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7	WHEREAS, Section 10.104.15 of the San Francisco Charter allows City Departments
8	to contract for services performed by employees subject to civil service examination when it
9	has been determined by the Office of the Controller that can be practically performed under
10	private contract at a lower cost to the City than similar work performed by City and County
11	employees; and
12	WHEREAS, In 2002, the Board of Supervisors approved a five-year agreement with
13	Serco Management Services, Inc. for a parking meter management system, including
14	collection and coin counting; and
15	WHEREAS, The Office of the Controller has certified that the requirements of Charter
16	section 10.104.15 have been satisfied for Fiscal Year 2003-2004 and has determined that
17	contracting for the services provided for under this contract is more economical than providing
18	the same services with City and County employees; and
19	WHEREAS, The Controller's certification is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
20	Supervisors in File No, which is hereby declared to be a part of this
21	resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,
22	WHEREAS, On August 10, 2004 the Board of Directors of the Municipal
23	Transportation Agency adopted Resolution 04-120; a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of
24	the Board of Supervisors in File No, which is hereby declared to be a part
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1	of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, recommending that the Board of Supervisors
2	concur with Controller's determination; now, therefore, be it
3	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors concurs with the Controller's certification
4	that parking meter management services, including collection and coin counting can be
5	practically performed by a private contractor at a lower cost than by City and County
6	employees for fiscal year 2004-2005.
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
