3	Resolution urging the San Francisco Congressional delegation to support H.R. 3847,
4	prohibiting racial profiling.

6	WHEREAS, The End Racial Profiling Act of 2004 prohibits any law enforcement agent
7	or agency from engaging in racial profiling; and,
8	WHEREAS, The End Racial Profiling Act of 2004 authorizes the United States or an
9	individual injured by racial profiling to bring a civil action for declaratory or injunctive relief in
10	State court or U.S. district court; and,
11	WHEREAS, The End Racial Profiling Act of 2004 makes proof that the routine or
12	spontaneous investigatory activities of law enforcement agents in a jurisdiction have had a
13	disparate impact on racial ethnic, or religious minorities prima facie evidence for a violation;
14	and,
15	WHEREAS, The End Racial Profiling Act of 2004 directs Federal law enforcement
16	agencies to cease practices that encourage racial profiling and maintain policies and
17	procedures to eliminate racial profiling, including the collection of data on routine investigatory
18	activities, procedures for responding meaningfully to complaints alleging racial profiling, and
19	procedures to discipline agents who engage in racial profiling; and,
20	WHEREAS, The End Racial Profiling Act of 2004 authorizes the Attorney General to
21	make grants to develop and implement best practice devices and systems to ensure the
22	racially neutral administration of justice; now, therefore, be it
23	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
24	urges the San Francisco Congressional delegation to support H.R. 3847, prohibiting racial
25	profiling.
