for such permit reflects the fair market value for such permit and that the
5	service to the touring public and to the City is adequate. The Department of Parking and Traffic may
6	revoke the permit at any time if it finds, after notice and hearing, that the permittee is in material
7	violation of the conditions of the permit as specified in this Section and a written agreement between
8	the Department and the permittee. The Department of Parking and Traffic shall base its decision to
9	award the permit upon specific applicable criteria developed and published by the Department, after of
10	public comment period of not less than 30 days, which shall include, but not be limited to, the factors
11	set forth below.
12	(1) Whether the financial, equipment, and personnel resources, and the financial responsibility, of the
13	proposed permittee are such that it will likely be able to conduct its proposed sightseeing tour
14	operation during the term of the permit and otherwise fulfill its obligations under this Section;
15	(2) Whether the proposed permittee's duration and breadth of experience in the sightseeing tour
16	business in San Francisco is sufficient;
17	(3) Whether a "prevailing wage" as that term is defined in Section 6.1-3 of Chapter 6 of the San
18	Francisco Administrative Code has been or will be paid to employees of the proposed permittee or its
19	independent contractors, and whether the various terms and conditions of employment required by lav
20	have and will be observed;
21	(4) Whether the amount of public liability and vehicle insurance coverage carried by the proposed
22	permittee is reasonable;
23	(5) Whether a Public Utilities Commission sightseeing or other appropriate permit or certificate
24	granting authority to operate sightseeing and/or charter tours has been obtained;
25	(6) Whether the proposed permittee has a record of timely and comprehensive tour service to the

1	public;
2	(7) In the case of an existing permittee, whether the permittee's record of performance of its obligations
3	under this Section is satisfactory.
4	(d) The successful permittee shall conduct its sightseeing tour operation substantially in accordance
5	with the terms and conditions of a written agreement developed by the Department of Parking and
6	Traffic in accordance with this Section. The permittee shall offer and display to the public free of
7	charge at the ticket stand a brochure containing information about the history of San Francisco and
8	Union Square. The permittee shall staff the ticket stand with at least one person knowledgeable about
9	the history of San Francisco and Union Square, not less than 10 hours per day, seven days per week,
10	and shall provide sightseeing tours to the public each day of the year including holidays. At all times
11	during the term of the permit, the permittee shall carry general public liability and vehicle insurance in
12	amounts not less than those required by the Department of Parking and Traffic in its reasonable
13	discretion, but in no event less than the amounts required to be carried by holders of sightseeing
14	permits granted by the California Public Utilities Commission.
15	(e) Fisherman's Wharf Stand. The Department of Parking and Traffic may issue permits for sightseeing
16	vehicles to stand on the north side of Beach Street between Leavenworth and Jones Streets, and the east
17	and west side of Leavenworth Street between Beach and Jefferson Streets. Sightseeing tour vehicles
18	shall not stand on the streets mentioned herein unless the permit from the Department of Parking and
19	Traffic has first been obtained. The Department of Parking and Traffic shall establish fees for such
20	permits based upon the estimated cost of administering the permit process.
