I am Latina. I grew up low income-blue collar and am a first generation university graduate. I have hidden disabilities (learning disabilities, a speech impediment, and persistent depression disorder). I am also a renter in the Richmond District, which is surrounded by natural borders made up of parks and open space. I grew up living in rental housing until I was 15 years old, often without child-friendly open space. My parents both often worked overtime or second jobs. I was a "latch-key kid", and at as young as 8 years old, I was responsible for caring for my younger sister after school. This included taking her to the library and the closest public park, which was located about a mile from our home. I believe that it is necessary to have advocates for open space that understand equity from the perspective of lived experience serving on PROSAC and advocating for marginalized communities.

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I work for a commercial construction company in Central SoMA, where I specialize in building code and disabled access compliance. I have also served as the team captain for several of our community outreach activities, including the Best Buddies Friendship Walk and the LEAP Sandcastle Classic.

I have a Bachelors Degree in Urban Studies and American Studies from San Francisco State University. I am currently pursuing an Associates Degree in Spanish from City College of San Francisco

Civic Activities:

I currently hold Seat 13 on PROSAC where I am known for being outspoken about economic disparity, environmental justice, and accessible services for low income residents and communities of color. I have also held the District 1 seat on the SFPUC Citizens Advisory Committee where I served as chair from 2014-2018. I have been committed to ensuring that we look at water, power, and wastewater with an equity lens so that low income rate-payers and communities which have been most impacted by the SFPUC's operations and policies have a level of advocacy within the agency. I have lived in District 1 for 10 years and have been active in my community, including serving our neighborhood Democratic Club, where we work not only on political issues, but also policy issues such as transit, affordable housing, and land use. I have a positive relationship with Supervisor Fewer, as well as former Supervisors Mar and McGoldrick.

Board Qualifications:

The Park, Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee consists of a total of twenty-three (23) members. Twenty-two (22) members shall be appointed by the members of the Board of Supervisors and approved by the full Board, with one (1) member appointed by each Supervisor from his/her supervisorial district and one (1) member appointed by each Supervisor from the list maintained by the Recreation and Park Commission of individuals nominated by organizations having as a primary focus park, environmental, recreational, cultural, sports, youth or senior citizen issues (ratified by Resolution No. 391-13). Four (4) of the members chosen from the list maintained by the Commission shall be individuals nominated by an environmental organization. In addition, one (1) member shall be appointed by the Mayor.

If the system of district elections set forth in Charter, Section 13.110, is discontinued, each Supervisor shall appoint one (1) member of the Committee from the list maintained by the Commission and one (1) member without restriction.

The Committee members shall serve for two-year terms at the will of the appointing authority, except that at the first meeting of the Committee, the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department shall, by lot, designate twelve (12) members to serve terms of one (1) year. Thereafter, all members shall be appointed to two-year terms and no member shall serve more than four (4) consecutive terms.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Advisory Committee shall assist the Planning Commission and Recreation and Park Commission in the implementation of Charter, Section 16.107. They shall assist the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department and the Director of the Planning Department in establishing priorities for renovation, acquisition, development and maintenance of properties in accordance with the Recreation and Open Space Programs to implement the recreation and open space element of the Master Plan.

Reports: Input into the Strategic Plan updated annually, the Capital Plan updated annually, and the Operational Plan updated annually.
