AMENDMENT OF THE WHOLE – 12/16/04 ORDINANCE NO.

1	[Regulating Computer Rental Businesses.]		
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3	Ordinance adding Article 10.2 to the San Francisco Police Code, regulating businesses		
4	that rent computer time to patrons by prohibiting minors from using game controllers		
5	or renting computer time for purposes of gaming during certain times, requiring		
6	supervision, prohibiting loitering, regulating waiting lists, posting hours of operation,		
7	and providing for a penalty.

11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13	Section 1. The San Francisco Police Code is hereby amended by adding a new Article		
14	10.2, consisting of Sections 750 to 752, to read as follows:		
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16	<u>ARTICLE 10.2</u>		
17	REGULATION OF COMPUTER RENTAL BUSINESSES

19	SEC. 750. Operating Conditions for Computer Rental Businesses. Any person operating a		
20	business for rental of computer time while the computer remains on the premises ("Computer Rental		
21	Business") shall ensure that the following mandatory conditions and standards are met:		
22	(a) No person under the age of 18 may be allowed to use joysticks, game pads, or other		
23	game controllers, or to rent time on a computer for purposes of playing computer games, during the		
24	<u>school year from the day after Labor Day to Memorial Day, Monday through Friday, except legal</u>		
25	holidays, between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., or between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00		

1	a.m. on all days preceding	g school days and between 11:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. a	on all other days unless

- 2 accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or authorized agent of the School District or school in which
- 3 *the minor is enrolled*, or the minor provides verifiable documentation from the School District or
- 4 school that he or she is not scheduled to be attending classes at that time.
- 5 (b) All Computer Rental Businesses shall have adult attendants or supervisors, age 18 or
- 6 over, at a ratio of not less than one attendant/supervisor for each 25 computers. The
- 7 <u>attendants/supervisors shall supervise the patrons on and about the premises to prevent conduct by</u>
- 8 *patrons that is injurious to the health, safety and general welfare of other patrons and the public.*
- 9 (c) No loitering shall be allowed to loiter around any Computer Rental Business. For
- 10 *purposes of this Section, a person loiters around a Computer Rental Business if he or she remains*
- 11 *within 20 feet of the entrance to such business for a period of over two minutes without lawful business.*
- 12 (d) Computer Rental Businesses may not maintain a waiting list beyond the seating capacity
- 13 *of its waiting area.*
- 14 (e) Hours of operation and rates shall be posted in a conspicuous place.
- 15 (f) Members of the Police Department shall have access to any Computer Rental Business
- 16 <u>regulated by this Section at any and all times the business is in operation, and shall inspect the</u>
- 17 *premises to ensure compliance with this Section.*

- 19 SEC. 751. Penalty. Any person who violates any provision of Section 750 shall be guilty of an
- 20 *infraction, the penalty for which shall be as follows:*
- 21 (a) <u>A fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$250;</u>
- 22 (b) A fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$750 for a second infraction occurring within
- 23 six months of a prior infraction; and
- 24 (c) A fine of not less than \$750 nor more than a \$1,000 for a third and each subsequent
- 25 *infraction occurring within six months of a prior infraction.*

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2	SEC. 752. Severability; Savings Clause. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph,
3	sentence, clause or phrase of this Article, or any part thereof, is for any reason held to be
4	unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not
5	affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Article. The Board of Supervisors
6	hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, clause and
7	phrase thereof irrespective of whether any one or more sections, subsections subdivisions, paragraphs,
8	sentences, clauses or phrases be held unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective.
