1	[Precautions Against the Flu]		
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3	Resolution urging all San Franciscans to implement prevention measures to reduce as		
4	much as possible their risk of contracting the flu.		
5			
6	WHEREAS, the 2004-2005 flu season will soon hit San Francisco with an expected		
7	peak in January – February 2005; and		
8	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) received 11,430		
9	doses of flu vaccine last week- far less than the approximately 70,000 doses required to		
10	vaccinate all members of the federal Centers for Disease Control (CDC)-defined high-risk		
11	populations in San Francisco; and		
12			
13	WHEREAS, While the Department of Public Health is hoping to receive additional doses of		
14	the vaccine during the flu season, these additional doses will likely still not cover San		
15	Francisco's CDC-defined high-risk populations; and		
16	WHEREAS, It has been proven that preventive measures are effective in combating		
17	the onset of the flu and that if these measures are embraced at both a personal and		
18	organizational level in San Francisco we will be successful in reducing the prevalence of		
19	during the 2004 and 2005 flu season; so therefore be it		
20			
21	RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges all San Franciscans to		
22	implement prevention measures to reduce as much as possible their risk of contracting the flu:		
23	 Avoid close contact with people who are sick 		
24	 When you are sick, keep your distance from others 		
24	Stay home when you are sick		
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1	•	Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing	
2	•	Clean your hands frequently	
	•	Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth to limit contamination transmission	
3	•	Employers should assure that hand-washing facilities are readily available; and be it

5	FURTHER RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors endorses		
6	distribution of the limited supply of DPH flu vaccine to the following high- risk categories:

8	1.	All children aged 6-23 months	
9	2.	Adults aged 65 and older	
10	3.	Persons aged 2-64 with underlying chronic medical conditions	
	4.	All women who will be pregnant during the influenza season	
11	5.	Residents of nursing and long term care facilities	
12	6.	Children aged between 6 months and 18 years of age on chronic aspirin therapy	
13	7.	Health care workers involved in direct patient care	
14	8.	Out-of-home caregivers and household contacts of children who are 6 months of age	
15		or younger; and be it	
16	FL	JRTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors concur with current medical opinion	
17	that intranasally administered, live, attenuated influenza vaccine (FluMist $^{ m B}$) is a strongly		
18	recommended alternative to injectable inactivated vaccine for immunization for seventh and		
19	eighth category of groups listed above; as well as health-care workers with direct patient care		
20	(except those who care for severely immunocompromised patients in special care units) and		
21	adults caring for children aged 6 months or younger.
