1	[Implementation of Safety Improvements along the 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue Corridor]
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3	Resolution urging Caltrans to expedite the procurement of the construction contracts
4	to ensure the implementation is completed by 2005.
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6	WHEREAS, 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue is the busiest north-south thoroughfare in the western section
7	of San Francisco, connecting the Golden Gate Bridge to points south of San Francisco and
8	carrying an average of nearly 85,000 vehicles per day, including over 1,300 trucks per day;
9	and
10	WHERAS, 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue is a state route, and the City and County shares responsibility
11	for its maintenance and operation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans);
12	and
13	WHEREAS, Since the demolition of the portions of the Central Freeway north of Market
14	Street, 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue has seen a dramatic rise in traffic volumes, to the detriment of safety and
15	livability conditions for residents along the corridor; and
16	WHEREAS, 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue is also a key transfer point for people using transit, particularly
17	at intersections with east-west streets served by Muni METRO lines; and
18	WHEREAS, 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue serves as the key access to many important activity centers
19	like Golden Gate Park, San Francisco State University, the Stonestown Shopping Center,
20	Stern Grove, the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, The University of San Francisco, the
21	San Francisco Zoo and many others, generating a significant amount of pedestrian activity;
22	and
23	WHEREAS, Over the past few years there has been an alarming increase in the
24	number of incidents and accidents involving pedestrians and automobiles, resulting in a
25	number of pedestrian deaths and injuries, and damage to private property; and

1	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors finds that it is of the outmost
2	importance to expedite the implementation of safety improvements to 19th Avenue; and
3	WHEREAS, The City and County, working together with Caltrans and the San
4	Francisco County Transportation Authority (Authority), have determined that the most
5	expeditious way to implement improvements in the short term is to proceed with a first phase
6	consisting of the installation of replacement signals and pedestrian countdown signals at 12
7	key intersections along 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue and Park Presidio; and
8	WHEREAS, The intersections involved in the first phase are located at Park Presidio
9	and Geary Boulevard; and at along 19th Avenue at Holloway, Eucalyptus, Ocean, Vicente,
10	Taraval, Quintara, Noriega, Judah, Irving and Lincoln Way; and
11	WHEREAS, The cost of the improvement project has been set at \$4.25 million, to be
12	shared equally by the City and County and Caltrans; and
13	WHEREAS, Due to the dire state of the State Highway Account, the State is not able
14	to fund this project until 2008, and the Authority has agreed to advance the entire cost of the
15	first phase in order to expedite the project; and
16	WHEREAS, Caltrans has agreed to contribute its share of the project cost during the
17	second phase, which involves an additional 22 intersections along that corridor; and
18	WHEREAS, The second phase of the project will also include sidewalk bulb-outs and
19	new curb ramps; and
20	WHEREAS, The combined cost of the two phases is anticipated to be \$12 million; now
21	therefore be it
22	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports the expeditious implementation of
23	the traffic and pedestrian safety improvements along the 19 <sup>th</sup> Avenue corridor; and be it

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1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges Caltrans to expedite the
2	procurement of the construction contracts to ensure that implementation is completed within
3	2005.
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
