15	Section 1. Findings	s. The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
16	hereby finds and determin	es that:
17	(a) Pursuant to Pla	nning Code Section 302, this Board of Supervisors finds that this
18	ordinance will serve the po	ublic necessity, convenience and welfare for the reasons set forth in
19	Planning Commission Res	solution Norecommending approval of this Planning Code
20	Amendment, and incorpor	ates such reasons by this reference thereto. A copy of said
21	resolution is on file with th	e Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No
22	(b) Pursuant to Pla	nning Code Section 101.1, this Board of Supervisors finds that this
23	ordinance is consistent wi	th the Priority Policies of Section 101.1(b) of the Planning Code and
24	with the General Plan and	hereby adopts the findings of the Planning Commission, as set
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1	forth in Planning Commission Resolution No, and incorporates said findings by this
2	reference thereto.
3	Section 2. The San Francisco Planning Code is hereby amended by adding Section
4	249.29, to read as follows:
5	Section 249.29 Fillmore Street Alcohol Restricted Use District Established.
6	There are an unusually large number of establishments dispensing alcoholic beverages,
7	including beer and wine, for off-site consumption along Fillmore Street between Golden Gate and Post
8	Streets. The existence of this many alcoholic beverage establishments appears to contribute directly to
9	peace, health, safety and general welfare problems in the area, including loitering, littering, public
10	drunkenness, defacement and damaging of structures, pedestrian obstructions, as well as traffic
11	circulation, parking and noise problems on public streets and neighborhood lots. The existence of such
12	problems creates serious impacts on the health, safety and welfare of residents of nearby single- and
13	multiple-family areas, including fear for the safety of children, elderly residents and of visitors to the
14	area. The problems also contribute to the deterioration of the neighborhood and concomitant
15	devaluation of property and destruction of community values and quality of life. The number of
16	establishments selling alcoholic beverages and the associated problems discourage more desirable and
17	needed commercial uses in the area.
18	(a) In order to preserve the residential character and the neighborhood-serving commercial
19	uses of the area, the Fillmore Street Alcohol Restricted Use District (Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD) is
20	hereby established along Fillmore Street between Golden Gate and Post Streets, Assessor's Blocks 702
21	701, 707, 708, 726, 725, 730, 732, 750, 749, 755, and 756, as designated on Sectional Map number 2.
22	The Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD is designated on Sectional Map Number 2SU.
23	(1) No new off-sale liquor establishments shall be permitted in the Fillmore Street
24	Alcohol RUD.
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1	(2) The prohibition on off-sale liquor establishments shall not be interpreted to
2	prohibit the following:
3	(A) Temporary uses, as described in Planning Code Section 205.1 or 205.3; or
4	(B) Establishment of an off-sale liquor Establishment if an application for such
5	Liquor Establishment is on file with the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control prior to
6	the effective date of legislation establishing the Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD.
7	(3) Continuation of Existing Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishments. In the
8	Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD, any Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishment may continue in
9	accordance with Planning Code Section 180 through 186.2, subject to the following provisions:
10	(A) A Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishment lawfully existing and selling
11	alcoholic beverages as licensed by the State of California prior to the effective date of this legislation,
12	or subsequent legislation prohibiting that type of Off-Sale Liquor Establishment, so long as otherwise
13	lawful, may continue to operate only under the following conditions, as provided by California
14	Business and Professions Code Section 23790:
15	(1) Except as provided by Subsection (B) below, the premises shall retain the same
16	type of retail liquor license within a license classification; and
17	(2) Except as provided by Subsection (B) below, the licensed premises shall be
18	operated continuously, without substantial change in mode or character of operation.
19	(B) A break in continuous operation shall not be interpreted to include the following,
20	provided that the location of the establishment does not change, the square footage used for the sale of
21	alcoholic beverages does not increase, and the type of California Department of Alcoholic Beverage
22	Control liquor license ("ABC License") does not change except as indicated:
23	(1) A change in ownership of a Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishment or an
24	owner-to-owner transfer of an ABC License; or

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1	(2) Re-establishment, restoration or repair of an existing Off-Sale Prohibited Liquor
2	Establishment on the same lot after total or partial destruction or damage due to fire, riot, insurrection,
3	toxic accident or act of God; or
4	(3) Temporary closure of an existing Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishment for
5	not more than ninety (90) days for repair, renovation or remodeling;
6	(4) Re-location of an existing Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishment in the
7	Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD to another location within the same Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD with
8	conditional use authorization from the Planning Commission, provided that the original premises shall
9	not be occupied by a Prohibited Off-Sale Liquor Establishment, unless by another Prohibited Off-Sale
10	Liquor Establishment that is also relocating from within the Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD.
11	(b) The following shall apply to all off-sale liquor establishments in the Fillmore Street
12	Alcohol RUD in order to maintain the safety of the premises and vicinity:
13	(1) Off-sale liquor establishments shall provide outside lighting in a manner
14	sufficient to illuminate street and sidewalk areas and adjacent parking, as appropriate to maintain
15	security, without disturbing area residences;
16	(2) No more than 33 percent of the square footage of the windows and clear doors of
17	off-sale liquor establishments shall bear advertising or signage of any sort, and all advertising and
18	signage shall be placed and maintained in a manner that ensures that law enforcement personnel have
19	a clear and unobstructed view of the interior of the premises, including the area in which the cash
20	registers are maintained, from the exterior public sidewalk or entrance to the premises. This
21	requirement shall not apply to premises where there are no windows, or where existing windows are
22	located at a height that precludes a view of the interior of the premises to a person standing outside the
23	<u>premises.</u>
24	(c) Definitions:
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1	(1) A "liquor establishment" shall mean any enterprise selling alcoholic beverages,
2	as defined by California Business and Professions Code Section 23004 and 23025, pursuant to a
3	California Alcoholic Beverage Control Board license.
4	(2) An "off-sale liquor establishment" shall mean any liquor establishment which
5	has obtained Alcoholic Beverage Control Board License type 20 (off-sale beer and wine) or type 21
6	(off-sale general) selling alcoholic beverages in an open or a closed container for consumption off the
7	premises. Typical off-sale liquor establishments may include but are not limited to the following uses
8	licensed to sell off-sale alcoholic beverages: food markets, supermarkets, drugstores, liquor stores, and
9	convenience markets. It shall not include producers and distributor's licenses for offices or
10	establishments not open to the general public.
11	(3) A "prohibited off-sale liquor establishment" shall mean any establishment
12	selling alcoholic beverages lawfully existing prior to the effective date of the establishment of the
13	Fillmore Street Alcohol RUD and licensed by the State of California for the retail sale of alcoholic
14	beverages for off-site consumption, so long as otherwise lawful.
15	Section 3. Amendment of Sheet 2SU of the Zoning Map. In accordance with Planning
16	Code sections 106 and 302, the following change is hereby adopted as an amendment to
17	Zoning Map Sheet 2SU of the City and County of San Francisco, a copy of which is on file
18	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No:
19	Blocks 702, 701, 707, 708, 726, 725, 730, 732, 750, 749, 755, and 756 along Fillmore
20	Street between Golden Gate and Post Streets, and as indicated on a map of the Fillmore
21	Street Alcohol Restricted Use District, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
22	Supervisors in File No, shall be part of the Fillmore Street Alcohol
23	Restricted Use District.
24	Section 4. The Planning Department concluded environmental review of this ordinance
25	pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act Act (California Public Resources Code

1	sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on on file with the Clerk of the Board of
2	Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.
