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1	[Development of Property Located at Broadway and Battery Streets For Affordable Housing]
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3	Resolution authorizing the mayor's office of housing to enter into a lease disposition
4	and development agreement and below market long-term ground lease with Chinatown
5	Community Development Center, a nonprofit public benefit corporation, for the
6	development of affordable housing, together with a child care center, neighborhood-
7	serving commercial space, and associated parking on real property located on the
8	south side of Broadway between Battery and Front streets; affirming the Planning
9	Commission's adoption of the mitigated negative declaration for the project; adopting
10	environmental findings under the California Environmental Quality Act; and adopting
11	findings that the project is consistent with the City's General Plan and Eight Priority
12	Policies of City Planning Code Section 101.1.
13	WHEREAS, On January 11, 1999, the Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No.
14	27-99, File No. 98-2098, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.
15	, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully
16	herein, approving in principle the disposition of three parcels that were formerly owned by the
17	California Department of Transportation as part of the right of way of the Embarcadero
18	Freeway; and,
19	WHEREAS, In Resolution No. 27-99 the Board approved in principle the use by the
20	Mayor's Office of Housing ("MOH") of Block 141, Lot 11 (Broadway between Battery Street
21	and Front Street) (the "Site") for the development of affordable housing consistent with
22	Proposition A approved by the voters in November 1996; and,
23	WHEREAS, Resolution 27-99 authorized MOH to issue a request for qualifications or
24	proposals for a developer to purchase or lease the Site at less than fair market value for the
25	development of affordable housing; and,

1	WHEREAS, Board Resolution No. 27-99 stipulates that disposition of the Site is subject
2	to the receipt of any required Board of Supervisors' approval; and,
3	WHEREAS, In April 1999 MOH issued a Request for Qualifications (the "RFQ") to
4	select a qualified nonprofit or for-profit developer working in partnership with a qualified
5	nonprofit developer to create a development proposal for the Site, which would include not
6	more than 100 units of affordable housing, a childcare center, neighborhood-serving
7	commercial space and parking facility (the "Project"); and,
8	WHEREAS, A selection committee established by MOH evaluated responses to the
9	RFQ and based on developers' responses and qualifications, the selection committee
10	recommended to the Mayor that MOH commence negotiations with and enter into an
11	Exclusive Negotiating Agreement ("ENA") with Chinatown Community Development Center
12	("Developer"), a qualified nonprofit developer, for the purpose of, among other things,
13	negotiating the terms and conditions under which the City, through MOH, would enter into a
14	long term ground lease for the site; and,
15	WHEREAS, The ENA expires, as extended, on September 30, 2003; and,
16	WHEREAS, The Project as currently proposed by the Developer and MOH will serve a
17	public purpose of the City and will consist of 87 units of affordable rental housing for low and
18	very low income families, a childcare center, neighborhood-serving commercial space and
19	parking for the housing to be built within the existing 84-foot height limit for the Site; and,
20	WHEREAS, The Site is currently under the jurisdiction of the City's Department of
21	Public Works ("DPW") and DPW is seeking to transfer jurisdiction of the Site to the Mayor's
22	Office of Housing under Board Resolution No, to be considered
23	concurrently with this resolution; and,
24	WHEREAS, In order to implement the Project, MOH and the Developer negotiated a
25	Lease Disposition and Development Agreement (the "DDA") and long-term ground lease of

1	the Site (the "Lease"), cop	ies of which are on file with t	he Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in
2	File No	_; and,	
3	WHEREAS, The Bo	pard considered the recommo	endation of the Director of MOH and
4	the proposed DDA and Le	ase; and,	
5	WHEREAS, Board	Resolution No. 27-99 provide	es that any proceeds from the
6	disposition of the Site shall	I be used in accordance with	Streets and Highways Code Section
7	72, to the extent such prod	ceeds are deemed necessary	y by the City's Waterfront
8	Transportation Project to f	ulfill the City's obligations un	der that Section to provide local street
9	access comparable to that	t provided by the former Emb	parcadero Freeway (the "Mid-
10	Embarcadero Roadway Pr	roject") and, to that end, the I	Lease provides that the Developer will
11	pay all rent under the lease	e, totaling \$500,000, to the D	Department of Public Works for such

13	WHEREAS, In acco	ordance with Streets and Hig	hways Code Section 72 the City
14	constructed the Mid-Emba	rcadero Roadway Project the	e total cost of the Mid-Embarcadero
15	Roadway construction was	s \$75,571,883 of which the C	City paid \$62,946,962 through various
16	grants. The remainder of	the cost was paid with a San	Francisco Transportation Authority
17	loan of which DPW is oblig	gated to repay \$5,600,000. 1	The Lease amount will be paid to DPW
18	which, together with funds	received by the City from the	e sale of other former Embarcadero
19	Roadway parcels, will repa	ay the Transportation Authori	ity loan; and,
20	WHEREAS, Under	the DDA, before MOH delive	ers the lease to the Site, the Developer
21	must satisfy certain conditi	ions including: (i) obtain MOI	Happroval of the construction
22	documents for the Project,	, (ii) obtain all regulatory app	rovals required to commence
23	construction of the Project	, (iii) secure issuance of build	ding permits for the Project, (iv) obtain
24	Board of Supervisors appr	oval of the DDA, Lease and	any other related agreements, (v)

