Board amendment additions are double underlined. 9 Board amendment deletions are strikethrough normal. 10 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco: 11 Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by amending 12 Section 4.11, to read as follows: 13 Sec. 4.11. USE OF CITY-OWNED VEHICLES. 14 Vehicles owned, leased or rented by the City and County and assigned (a) 15 to, or under the jurisdiction of, any department of the City and County, shall be used only in 16 the discharge and transaction of municipal business. No officer, employee or authorized 17 volunteer of the City and County shall use any such vehicle without the consent of the head of 18 such department. The head of the department which has jurisdiction over any such vehicle 19 may not assign any such vehicle to any individual officer or employee unless a written request 20 justifying the need for personal assignment is made by the individual officer or employee and 21 approved by the Director of Administrative Services. 22 No vehicle owned, leased or rented by the City and County and assigned (b) 23 to, or under the jurisdiction of, any department of the City and County shall be used for 24 transportation to and from an employee's place of residence except as provided below: 25

1 (1) The employee resides in or both resides and works outside of the City 2 and County and is on call for work after his or her normal workday is completed and the 3 nature of the work has required the use of a City and County vehicle after hours on at least 4 five occasions in the preceding 12-month period; or

5 (2) The employee resides in or both resides and works outside of the City 6 and County and must leave his or her residence prior to 8:00 a.m. on City and County 7 business away from his or her normal place of work; or

8 (3) The employee resides in or both resides and works outside of the City 9 and County and would return to his or her normal place of work from an appointment on City 10 and County business after 6:00 p.m. or on a weekend; or

11 The employee is a member of the San Francisco Police Department or (4) 12 San Francisco Sheriff's Department, or an employee of the San Francisco Water Department, 13 San Francisco Department of Public Works, San Francisco Department of Emergency 14 Services or San Francisco Office of Citizen Complaints, and has the prior written permission 15 of the department head to use a vehicle equipped with emergency equipment for such 16 purpose, subject to such restrictions and regulations as the Chief of Police, Sheriff, Director of 17 Emergency Services or Director of the Office of Citizen Com-plaints may provide for the 18 respective departments. The departments shall keep detailed records of all vehicles used pursuant to this paragraph; said records shall be open to inspection by the Office of the Mayor 19 20 and the Board of Supervisors; and provided further that the number of vehicles so exempted 21 shall not exceed:

5 (5) The employee is a forensic pathologist employed by the Office of the 6 Medical Examiner and has prior written permission of the Medical Examiner to use a City and 7 County vehicle and is on call before or after normal work hours in order to respond to and 8 investigate death scenes. The Medical Examiner shall keep detailed records of all vehicles 9 used pursuant to this subsection; said records shall be open to inspection by the Director of 10 Administrative Services and the Board of Supervisors; and provided further that the number of 11 vehicles so exempted shall not exceed two vehicles; or

12 (6) The employee is a resident of the City and County of San Francisco and 13 is driving the vehicle to and from the employee's place of residence solely for the purpose of 14 garaging the vehicle at his or her place of residence during nonwork hours, with the approval 15 by resolution of the Board of Supervisors, upon the recommendation of the Director of 16 Administrative Services, where the head of the department which has jurisdiction over such 17 vehicle finds that the public interest will be best served by permitting the employee to take the 18 vehicle home, rather than require the City to garage the vehicle.

(c) Penalty. Any employee violating the provisions of this Section shall pay to
the City and County an amount equal to three times the City and County's mileage
reimbursement rate times the number of miles driven in violation thereof.

(d) Except as otherwise provided by ordinance, an authorized volunteer,
while operating a motor vehicle owned by the City and County pursuant to authorization by
the head of the department to which said vehicle is assigned or which has jurisdiction over
said vehicle, shall be deemed to be an employee of the City and County solely for purposes of

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the State of California, and for no other purpose; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to permit the authorization to operate a motor vehicle owned, leased or rented by the City and County contrary to the provisions of the Vehicle Code of the State of California.
