3	Resolution accepting outstanding and unclaimed trust deposits from parking citations
4	as revenue to be transferred to the General Fund.

6	WHEREAS, Pursuant to Sections 50050, 50053 and 50055 of the Government Code
7	of the State of California, where trust deposits have remained outstanding and unclaimed for
8	at least one year, and the depositors' names are unknown, such deposits may be transferred
9	to the General Fund of the City and County of San Francisco without published notice; and
10	WHEREAS, the City has such trust deposits, which originated from payments for
11	parking citations made prior to 1994, when the State of California decriminalized parking
12	citations and transferred the responsibility for processing parking citations from the San
13	Francisco Municipal Court to the San Francisco Department of Parking and Traffic; and
14	WHEREAS, The trust deposits cannot be matched to a parking citation number or
15	payee because of the limited capability of the Municipal Court database system, so these
16	deposits cannot be declared in a public notice; and
17	WHEREAS, The balance of the trust deposit account is \$1,155,000 \$1,103,716; now,
18	therefore, be it
19	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors accepts the outstanding and unclaimed
20	trust deposits from parking citations as revenue to be transferred to the General Fund.