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obtain financing for the Project acceptable to MOH, and (vi) accept the Site "as-is", without
representation or warranty by MOH; and,

WHEREAS, The term of the Lease is 50 years, with one 49-year option to extend, for a maximum term of 99 years; and,

WHEREAS, MOH has committed approximately \$10 million of appropriated affordable housing funds to the Project, for which the Developer must maintain the Project as housing affordable to households whose income does not exceed 50% of area median income for a term of 55 years, and which will be disbursed in phases upon the Developer satisfying certain disbursement conditions including but not limited to: (i) securing all project financing to construct and maintain the Project as affordable housing, (ii) obtaining MOH approval of the final design and construction contract, (iii) obtaining all environmental review clearances and land use approvals, and (iv) obtaining MOH approval of the commercial space plan in accordance with MOH's commercial space policy; and,

WHEREAS, The Planning Department has undertaken an environmental review process for the proposed Project under the California Environmental Quality Act, California Public Resources Sections 21000 et seq., ("CEQA"), the Guidelines for Implementation of CEQA, 14 California Code of Regulations Sections 15000 et seq. (the "CEQA Guidelines"), and Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code ("Chapter 31"), and provided for appropriate public hearings before the San Francisco Planning Commission; and,

WHEREAS, On November 2, 2002, the Planning Department released for public review and comment a Preliminary Mitigated Negative Declaration that the Project, as proposed, could not have a significant effect on the environment, File No.2002.0778E (the "Neg Dec"), and on November 22, 2002 two appeals of the decision to issue a mitigated negative declaration were filed; and,

1	WHEREAS, On May 22, 2003, the Planning Commission held a public hearing on the
2	appeal of the Neg Dec and upheld the Neg Dec finding that the contents of said report and the
3	procedures through which the Neg Dec was prepared, publicized and reviewed complied with
4	the provisions of the CEQA, the CEQA Guidelines, and Chapter 31; and,
5	WHEREAS, The Neg Dec files and other Project-related Department files have been
6	made available for review by the Board of Supervisors and the public, and those files are part
7	of the record before this Board of Supervisors; and,
8	WHEREAS, This Board of Supervisors has reviewed and considered the information
9	contained in the Neg Dec; and,
10	WHEREAS, On May 22, 2003 the Planning Commission found, in Motion 16588, that
11	the Project as contemplated by the DDA and the Lease is consistent with the City's General
12	Plan and the Eight Priority Policies of Planning Code Section 101.1; by Motion No. 16589
13	issued a Certificate of Appropriateness due to the Site's location in the Northeast Waterfront
14	Historic District; and by Motion No. 16590, approved a conditional use authorization for a
15	Planned Unit Development under Section 303 and 304 of the Planning Code for certain
16	exceptions from the Planning Code as described in the Motion, all of which Motions are on file
17	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors under File No,
18	, and No; now, therefore, be it
19	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors has reviewed and considered the Planning
20	Commission Motion No. 16588 certifying the Neg Dec, and hereby endorses and adopts said
21	Planning Commission Motion, and incorporates the same herein by reference; and, be it
22	FURTHER RESOLVED, That under CEQA Guidelines Section 15162, and based upon
23	the Board of Supervisor's review of the Neg Dec, the Board finds that: (1) there are no
24	substantial modifications in the Project that would require important revisions to the Neg Dec
25	due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the

severity of previously identified significant effects; (2) no substantial changes have occurred
with respect to the circumstances under which the	Project is to be undertaken that would
require major revisions to the Neg Dec due to the in	nvolvement of significant effects or a
substantial increase in the severity of effects identif	ied in the Neg Dec; and (3) no new
information of substantial importance to the Project	has become available that would indicate
(a) the Project or the actions will have significant ef	fects not discussed in the Neg Dec,
(b) significant environmental effects would be subs	tantially more severe, (c) mitigation
measures or alternatives found not feasible that wo	ould reduce one or more significant effects
have become feasible, or (d) mitigation measures of	or alternatives which are considerably
different from those in the Neg Dec would substant	ially reduce one or more significant effects
on the environment; and, be it	

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the Project, as contemplated by the DDA and the Lease, is consistent with the General Plan and Eight Priority Policies of Section 101.1 for the same reasons as set forth in Resolution No. 16588 of the Planning Commission, dated May 22, 2003, and hereby incorporates such findings by reference as though fully set forth in this resolution; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the DDA, the Lease and the transactions contemplated thereby, finds that the Project will further a public purpose of the City, and authorizes MOH, through its Director, to execute the DDA and Lease in substantially the form presented to this Board; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes MOH, through its Director, to enter into any additions, amendments or other modifications to the DDA or the Lease (including, without limitation, the attachment of exhibits) that the Director determines are in the best interests of MOH and the City, do not decrease the revenues to MOH or the City in connection with the Site, or otherwise materially increase the obligations or liabilities of

1	the MOH or the City, and are necessary or advisable to complete the transactions
2	contemplated in the DDA and the Lease and to effectuate the purpose and intent of this
3	resolution.
